

9. Clinic services are subject to the same limitations listed elsewhere in this Attachment, e.g., limits on prescriptions and physician office visits.

Cancer and Rare Disease clinic: services provided to children with cancer and/or other rare diseases in an enrolled specialty clinic.

Clinics eligible for this enrollment must screen, evaluate, diagnose and treat pediatric patients with cancer, hemophilia, or another known rare disease. There are approximately 7,000 known rare diseases, and two thirds of those diagnosed with a rare disease are the pediatric population. Nevada DHCFP allows reimbursement of such services in a clinic setting when medically appropriate to the setting and medically necessary for the patient.

For a clinic to meet criteria and be enrolled into this specialty, 85% of its population must be children under the age of 21, diagnosed and/or treated with cancer, hemophilia, or another known rare disease.

10. Dental services are limited to emergency care only. Requirements for prior authorization for oral surgery are specified in the Medicaid Services Manual, Chapter 1000, Addendum A. For those individuals referred for diagnosis/treatment under the Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment Program dental services are not so limited, and the full range of dental care is provided without authorization. Orthodontics through EPSDT require prior authorization.
