





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Baby's Bounty

Agency Description

Baby's Bounty serves families with infants and young children living in poverty in Southern Nevada. Their Mission is to support at-risk families living in poverty by providing critical infant-care education and the necessary supplies to provide a good start for every baby.

Program Description

This is an expansion of our Las Vegas Diaper Bank program to offer the program in Washoe County. This program will assist families who are struggling with diaper need. These additional Diaper Banks will be held twice per month with each assisting an average of 500 families. Each preregistered child will receive a one-week supply of diapering items consisting of 50 diapers, 200 wipes, one tube of diaper rash cream, and a reusable distribution bag.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Southern Nevada delivers safe places, guidance, support, and opportunities kids need to navigate and succeed in these uncertain times. Our mission is to enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens.

Program Description

BGCSNV aims to serve at least 120 youth aged 13 - 18 at six Clubhouses with our Workforce Development Programming. Our goal is to provide these youth with opportunities and skills for first job readiness and a plan for pursuing postsecondary education and/or career aspirations.

Agency Description

Catholic Charities of Northern Nevada serves the most vulnerable members of northern Nevada. We respond to unmet human needs so all can thrive. We do this by helping people of all cultures and beliefs rise out of poverty and overcome the barriers to ser-sufficiency through a broad range of homelessness prevention services.

Program Description

Client choice market will open on Moana and Kietzke in Reno. With the expansion, we will be able to offer clients a grocery store shopping experience and resources centers.

Case Workers to provide resources and additional services

Comagine Health works collaboratively with community-based organizations, patients, providers, payers, and other partners to reimagine, redesign, and implement sustainable improvements in the health care system.

Program Description

The Pathways Community HUB Model is an evidence-based model for facilitating community-based care coordination services by Community Health Workers (CHWs). The PCH model helps communities work together to support their vulnerable populations by using local community health workers (CHWs) to work closely with families to connect to social and medical services to remove barriers to health.

Our goal is to implement a pilot using the HUB model to serve SilverSummit members and the uninsured in Southern Nevada. In collaboration with our Core Team, we have identified pregnant moms at risk of poor birth outcomes as the population of focus for this implementation pilot.

Agency Description

Community Health Alliance (CHA) is dedicated to creating healthy outcomes for patients of every income. CHA operates seven convenient locations throughout Reno and Sparks, providing comprehensive, top-quality medical services, dental and pediatric care, behavioral health, low-cost pharmacies, nourishing food pantries, and more.

Program Description

The target audiences are CHA patients who are eligible for childhood immunizations, the HPV vaccine, the influenza vaccine, and COVID-19 vaccine, as well as patients who are food insecure. CHA will actively reach out to patients who are in need of these services.

Communities In Schools of Nevada (CIS of Nevada) provides Integrated Student Supports (ISS) to students. ISS is an evidence-based, success proven methodology for providing students with the services and resources they need to remove academic and nonacademic barriers to their success. Our wraparound services may include social-emotional learning opportunities, hunger prevention, physical and mental health services, before and after-school tutoring, and college and career readiness programs.

Program Description

The funds from this grant will be used to support Integrated Student Support (ISS) programming at K-12 CIS schools in Clark County and Washoe County. In Clark County, CIS of Nevada anticipates serving 8,000 students at five schools and about 1,000 students and one school in Washoe County.

Agency Description

The Count the Kicks campaign was created by the 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization Healthy Birth Day, Inc. and is based on public health research in Norway that demonstrated a 30 percent reduction in stillbirth by teaching pregnant women how to monitor fetal movement during the third trimester of pregnancy by doing kick counts on a daily basis. In the first 10 years of the Count the Kicks campaign in Iowa, the state has seen a nearly 32 percent reduction in the stillbirth rate while the rest of the country has remained relatively stagnant.

Program Description

Count the Kicks teaches the method for, and importance of, tracking fetal movement daily during the third trimester of pregnancy. Our positive and empowering public health campaign encourages expectant parents to get to know what's normal for their baby and to speak up if they notice a change in their baby's normal movement, or how long it takes their baby to get to 10 kicks each day.

Cure 4 The Kids is Southern Nevada's only 501(c)(3) outpatient pediatric treatment center for rare and catastrophic diseases. Our mission is to advance cures and prevention of childhood diseases through clinical excellence, research, and innovation.

Program Description

The purpose of this program is to meet the needs of pediatric rheumatology patients in Nevada by providing a full-service, inpatient and outpatient, comprehensive pediatric rheumatology program. The program will take a holistic, multidisciplinary, and collaborative approach to provide our patients with the most up-to-date treatment based on clinical research. Funding will be used to recruit and hire a pediatric rheumatologist to practice in Nevada.

Agency Description

The Donna Street Community Center (DSCC) serves high-risk Black and Latinx youth ages 8-20, in and around the greater Las Vegas metropolitan and surrounding areas, with emphasis on West Las Vegas.

The mission of DSCC is to strengthen lives and communities by providing a social emotional, social science, humanities and performing arts-based learning program, within a safe environment, for high-risk youth, unlocking the creative potential and dreams to shift the trajectory of their lives in a highly impactful way.

Program Description

The Hip Hop Entrepreneurship Program (HHEP) Academy positively impacts youth development and drastically reduces and oftentimes prevents juvenile delinquency and/or recidivism in Las Vegas through the use, of hip hop music. The HHEP Academy is a community performing arts program focused on social, emotional, educational and self-sufficiency/vocational needs for at risk Black and Latinx youth.

Freedom House Sober Living facility is used by addicts recovering from substance abuse, which serves as an interim environment between rehab and a return to their former lives. Our vision grew out of a need to have clean and supportive place for people to live while they were in recovery. We primarily cater people who have just come out of rehab and need a place to live that is structured and supporting for those in recovery.

Program Description

Freedom House Sober Living and Freedom Behavioral Health were designed specifically to provide help and give assistance to the ever-growing population of substance abuse in the Las Vegas community. The objective is to provide services to the most vulnerable individual. By working closely with the judicial system and NDOC in Clark County, we provide the most desperate individuals the opportunity to get the help they need.

Agency Description

Hope Christian Health Center (HCHC) is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) and continues to surpass yearly targets set by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA). Today, HCHC operates two service delivery sites in Clark County.

Program Description

The program that HCHC will implement will provide additional support for patients to achieve healthcare goals and receive preventative screenings. Currently roughly half of our patients (2,555) live with hypertension and/or diabetes among other chronic diseases. By starting a chronic disease management program, we are confident that this data will improve.

Hope Means Nevada is a Nevada based non-profit agency dedicated to the prevention of suicide that offers compassion and support for teens struggling with suicidal ideation. They provide resources that are relevant to Nevada teens to help enable their mental health journey towards healing.

Program Description

In partnership with the Nevada Office of Suicide Prevention, Clark and Washoe Health Districts, Hope Means Nevada will execute on a multichannel public health campaign aimed to reduce/prevent teen suicide in Nevada and normalize the discussion of mental health.

Hope Means Nevada has contracted with a local marketing agency experienced in developing and delivering public health campaigns to low-income populations.

Agency Description

Immunize Nevada is a statewide nonprofit with offices located in Elko, Reno, and Las Vegas. Since 1995, Immunize Nevada has served as the states trusted community partner and expert on the topics of immunizations and other public health resources for Nevada's communities and healthcare professionals.

Program Description

Immunize Nevada will create year-long set of DEIA+ trainings for three recipient categories which include medical providers, community members accessing the healthcare system including SilverSummit members, and community partners made up of Immunize Nevada's staff and coalition members.

- Work towards identifying and changing outdated practices and protocols
- Curriculum will be offered in multiple languages
- Curriculum syllabus will be created for each training tailored to each of the three identified categories

Karma Box is contracted with Washoe County to operate the Safe Camp, an area where our homeless members can place a tent and have access to facilities, case management, peer supports, transportation, workforce development - and a safe, dry place to store their belongings, rest and sleep.

Program Description

Karma Box will help/support SSHP Members with SUD to build healthy fitness and nutrition habits to assist in sustaining their path toward recovery. This peer led approach provides access to evidenced-based physical and nutrition education, along with opportunities to build relationship with their peers.

Curriculum will focus on:

- I. Recreation: nature hikes, kayaking, bowling, and/or dinner and a movie.
- 2. Wellness: participants will learn about nutrition, mindfulness practices and holistic approaches to treat substance use disorders.
- 3. Exercise: Participants will receive an individualized exercise plan that is tailored to the person's interests, strengths, and goals.

Agency Description

Life Changes, Inc. (LCI), incorporated in 2010 as a not-for-profit sober living home, has a mission of "Providing safety, shelter and support to individuals affected by substance abuse, incarceration, mental illness, homelessness, sex trafficking and domestic violence." Since inception, LCI has served the community through successful sober living facilities, prisoner reentry, non-medical respite care and supportive services.

Program Description

The Life Changes Healing Home will be developed as a Transitional Housing NonMedical Respite model. The target audience is homeless medically unstable SilverSummit members. This model will allow for a longer stay and provide an opportunity for the care team to develop a long-term transition plan and access additional wrap around services.

Members will receive Home Health care including DME, Oxygen, PT/OT, wound care, BH and SUD treatment on-site at the home. Case Management services will be provided, and a long-term housing plan will be developed immediately upon intake in the home.

Founded in 1977, Nevada Health Centers (NVHC) is a federally qualified health center whose mission is to provide access to quality healthcare services throughout Nevada. In keeping with this mission, NVHC is the largest provider of primary care services to low-income, uninsured and underinsured populations throughout the state of Nevada.

Program Description

NVHC plans to increase access to care by expanding services to Washoe County and providing DEI training to its staff. Patients will have access to services including

- Primary Care
- Community Health Workers
- Case Managers
- Discharge clinic staff
- Wellness program

Agency Description

Nevada Primary Care Association (NVPCA) is dedicated to assisting health centers with the implementation of solid business practices and community-responsive programs to improve service delivery effectiveness and efficiency.

Program Description

NVPCA will purchase the Azara population health management tool for up to two Nevada CHCs and hire a full-time staff at NVPCA to provide technical assistance and quality improvement support.

As a 502(c)(3) tax exempt organization, Nevada Women's Fund identifies critical social needs and address them through educational scholarships, internships, mentoring opportunities, and community grant making. Over the past 39 years, NWF's distributions have been over \$9 million to women from and attending school in Northern Nevada, and to local organizations supporting them.

Program Description

Nevada Women's Fund target audience is women in Northern Nevada enrolled in post-secondary education. Women must also be enrolled as members of SilverSummit Healthplan. NWF has developed an Allocations Committee that reviews each eligible scholarship application and scores them on Financial need, academic background and personal history. After scoring is complete, scholarships are then assigned to the highest scoring applicants. Funds may be used:

Agency Description

Food Bank of Northern Nevada provides food for families in need across northern Nevada and the eastern slope of the Sierra in California. We serve more than 130,000 people every month, almost half of whom are children and seniors.

Program Description

Prescription Pantry - People who are food insecure are disproportionally affected by diet-sensitive chronic diseases such as diabetes and high blood pressure

Northern Nevada HOPES (HOPES) is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) that provides integrated medical care and support services to individuals with and without health insurance. Founded in 1997 as the regions only HIV service provider, HOPES has provided medical care and wrap-around services to HIV positive individuals for more than 25 years. In 2012, as a response to the increasing need for integrative healthcare among our community's most disenfranchised individuals, HOPES chose to expand into a community health center.

Program Description

Northern Nevada HOPES is breaking ground on a new, 43,000+ sq. ft. clinic later this year, offering adult primary care, chronic disease prevention, case management and the expansion of the Mental and Behavioral Health program to include group therapy, psychiatry, Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP) and eventually, Partial Hospitalization Program (PHP).

Agency Description

Pinnacle Medical Group is an independently-owned primary care clinic in Northern Nevada focused on patients' access to care, disease management, care coordination, and service excellence in the Reno-Sparks area. Pinnacle Medical Group, PMG, has twenty-one innovative primary care providers including physicians, advanced practice registered nurses and physician assistants that serve the community in four different locations in the Truckee Meadows.

Program Description

The Community Health Worker Program at Pinnacle Medical Group aims to serve patients that are struggling with engagement in primary care services in Reno and Sparks. This includes office visits with a primary care provider, vaccine/immunization compliance, and quality of care measures (HEDIS). The CHW will accomplish improved primary care engagement through patient outreach and assistance with healthcare navigation. Pinnacle has a large Spanish-speaking patient population and would like to invest in hiring bilingual CHWs that can assist patients with understanding diagnoses and treatment plans and reduce cultural barriers to care.

Project Extension for Community Health Outcomes (ECHO) is an international telehealth platform that connects groups of providers via video-teleconferencing software (Zoom©). Project ECHO connects geographically remote locations and structures communication to create a "community of learning".

Program Description

Project ECHO is a telehealth platform that moves knowledge, not patients, and utilizes 'hub' and 'spoke' knowledge sharing to create a learning loop. Each ECHO Program is based on these four pillars: Amplification, Share Best Practices, Case-Based Learning, and WebBased Database to Monitor Outcomes.

Project ECHO will develop 2 new ECHO programs with this funding.
