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Authority and Overview

Pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 422.175 to 422.204, the Nevada Health Authority (NVHA), Division of Nevada Medicaid (DNM) must establish an advisory committee to provide recommendations to DNM and Medicaid Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) regarding the investment of profits by MCOs in the communities they serve. Specifically, this advisory committee must be established in any county where the population is 700,000 or more. Currently, only Clark County satisfies this requirement.

The state's current contract with MCOs includes a requirement that each MCO must reinvest at least 3% of its pretax profits in the communities being served by the MCO. Annually, MCOs are required to submit a written plan to the DNM detailing the anticipated community reinvestment activities.

The Medicaid Reinvestment Advisory Committee (MRAC) is required by NRS 422.195(2)(a) to meet at least twice a year and provide a report to the Legislative Counsel Bureau concerning:

1. The use of funds reinvested by MCOs in communities, including efforts to address homelessness, disparities, and social determinants of health; and
2. Activities of the MRAC during the year, including recommendations made by MRAC to MCOs about future reinvestments of funds. In 2024, the MRAC recommended reinvestment in the following areas:
 - a. Housing supports
 - i. Maintaining housing
 - ii. Transitional housing
 - b. Food supports
 - c. Projects related to health disparities and social determinants of health
 - i. Senior population
 - ii. Access to behavioral health

Pursuant to NRS 422.205(1)(c), recommendations by the MRAC must focus on the use of reinvestment funds for the purpose of:

1. Developing innovative partnerships with community and development organizations and providers of housing services; and
2. Supporting the initiatives of local governments in the county to address homelessness, housing issues, and social determinants of health.

MRAC membership includes eight voting members which meet the following requirements per NRS 422.185(2):

- The Administrator of the Division of Nevada Medicaid
- The Director of a social services agency of the county
- A representative of the government of a county
- Two members representing city governments in a county with populations of 100,000 or more
- Two members representing nonprofit organizations working with managed care recipients who reside in the county
- One member who represents the Division of Social Services (DSS)

The Director of the NVHA may add as many nonvoting members as appropriate.

KEY HIGHLIGHTS

The MRAC met twice in 2025. The first meeting was held on June 12, 2025. During this meeting, the members heard presentations from each MCO regarding their actual reinvestments for 2024 as well as proposed investments for 2025. CY2024 MCO REINVESTMENTS

The MCOs are contractually required to reinvest at least 3% of their gross profit into the communities they service. The MCOs reported 2024 reinvestments as a percentage of profits as follows:

Anthem	3.1%
Health Plan of Nevada	5.3%
Molina Health Care	3.0%
Silver Summit Health Plan	17.0%

REPORTED REINVESTMENTS

The plans reported the following reinvestments in 2024:

Housing Supports and Services

- Family Stabilization Programs
- Transitional supportive housing
- Shared housing programs
- Rental and reunification assistance
- Eviction prevention programs
- Wrap around services for youth to prevent adult homelessness
- Eddy House

Maternal and Infant Health

- Pediatric mental health programs
- Car seat education
- Programs to assist families to avoid child welfare system placement
- Funding of the Northern Nevada Public Health Fetal Infant Mortality Review program
- Programs to address maternal opioid crisis
- Childhood cancer programs
- Prenatal classes in rural Nevada

Social Determinants of Health

- Food banks such as Three Square
- Family Literacy Programs
- No-cost markets at select Clark County School District sites
- Back to school events
- Transportation support in rural Nevada
- Nutrition education for individuals dealing with chronic diseases such as diabetes and kidney disease
- Funded rural outreach for youth mental wellness through Hope Means Nevada
- Recovery assistance and residential treatment support

Other

- UNR Psychiatry Residency Program
- Direct employment training for individuals experiencing homelessness

- Funding to upgrade medical equipment at the Fallon Tribal Health Center
- Various family engagement events throughout the state
