What is an APCD?

In accordance with NRS 439B.800 through 439B.875 an All Payers Claim Database (APCD) is a large database that includes medical claims, pharmacy claims, dental claims, and eligibility and provider files collected from private and public payers. Insurers report data directly to the APCD.

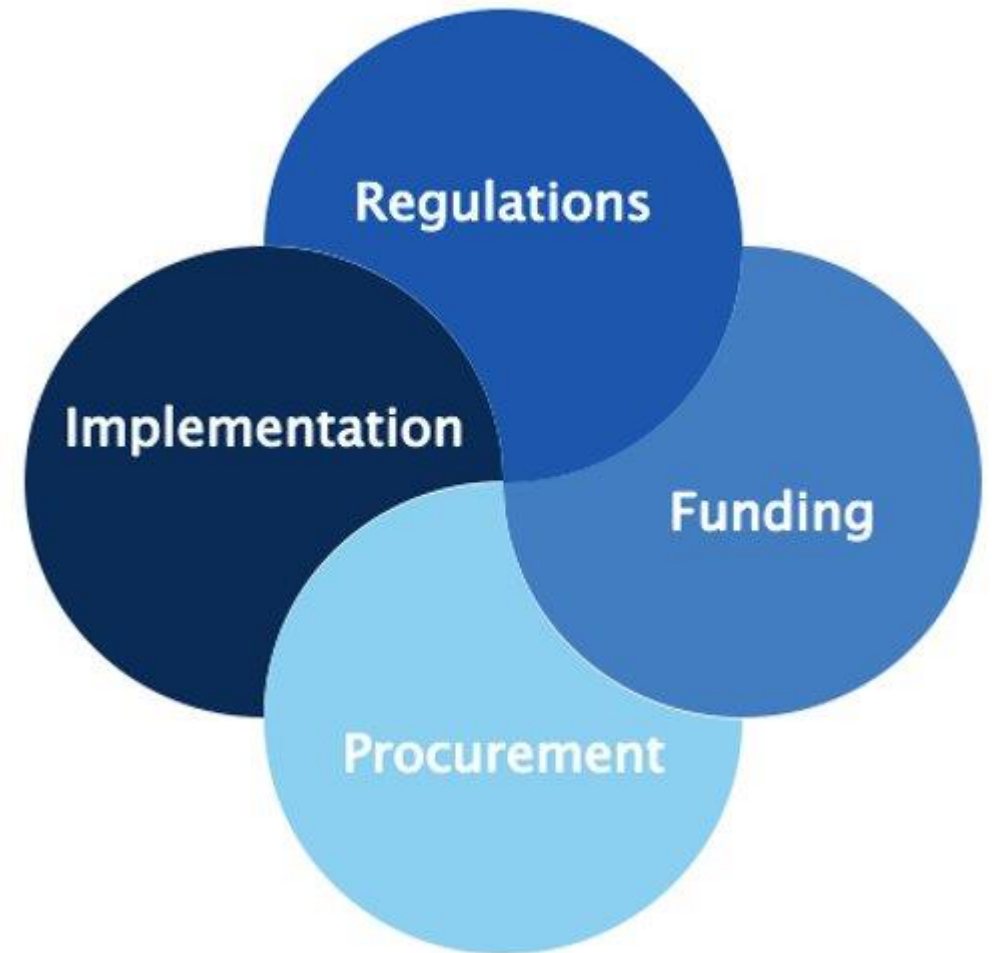
NRS 439B.800 established an APCD for the first time in Nevada to:

- Form an advisory committee to make recommendations to the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) regarding the collection, analysis, and reporting of data in the APCD
- Support healthcare and payment reform initiatives
- Collect critical information needed to make health policy decisions
- Transparency in provider performance, cost, and data quality



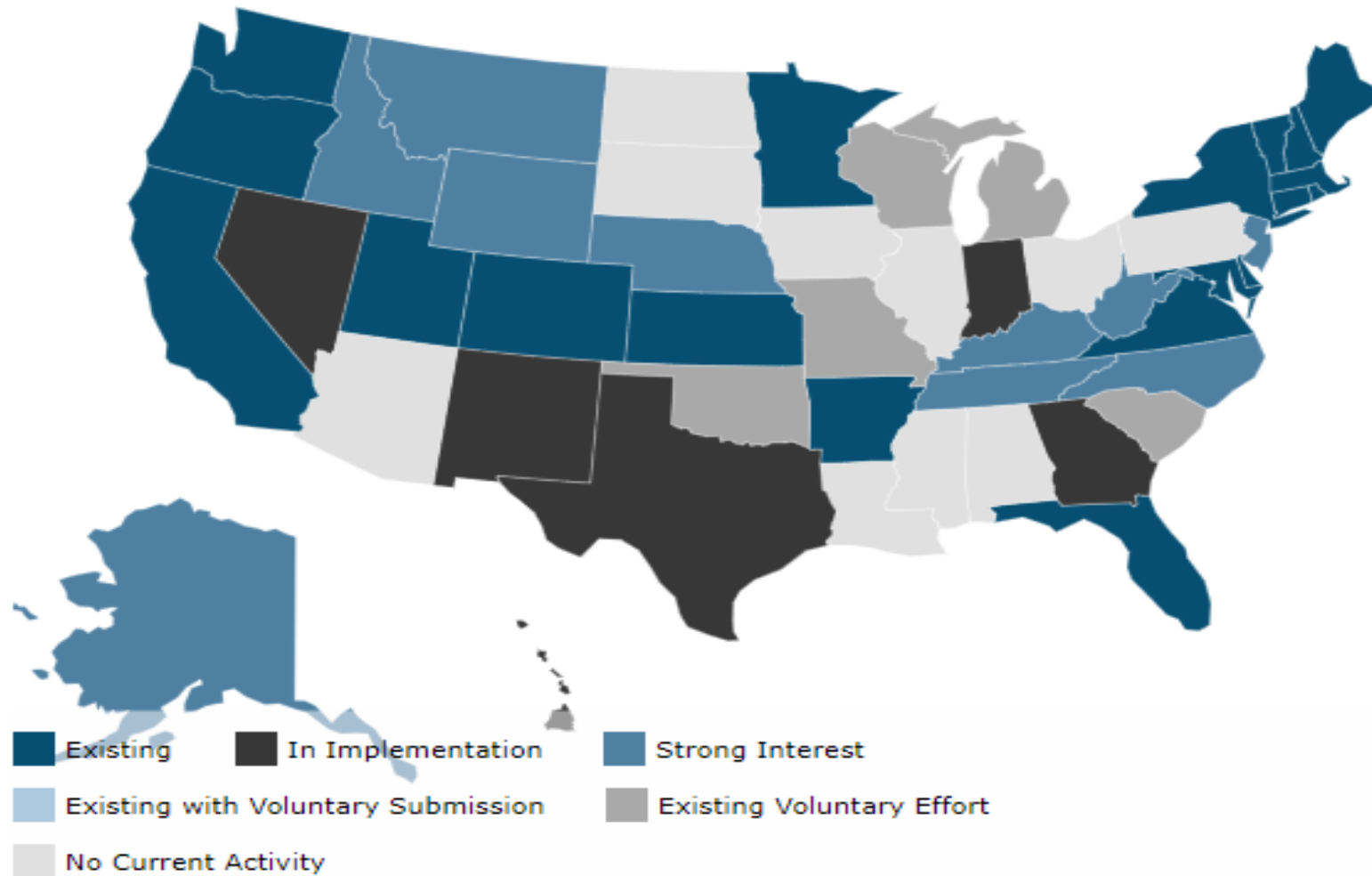

APCD Draft Regulations – Section 1

Section 1 of the regulation defines the words and terms in NRS 439B.800 through 439B.875, inclusive, and have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.



APCD Draft Regulations – Section 2

Section 2 describes what the APCD Advisory Committee will provide to the Department. It also describes the creation and function of the Advisory Committee and their role and recommendations to the Department.



APCD Draft Regulations – Section 3

Section 3 provides information on the Advisory Committee's composition, terms, and the compensation to each member. Members shall be appointed by the Director of DHHS to serve a term of 2 years.



APCD Draft Regulations – Section 4

Section 4 discusses how the Advisory Committee Chair will be appointed and the Advisory Committee meetings. The DHHS Director will appoint the Chair for a term of one year, and the Advisory Committee will meet at least three times per calendar year, or at the call of the Director or Chair.



APCD Draft Regulations – Section 5

Section 5 outlines the Advisory Committee's duties and powers for the APCD data. The Committee shall submit an annual report to the Department, make recommendations to the Department, and assist the Department in establishing and maintaining the APCD.



APCD Draft Regulations – Section 6

Section 6 outlines the requirements for the data submission as set by the Department’s Data Submission Guide. Data Submitters shall submit the required health data in accordance with the Data Submission Guide.



APCD Draft Regulations – Section 7

Section 7 describes the “Historical Data” that will be required and will align with the Data Submission Guide. The Department shall collect historical data up to a maximum of ten years of data and a minimum of five years. The Department will provide written notification to data submitters when it is ready to accept historical data submissions.



APCD Draft Regulations – Section 8

Section 8 explains the Department's authority over the data files and the Data Submission Guide.



APCD Draft Regulations – Section 9

Section 9 requires the data submitter to de-identify their data, as set forth by Section 1, and requirements on the timeline as set by the Data Submission Guide.



APCD Draft Regulations – Section 10

Section 10 defines the penalties the Department may assess in accordance with the statute and outlines the data submitters' right to due process, which includes notice and the right to request a hearing.



APCD Draft Regulations – Section 11

Section 11 outlines the waiver request process, reporting requirements, and deadlines of the waiver requests.
