Introduction:

Casey Angres, Chief of Division Compliance, DHCFP, opened the Public Hearing introducing herself, Dr. Malinda Southard, Deputy Administrator, DHCFP, and Gabriel Lither, Senior Deputy Attorney General.

Casey Angres – The notice for this public hearing was published on January 10, 2024, in accordance with Nevada Statute 422,2369.

2. Discussion of Amendments to the State Plan for Medicaid Services and Solicitation of Public Comments

Subject: Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP): 12-Month Postpartum Continuous Eligibility for Pregnant Women

Michelle Soule, Nevada Check Up Program Specialist, DWSS, advised Pursuant to Nevada Senate Bill (SB) 232 from the 82nd (2023) Nevada Legislature Session, postpartum eligibility for individuals who gave birth while on Medicaid or Nevada Check Up (NCU) will be expanded from two months to 12 months.

Nevada will provide continuous eligibility to pregnant individuals who were eligible for Medicaid or NCU while pregnant through the last day of the 12-month period beginning the month after the birth with the following exceptions: The individual requests voluntary termination of eligibility; the individual ceases to be a resident of the state; the agency determines eligibility was determined incorrectly because of fraud attributed to the individual; or the individual dies.

There is an estimated increase in annual aggregate expenditures for State Fiscal Years (SFY) 2024 and 2025.

SFY 24 \$5,332,398 SFY 25 \$10,419,149

3. Discussion of Amendments to the State Plan for Medicaid Services and Solicitation of Public Comments

Subject: CHIP: 12-Month Continuous Eligibility for Children

Michelle Soule, Nevada Check Up Program Specialist, DWSS, presented Pursuant to Section 5112 of the Consolidated Appropriation Act, 2023, Continuous Eligibility for Children Under Medicaid and CHIP (Nevada Check Up) under the Medicaid program – Section 1902(e) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396a(e)) is amended to read "One year of continuous eligibility for children. The State Plan shall provide that an individual who is under the age of 19 and who is determined to be eligible for benefits under a State Plan approved under this title and subsection (a)(10)(A) shall remain eligible for such benefits until the earlier of: The child reaches the age 19; or ceases to be a resident of the state of Nevada; or the child or child's representative requests a voluntary termination of eligibility; or the agency determines that eligibility was erroneously granted at the most recent determination, redetermination, or renewal of eligibility because of agency error or fraud, abuse, or perjury attributed to the child or the child's representative; or the child is deceased.

There is an estimated increase in annual aggregate expenditures for SFY 2024 and 2025.

SFY 24 \$4,098,397 SFY 25 \$8,055,001
