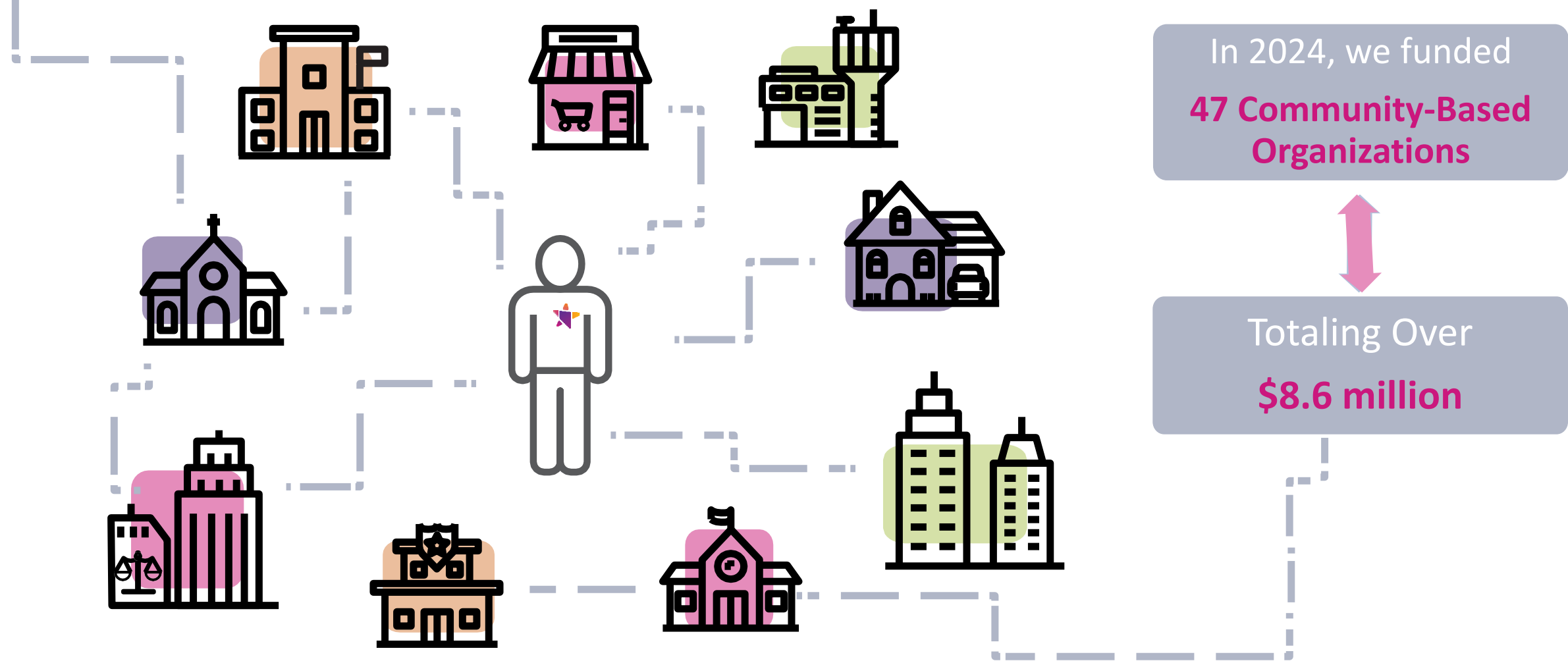

Centene & SilverSummit Healthplan: Investment \$1.1 Million

The Desert Pines Master Development project is poised to revitalize Las Vegas by transforming a 95.5-acre golf course into a mixed-income and mixed-use community. This redevelopment project aims to provide housing, education, and commercial opportunities, enhancing the area just 3 miles east of downtown Las Vegas.

- Development Team: Led by McCormack Baron Salazar, Inc. and Urban Strategies, Inc.
- Location: 3 miles from downtown Las Vegas, near major roads and freeway for easy access.
- Affordable Units: 1,082 multi-family units, heavily subsidized to support low-income individuals and families.
- Residential Units: 280 for sale residential homes
- Community Hub: Includes a community center, commercial space, and educational facilities.
- Sustainability Commitment: Designed to exceed energy efficiency standards by 20%.



This project promises to be a cornerstone of sustainable urban living, driven by innovation and community-focused planning.

Agency Description

Access to Healthcare Network (AHN) improves the health and wellbeing of individuals in the community by providing and expanding access to services that address the clinical and social determinants of health. In addition to providing direct service to over 200,000 uninsured, underinsured, low-income, and otherwise vulnerable Nevada residents since its inception in 2006, AHN also acts as an intermediary organization, through its model of community “Shared Responsibility”, to support, strengthen, and integrate the health care and social service delivery system and stakeholders.

Program Description

Funding to support accessible transportation in rural Nevada, as detailed in the upcoming Medicaid RFP response. It will integrate transportation into the next agreement, highlighting past experience and commitment to addressing rural challenges. Identified as the main obstacle in every county, the initiative focuses on SilverSummit Members, Nevada Medicaid Fee for Service Members, low-income communities, and other vulnerable groups. Running from August 2024 to June 2025, the program includes door-to-door, door-through-door, wheelchair-accessible services, DME assist, oxygen services, and comprehensive wraparound service integration.

Serving a diverse community, including Medicaid-insured families, it reduces barriers to care with accessible locations and specialized support.

During two of these sessions, children will participate in eighteen school-based lessons designed to blend learning with fun. To maintain their enthusiasm, the third weekly session will focus on life skills and group activities through exciting games. Kids will have the opportunity to enjoy a variety of entertaining and educational experiences.

It's a compassionate and affordable system of care.

Program Description

The Neil Road Health Center provides essential healthcare services to uninsured, underinsured, and low-income individuals in the Reno area. With a focus on culturally responsive care, the center offers primary care, maternal and child health, pediatric and women's health, dental care, WIC services, and more. The Funding will go towards a planned expansion, that will add an additional 4,000 sq. ft., including new exam rooms, behavioral health spaces, a pharmacy, a Prescription Food Pantry, and expanded waiting areas. This project will allow the center to serve 4,000 additional patients annually, reducing wait times and enhancing access to integrated healthcare services in Washoe and Rural Washoe Counties.

This program addresses the needs of medically complex children in Southern Nevada by adding a pediatric subspecialist to a team of 14 experts, including physicians, nurse practitioners, and physician assistants. The new specialist will enhance care for chronic and complex conditions like hemophilia and juvenile rheumatoid arthritis through diagnosis, treatment, and collaboration with the current team.

Eddy House is the only nonprofit agency in Northern Nevada that serves *any* homeless and at-risk youth aged 18-24, regardless of gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation, or race, with wrap-around, trauma-informed services. Eddy House provides safe and free shelter for youth who lack or have limited family or social support networks as they transition to sustained, independent living. Founded in 2011 by Lynette Eddy, Eddy House established the mission “to create a safe environment for homeless and at-risk youth to develop the life and job skills necessary for sustainable independence.”

Program Description

Eddy House serves homeless and at-risk youth and those with chronic health conditions or low income. Program: Drop-in center, emergency shelter, residential living. Workforce development & aftercare services Crisis intervention & stabilization programs Distribute essential items, resource info, and support through shelters, encampments, motels, and community events. Trauma-informed staff trained to assist youth at risk of abuse, exploitation, or trafficking. Accessible medical services in partnership with UNR medical students.

Rurally located sixty-five miles east of Reno, Nevada, in the high desert of the Lahontan Valley, the Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe operates the Fallon Tribal Health Center (FTHC). The FTHC provides health care to twenty Native communities in northern Nevada and currently has over 2,000 patients who receive care.

Program Description

The Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe is upgrading medical equipment at the Fallon Tribal Health Center to enhance dental and clinical services. The current outdated equipment has hindered effective service delivery. This investment will benefit healthcare providers and improve patient experiences for 2,218 individuals. The initiative aims to improve patient and provider retention, fostering better health outcomes through consistent care. Overall, this upgrade is set to significantly improve healthcare quality for the community.

Through vital partnerships with esteemed institutions like Western Nevada College and TMCC and local industry, this innovative transitional program combines education, practical skills, and a stable living environment. This initiative, which also includes family skills development, work readiness, and financial literacy services, promises to overhaul participants' lives as they journey from education to high-paying careers.

Agency Description

The Jewish Family Service Agency, a non-profit, non-sectarian community social service organization committed to nurturing and stabilizing our community through innovative and compelling prevention and intervention programs. Since its establishment in 1977, the agency has been a beacon of hope for our community members, particularly those within the low-income population, helping to decrease eviction rates due to non-payment of rent or mortgage. Together, we celebrate this achievement and continue our journey towards building a more resilient, inclusive, and thriving community.

Program Description

The JFSA Emergency Housing Assistance Program helps individuals facing eviction or foreclosure by providing up to two months of financial support, capped at \$3,000. Eligible recipients must demonstrate a plan to maintain housing stability after assistance and work with staff to develop a stability plan if receiving more than one month of aid. Payments are made directly to landlords or banks, and staff provide follow-up support for up to 12 months to ensure housing stability. The program serves 12-25 households annually, depending on each family's needs.

JAG Nevada empowers students facing barriers to success by offering a multi-year employability skills program taught by dedicated Specialists. With a proven 43-year model, it combines trauma-informed care, project-based learning, and employer engagement to prepare students for future careers. The program includes leadership opportunities, a 12-24 months follow-up for post-graduation support, and workforce connections with partners like Tesla and Amazon. Wraparound services ensure students have the resources they need to thrive.

Moreover, families in need of resources not fulfilled by local services will receive attention. As part of the initiative, the Coalition aims to establish a resource center at their current office. This will include private and open workstations complete with computers for clients to use for virtual health appointments, submit applications for healthcare services, and participate in virtual support meetings. The initiative straddles across the rural area encompassing three towns: Caliente, Panaca, and Pioche and little town Alamo. All services will be non-judgmental, unbiased, and gender-neutral, with materials available in both English and Spanish.

In a display of commitment to the community, this initiative employs these individuals, incorporating them back into the societal fabric as contributing members. Every employee at the LFG experiences a flexible work schedule that accommodates their medical, mental health, and legal needs. Program Description

The Desert Pines Master Development is the redevelopment of a golf course site in the City of Las Vegas. The 95.5-acre site will be developed with a mixed-income mixed-use program that will include multifamily rental, home ownership, commercial, education and open space components.
