

Nevada Medicaid Women's Health and Vaccinations Covered Services

Below is a list of women's health services centered around preventative screenings, family planning, gynecological exams, maternity care, abortion, hysterectomy, vaccinations, behavioral health, dental, and prescribed drugs. This list is not all-inclusive of all services available to women.

Service	Description
Preventive Services	<p>Nevada Medicaid covers all U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF), A and B screening recommendations such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gestational diabetes screen • Hepatitis B and C infection screen during pregnancy • Perinatal depression screen • Syphilis infection screen during pregnancy • Alcohol and drug screen • Tobacco screen • HIV screen • Intimate partner violence screen • Preeclampsia screen • Colorectal cancer screen • Breast cancer screen (mammogram) • BRCA genetic testing • Cervical cancer screen (pap smear) • Gynecological exams (includes breast exam, pelvic exam, pap smear)
Family Planning	<p>Family planning services and supplies are for the primary purpose to prevent and/or space pregnancies. This includes office visits and FDA approved birth control drugs and devices) (i.e. – birth control pills, condoms, patch, intrauterine device (IUD), etc.)</p> <p>Sterilization by tubal ligation (age 21 years or older) is covered.</p> <p>A pelvic exam or pap smear is not required for self-administered birth control.</p> <p>Family planning services are not covered for recipients, regardless of eligibility, whose age or physical condition precludes reproduction.</p>
Maternity Care	<p>Includes antepartum, labor and delivery, and postpartum care provided by a physician, physician assistant, APRN, and/or nurse midwife. Can be provided in the home, office, hospital, or freestanding birthing center setting.</p> <p>Includes provider visits, laboratory such as maternity panels and prenatal screening and diagnostic testing, imaging, stress tests, prescribed drugs, and other medically necessary services.</p>

Doula Services	A Doula is a non-medical trained professional who provides education, emotional and physical support during pregnancy, labor/delivery, and postpartum period. Doulas may provide services within the home, office, hospital, or freestanding birthing center settings.
Lactation Support and Breast Pumps	Lactation support is available through a provider's office. If a provider has a International Board Certified Lactation Consultant (IBCLC) on staff, services can be provided and billed under the provider. WIC also offers lactation support to Medicaid recipients. Breast pumps are available for those under 21 years of age if medically necessary through EPSDT coverage. WIC can also provide breast pumps to Medicaid recipients.
Abortion	Only available due to rape, incest, or to save the life of the mother. Includes physician services, prescribed drugs, and hospital or outpatient surgery center services.
Hysterectomy	Hysterectomies are only covered if medically necessary. According to federal regulations, a hysterectomy is not a family planning procedure. Hysterectomies performed solely for the purpose of rendering a female incapable of reproducing are not covered by Medicaid.
Behavioral Health	Behavioral health services to support postpartum health.
Vaccinations	Nevada Medicaid covers all Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommended vaccines.
Dental	In order to reduce the risk of premature birth due to periodontal disease, pregnant women will be allowed dental prophylaxes, fluoride varnish, and certain periodontal and restorative services during pregnancy.
Prescribed Drugs	Prescribed drugs that are medically necessary as described in the above services.
