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

Community Network

Community Solutions Department builds, manages and sustains what we call the **Community Network**.

SilverSummit 
has a **Community Network of 2,000 organizations** serving Nevadans



Community based organizations, detention centers/jails, civic groups, city/county based education resources and services.

The community network consists of **organizations that provide services to our Members** outside of the providers' offices.

Investment in Action

In 2021, SilverSummit **Invested \$2.3M** into the Community

The majority of SilverSummit children/teens with an obesity or diabetes diagnosis are Hispanic and Black.

They are disproportionately impacted at a young age by these life-style based diseases.

The Just One Project's Sweet Spot aims to address the underlining causes of these health disparities through their mobile childhood nutrition education program.






Community Investment Approach Overview




Community Investment Selection Committee

Committee will determine successful applicants and award amount

Application Scoring Criteria

Scoring of applications will be completed by following established criteria. Successful applicants will demonstrate adherence to SSHP standards.

Example Scoring Criteria includes:



Cultural Competency:

- Program approach meets culturally competent standards
- Program materials and services provided in the language of the individuals who will be served
- Applicant provides DEI/Cultural Competency Training to its staff



Evidenced Based:

- Program is evidenced-based and maintains fidelity to that standard



Outcomes Orientated:


- Applicant clearly demonstrates ability to collect metrics and measure outcomes
- Applicant demonstrated previous outcomes achieved



Address Health Disparities:

- Program has a proven approach to reduce or eliminate specific health disparities within SSHP Membership

Investment Outcomes and Reporting




Community Investment Recipients must submit a final report at the end of the investment period.


