The grants fall into 5 categories:


- Increase access to care
- Expand behavioral health
- Address Social Determinants of Health (SDOH)
- Bolster workforce and provider training
- Support Population Health initiatives

#### **Expand Behavioral Health**

Molina Healthcare of Nevada provided community reinvestment grants in Northern Nevada and Southern Nevada to organizations that offer comprehensive behavioral health and substance use disorder services (SUD). We considered those who can successfully execute wrap-around services within existing programs. We understand the correlation between behavioral health and physical health in overall wellness.





#### **Address SDOH-Housing Programs**

Molina understands the need for transitional housing and long-term housing and permanent supportive housing services for those with the most complex needs. Molina's 2022 community reinvestment grants support programs to serve these needs. Including:

- Share Village-to fund operations for transitional and permanent affordable housing. Share Village houses over 500 previously homeless veterans and families.
- HopeLink-to place a case manager onsite at Lake Mead West Apartments the new affordable housing complex that will open in April 2023.
- > Hope Springs-to support the region's only bridge housing program.
- Empowerment Center-to provide social services for participants in the chemical dependency treatment and recovery programs living at the Marvel Way campus.



### Address SDOH-Food & Hygiene

The Molina Mobile Help Center will distribute SDOH supplies in Clark and Washoe counties.







#### **Bolster Workforce and Provider Training**

Molina chose organizations to expand the workforce and providers to help drive interest in healthcare fields to increase the pool of qualified health care workers. We will support reputable training programs that provide tools and resources and allow for professional development and growth.

- Project Echo: to fund programs that meet the needs of primary care providers by offering an alternative to costly travel and long wait times for patients needing specialty care.
- RubiconMD: to expand eConsults as a state-wide solution to provider groups (peer-to-peer) with access to a national panel of top specialists across 140+ specialties & subspecialties.



#### **Support Population Health Initiatives**

- The Center: to help combat HIV in Nevada with a comprehensive PrEP (preexposure prophylaxis) program and provide HIV testing and treatment to patients unable to cover the cost of care.
- Doula Cooperative: to assist in building infrastructure, train additional doulas in the Washoe and Clark County areas, and subsidize the cost of doula services for patients, helping to ensure healthy pregnancies and babies.
- Northern Nevada Children's Cancer Foundation: to help families overcome the financial and emotional impact of a childhood cancer diagnosis by assisting with medical, household, educational and travel expenses.
