State Fiscal Year 2023 Network Adequacy Validation

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1. Overview and Methodology

Overview

The Nevada Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Care Financing and Policy (DHCFP) is responsible for the ongoing monitoring and oversight of its contracted Medicaid managed care organizations (MCOs) and the dental benefits administrator (DBA)/prepaid ambulatory health plan (PAHP) (collectively referred to as "plans" in this report) that deliver services to members residing in urban Clark and Washoe counties under the Nevada Medicaid managed care program. As part of its responsibility to monitor and oversee these plans, DHCFP requested its external quality review organization (EQRO), Health Services Advisory Group, Inc. (HSAG), to validate the adequacy of the provider networks used by the plans to provide required physical health, behavioral health, pharmacy, and dental services for Medicaid members in compliance with the State's access requirements. Validation of network adequacy is a mandatory EQR activity pursuant to Title 42 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) §438.358(b)(1)(iv).¹⁻¹

The purpose of the state fiscal year (SFY) 2023 NAV was to determine if the plans complied with the State's geographic access standards outlined in their contracts.

The providers included in the NAV comprised all ordering, referring, and servicing providers contracted to provide care through one of Nevada's Medicaid MCOs or the DBA, and all providers contracted with Nevada to provide services on a fee-for-service (FFS) basis.¹⁻²

The plans included in the NAV are listed below:

- Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield Healthcare Solutions (Anthem)
- Health Plan of Nevada (HPN)
- Molina Healthcare of Nevada, Inc. (Molina)
- SilverSummit Healthplan, Inc. (SilverSummit)
- LIBERTY Dental Plan of Nevada, Inc. (LIBERTY)

Out-of-state providers were included in the NAV if they practice in one of the Nevada's Medicaid catchment areas listed in Appendix A. Many of these providers are geographically closer to recipients

Although at times this report refers to this subset of providers as the "FFS Network," this group comprises all providers who were enrolled with the State to provide Medicaid services to members, a prerequisite to billing for those services. The group is not directly comparable to the limited provider networks recruited and managed by the MCOs to meet the standards of their contracts.



living near the Nevada border than some providers practicing within the state. Contracted providers in these catchment areas are subject to the same time/distance standards as in-state providers.

For the SFY 2023 NAV, the plans applied a previously agreed-upon provider crosswalk to their provider data before submitting the data to HSAG; HSAG then conducted network capacity and geographic distribution analyses. HSAG also conducted network capacity analyses for the FFS population, applying the MCO provider crosswalk to DHCFP's Medicaid-enrolled provider data.

Figure 1-1 illustrates the three main phases of HSAG's SFY 2023 NAV activities.

Methodology

The SFY 2023 NAV activity contained the following analyses:

- **Network Capacity Analysis:** HSAG compared the number of providers associated with each of the MCOs, the DBA, and the FFS provider networks relative to the number of enrolled members. This provider-to-member ratio (provider ratio) represents a summary statistic used to highlight the overall capacity of a provider network to deliver services to Medicaid members.
- **Geographic Network Distribution Analysis:** HSAG evaluated the geographic distribution of providers relative to member populations. For each MCO and the DBA, HSAG calculated the percentage of members who were able to access a provider within the predefined access standards, as well as the average time and distance to the nearest three providers.



• **Telehealth:** HSAG analyzed the data provided by MCOs identifying which of their contracted providers offered telehealth services to member populations.¹⁻³

Table 1-1 indicates which analyses HSAG will complete for each provider network.

Data Collection

DHCFP provided Medicaid member demographic information and provider files, and the MCOs submitted provider network files to HSAG for use in the analyses. The files met the following criteria:

- Member eligibility and enrollment data including start and end dates for enrollment with a plan or eligibility for FFS as of December 1, 2022.
- DHCFP's enrolled provider data including all providers enrolled in Medicaid as of December 1, 2022.
- The plans' contracted network provider data including provider specialties and service locations as of December 1, 2022.

Data Processing

HSAG cleaned, processed, and defined the unduplicated lists of providers, provider locations, and members for inclusion in the analysis. HSAG then standardized and geocoded all Medicaid member and provider files using Quest Analytics Suite Version 2023.1 software. For all analyses, adults were defined as those members ages 18 years or older, and children were defined as members younger than 18 years of age. Analyses for obstetrics and gynecology (OB/GYN) providers were limited to female members ages 15 years and older.

For each plan and the FFS network, the provider ratio was calculated using the number of unduplicated providers with service locations in the State of Nevada or within the Nevada Medicaid catchment areas relative to the unique number of members. To identify unique providers, HSAG deduplicated the provider files by National Provider Identifier (NPI) and provider category. For the time and distance analysis, HSAG included every location listed for a given provider in the plan's or the FFS provider network.

Network Capacity Analysis

To assess the capacity of the plans and the FFS provider network, HSAG calculated the ratio of the number of providers by provider category (e.g., primary care providers [PCPs], cardiologists) to the number of members. The provider ratio represents a summary statistic used to highlight the overall capacity of the plans or FFS provider network to deliver services to Medicaid recipients. A lower number of members for each provider in a managed care provider network suggests greater network access since fewer members are competing to see a single provider and more providers are available to render services to individuals. Provider counts for this analysis were based on counts of distinct providers and not distinct provider locations. All study results were calculated at the statewide and county level.

The Plans

Table 1-2 displays the provider categories used to assess the MCOs' and the DBA's compliance with the minimum provider ratio standards in the MCO and DBA contracts. The results for additional provider types outlined in the provider crosswalk were included in the provider ratio analyses for reference. Since DHCFP does not set provider ratio standards for these additional categories, they were not assessed for compliance.

Fee-for-Service

HSAG calculated the provider ratio for each provider category defined below in Table 1-3 for the FFS network. The provider ratio measured the number of providers in each provider category (e.g., PCPs, inpatient hospitals) relative to the number of statewide Medicaid FFS members. Provider counts for this analysis were based on unique providers and not provider locations. Member counts were based on the number of members in the appropriate population (e.g., for pediatricians, members ages 17 and

younger). Provider ratios are reported for information only as there is no minimum provider ratio standard for the FFS network.

Geographic Network Distribution Analysis

The second dimension of this study evaluated the geographic distribution of providers relative to MCO or DBA members. While the previously described network capacity analysis identified the degree to which each MCO's or the DBA's provider network infrastructure was sufficient in the number of providers across a variety of specialties, this geographic network distribution analysis evaluated whether the number of provider locations in an MCO's or the DBA's provider network was appropriately distributed for the plan's Medicaid population (i.e., whether members have access to required providers within the required time or distance from their residence).

HSAG calculated the following two spatially derived metrics for the provider categories identified in the provider crosswalks:

- Percentage of members able to access care within standards listed in the MCO and DBA contracts: A
 higher percentage of members meeting access standards indicates a better geographic distribution of
 MCO providers relative to Medicaid members.
- Average travel distances (driving distances in miles) and travel times (driving times in minutes) to
 the nearest three providers: A shorter driving distance or travel time indicates greater accessibility to
 providers since members must travel fewer miles or minutes to access care.



HSAG measured the plans' networks against the minimum time and distance standards set by DHCFP as shown in Table 1-4. Additional provider types outlined in the provider crosswalk were included in the provider ratio analyses and average travel time analyses, and are provided for information only. For all analyses, adults were defined as those members ages 18 years or older, and children were defined as members ages 17 years and younger. Analyses for OB/GYNs were limited to female members ages 15 years and older.

Telehealth Provider Analysis

HSAG performed an exploratory analysis of the MCOs' use of telehealth providers, asking them to add a flag to their provider data identifying those providers offering telehealth services.¹⁻⁵ Results are presented using the provider categories identified in the provider crosswalk.

Analytic Considerations

Various factors associated with the SFY 2023 NAV may affect the validity or interpretation of the results presented in this report, including, but not limited to:

- NAV results do not reflect plans' network changes implemented since December 2022.
- The NAV findings are based on plans' network data files for all providers active with each plan as of December 1, 2022, and are contingent on the quality of member and network data supplied by DHCFP and the plans, respectively. Any substantial or systematic errors in the member or provider

network data may compromise the validity and reliability of the SFY 2023 NAV results including the following considerations:

- HSAG and DHCFP directed the plans to use the approved network crosswalk when preparing network data. The crosswalk was initially developed based on the plans' SFY 2020 network data and updated in SFY 2023, and a lack of compliance identified during the NAV analyses may reflect either a lack of contracted providers for the specified plan, or a plan's challenges in aligning internal network data with the approved network crosswalk categories.
- It was beyond the SFY 2023 NAV scope to evaluate the accuracy of the plans' network data or the FFS network data against an external standard (e.g., using telephone survey calls to verify the accuracy of network locations, contact information, new patient acceptance, or services offered).
- When evaluating the results presented in this report, note that provider data supplied by the plans do not include providers contracted with the plans under limited use contracts or single case agreements. A larger number of members may have access to providers if plans contract with selected providers under these limited use agreements versus standard contract agreements.
- Provider ratios represent high-level, aggregate measures of capacity based on the number of unique providers relative to members. This raw count of capacity does not account for the individual status of a provider's panel (i.e., accepting or not accepting new patients) or how active the provider is in the Medicaid program. Further, it is likely that a portion of providers are contracted to provide services for all four MCOs. As such, the provider ratio represents a potential capacity and may not directly reflect the availability of providers at any point in time.
 - When comparing provider ratios across the plans and the FFS network, note that plans are contractually required to meet minimum access standards to provide minimum acceptable care to their members residing in Clark and Washoe counties. The FFS network is not a managed network but simply contains all of the Medicaid members eligible for FFS and the providers who see them.
- The time and distance calculations presented in the SFY 2023 NAV represent a high-level measurement of geographic distribution of network provider locations relative to members. These statistics should be interpreted in the context of other information such as whether the provider's panel is accepting new patients at a specific location or how active the network location is in the program.
 - It is likely that some network locations are contracted to provide services for more than one MCO. As such, time and distance results highlight the geographic distribution of a provider network for all available network locations noted in the plans' network data files without considering potential barriers to new patient acceptance or appointment availability at individual service locations.
 - Prior to calculating time and distance results, HSAG geocoded the provider and member data to assign latitude and longitude values to each record. A limited percentage (i.e., less than 1 percent) of records could not be geocoded primarily due to invalid ZIP Codes or missing ZIP Codes from the data and were subsequently excluded from NAV analyses.
 - The member address data may not always reflect a member's place of residence (e.g., use of post office boxes), or be identifiable with mapping software (e.g., addresses reflecting local place designations, rather than street addresses). While mapping software may assign members to



- geographic coordinates, these coordinates may not align with the member's exact residential location for records that do not use a standard street address.
- When evaluating the results of these analyses, it is important to note that the reported average drive time may not mirror driver experience based on varying traffic conditions. Instead, average drive time should be interpreted as a standardized measure of the geographic distribution of providers relative to Medicaid members; the shorter the average drive time, the more similar the distribution of providers is relative to members. Current drive times are estimated by Quest Analytics based on the following drive speeds: urban areas are estimated at a drive speed of 30 miles per hour, suburban areas are estimated at a drive speed of 45 miles per hour, and rural areas are estimated at a drive speed of 55 miles per hour.
- The telehealth data are dependent on the MCOs' interpretation of whether the provision of telehealth services is applicable to a given provider type. HSAG could not always distinguish between instances in which plans did not add the flag for a provider category because they believed telehealth services were inappropriate for that provider category, and those in which plans believed telehealth services might be appropriate but were simply not offered by any providers.



2. NAV Findings—MCO

HSAG calculated the ratio of providers to members for each MCO and for Clark and Washoe counties to assess the capacity of Nevada's provider network and to evaluate compliance with the network adequacy standards stated in the MCO contracts. This provider ratio analysis is coupled with a geographic network distribution analysis to identify areas of provider need and to compare the provider networks maintained by each MCO.

Eligible Member Populations

Table 2-1 displays the number of eligible members for each MCO. The proportion of member populations residing in Clark and Washoe counties was similar across the MCOs, with between 86.8 percent and 89.7 percent of each MCO's members residing in Clark County and between 10.2 percent and 13.0 percent residing in Washoe County. The age distribution was also similar across all MCOs, with from 56.0 percent to 60.7 percent adults. For all MCOs, approximately one-third of all members were adult females (from 34.2 percent to 36.7 percent). **Molina** had the smallest total population, with 118,311 members statewide, while **HPN** had the largest population, with 225,495 members statewide.

Network Capacity Analysis

Provider ratios were calculated using the member populations described in Table 2-1. When interpreting the provider ratio results, it should be considered that not all members require routine care by all provider types; therefore, thresholds requiring fewer providers for a given number of members may be appropriate for certain physician specialists. Additionally, ratio results were not adjusted to account for the distribution of demographic and clinical member characteristics represented within each MCO. An MCO with a greater number of members with comorbidities or specific conditions may require a greater number of physician specialists. Lastly, the provider ratio standards were limited to the broad categories of PCPs and physician specialists, not to specific specialities within those categories. For example, an MCO must maintain a network of one physician specialist to 1,500 members but is not required to maintain that ratio for each identified specialty category (e.g., Pulmonologist). For the purposes of this report, ratios for individual specialty groups are shown for informational purposes, but only the standards shown for provider categories in Table 1-2 were assessed for compliance.

Table 2-2 through Table 2-21 present provider ratio analysis results by MCO, provider category, and county. These results include out-of-state providers who are within the catchment areas as members may travel outside the state for medical services.

A comparison of results by MCO for provider types that were compared to a provider ratio access standard is available in Appendix C.

Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield Healthcare Solutions

Table 2-2 through Table 2-6 display the provider ratios for **Anthem** for PCPs, physician specialists, behavioral health providers, ancillary providers, and facilities, respectively. Provider types assessed to a specific provider ratio standard set by DHCFP are **bolded**. Assessed provider ratios shown in green indicate the provider ratio was in compliance with the access standard, whereas provider ratios shown in red indicate the provider ratio was not in compliance with the access standard.

^{**}Adult females are a subset of adults; therefore, the total population contains the sum of adults and children and not the sum of all categories displayed.



As shown in Table 2-2, **Anthem** reported providers for all PCP and PCP extender provider categories and met the required provider ratio standards for both in Clark and Washoe counties. **Anthem** reported 1,554 PCPs and 2,129 PCP extenders, resulting in statewide provider ratios of 1:133 and 1:55, respectively.

Overall, **Anthem** met the provider ratio access standard for physician specialists across Clark and Washoe counties, as shown in Table 2-3. Statewide, there was one provider to every 135 members. However, **Anthem** did not report any pediatric physical medicine specialists in its provider network and only reported one specialist in each of the following pediatric categories: allergist and immunologist, dermatologist, ENT, orthopedic surgeon, and rheumatologist.

Geographic Network Distribution Analysis

Geographic network distribution analyses assess whether members experience undue burden related to either excessive travel time or distance required to reach the nearest provider. DHCFP has established access standards for a specific group of provider categories, generally requiring that 100 percent of plans' members be able to access those providers within the maximum allowable travel time or distance from their residence (previously reported in Table 1-4). HSAG calculated the percentages of members able to access care within the time and distance standards using the member populations described in Table 2-1. Although the standards apply to a subset of the provider types identified in the provider crosswalk, all were included in the average travel time analyses, which are displayed in Appendix C. In the following tables, provider types assessed to a specific provider time and distance access standard are **bolded**. Assessed results shown in green indicate that the percentage of members within the access standard met the standard, and percentages shown in red indicate that less than 99.0 percent of members had access within the standard.

Table 2-22 through Table 2-37 display the percentages of members with access to care within the contract standards for each provider type by MCO, provider category, and county. Like the network capacity analysis, these results include out-of-state providers located within the Nevada Medicaid catchment areas as members may travel outside the State for medical services. Additional detailed information on the travel time and travel distance to the nearest three providers for all provider types and a comparison of results across MCOs are available in Appendix C.

Table 2-47 displays the percentage of PCPs **SilverSummit** identified as offering telehealth services. **SilverSummit** identified some providers in each provider category as offering telehealth services, with the highest rates among family practitioners (31.0 percent) and NPs (26.4 percent), with similar rates for adult PCPs (23.7 percent), PAs (24.6 percent), and pediatricians (24.7 percent). As might be expected, among individual providers, the percentage was lowest among OB/GYNs, at 14.7 percent. The only facility-level provider included in this category, FQHC/RHC, had the lowest percentage of providers offering telehealth services, at 2.9 percent.

Table 2-48 displays the percentage of physician specialists **SilverSummit** identified as offering telehealth services. **SilverSummit** identified some providers in most provider categories as offering telehealth services except these pediatric specialists: allergists and immunologists, cardiologists, ENTs, infectious disease specialists, orthopedic surgeons, urologists, and vision care providers. Pediatric nephrologists and rheumatologists had the largest percentage of providers offering telehealth, each at 100 percent, although this reflected relatively small numbers of providers (three of three pediatric nephrologists and one of one pediatric rheumatologist).

Table 2-49 displays the percentage of behavioral health providers **SilverSummit** identified as offering telehealth services. Behavioral health providers across the board had the highest percentage of providers offering telehealth compared to other provider categories. Board-certified child and adolescent psychiatrists had the highest percentage of providers who offered telehealth (66.7 percent), followed by mental health nurses (59.6 percent), pediatric QMHPs (59.3 percent), and pediatric psychiatrists (52.4 percent).

3. NAV Findings—DBA

HSAG calculated the ratio of providers to members for the DBA, **LIBERTY**, to assess the capacity of Nevada's provider network and to assess compliance with the network adequacy standards stated in the DBA contract. This provider ratio analysis is coupled with a geographic network distribution analysis to identify areas of provider need and to compare the provider networks maintained by **LIBERTY**.

Eligible Member Population

Table 3-1 displays the member population counts, by county, for members enrolled with **LIBERTY**. Most **LIBERTY** members resided in Clark County (approximately 90 percent) compared to Washoe County (roughly 10 percent). Member categories across Clark and Washoe counties were also similar, with roughly 57 percent of all members being adults, and approximately 43 percent of all members being children.

Network Capacity Analysis

DHCFP has set a minimum provider ratio for dental primary care providers, at one provider for every 1,500 members. Provider ratios were calculated using the member populations described in Table 3-1. As with interpreting the MCO provider ratio results, not all members require routine care by all dental provider types; therefore, contracting with fewer providers for a given population may be appropriate for certain dental specialists. Additionally, ratio results were not adjusted to account for the distribution of demographic and clinical member characteristics represented within the DBA. Lastly, the provider ratio standards were limited to the broad categories of dental primary care provider and dental specialists, not to specific specialties within those categories. Ratios for the individual specialty groups are shown for informational purposes, while only the standards for provider categories shown in Table 1-2 were assessed for compliance.

Table 3-2 presents provider ratio analysis results, which includes out-of-state providers within the Nevada Medicaid catchment areas since members may travel outside the state for dental services. Provider types assessed to the provider ratio are **bolded**. Assessed provider ratios shown in green

indicate the provider ratio was in compliance with the access standard, whereas provider ratios shown in red indicate the provider ratio was not in compliance with the access standard.

As shown in Table 3-2, **LIBERTY** met the provider ratio standard for dental PCPs in both Clark and Washoe counties although it did not meet the statewide 1:1,500 provider ratio standard. Across all provider categories, Washoe County consistently had lower provider ratios, which may be the result of having a smaller member population compared to Clark County.

Geographic Network Distribution Analysis

Table 3-3 lists the percentages of members within the contract standards for each provider category and county. Similar to the network capacity analysis, results include out-of-state providers who are within the Nevada Medicaid catchment areas as members may travel outside the state for medical services. Provider types assessed to the provider ratio access standard are **bolded**. Assessed results shown in green indicate that percentage of members within the access standard was in compliance, and percentages shown in red indicate a result of less than 99.0 percent.

Additional detailed information on travel times and travel distances to the nearest three providers for all providers included in the provider crosswalk is available in Appendix D.

As shown in Table 3-3 **LIBERTY** met the 100 percent access standard for members residing in Washoe County with respect to endodontists and oral surgeons, and at least 99.9 percent of members across both Clark and Washoe counties had access to dental providers in most categories. The exceptions were for members residing in Washoe County, where **LIBERTY** identified no public health endorsed dental hygienists, periodontists, or prosthodontists.

Eligible Member Population

Table 4-1 displays statewide member population counts for members enrolled in the FFS network. Member counts at the county level are displayed in Appendix E. Statewide, approximately 75 percent of all FFS members were adults (ages 18 years and older), and 25 percent were children (ages 17 years and younger). This is a lower proportion of children than was found for the MCOs, where children comprised approximately 40 percent of the plans' members. Roughly 45 percent of all FFS members statewide were adult females (ages 15 years and older).

Network Capacity Analysis

Total Population

Provider ratios were calculated using the member populations described in Table 4-1. The provider population differs from that in the plan analyses since these providers do not participate in a contracted network. Rather, the provider population includes all providers enrolled in Medicaid in Nevada who are available to provide care for individuals eligible for FFS healthcare funded by DHCFP.

Table 4-2 displays provider ratios for the FFS network. Statewide, the provider ratio for PCPs was 1:42, and the provider ratio for PCP extenders was 1:35. There were 66 inpatient hospitals and 540 pharmacies reported in the FFS provider network, resulting in provider ratios of 1:2,711 and 1:443, respectively. Provider ratios by county are presented in Appendix E.

Conclusion

The Nevada SFY 2023 NAV analyses found provider networks for the MCOs and the DBA that generally complied with the network adequacy standards set by the state. The network capacity analysis revealed that the plans contract with a large number and array of providers across most provider categories, resulting in provider-to-member ratios that are all well within the State's minimum requirements. The geographic network distribution analysis established that with few exceptions, 99 percent to 100 percent of members across all plans have access to providers within the required time and distance from their residence. However, opportunities for improvement surrounding pediatric specialties continue to exist.

The network capacity analysis demonstrated that all MCOs met provider ratio standards for all provider categories assessed in Clark and Washoe counties and statewide. Across the MCOs, there were consistently higher provider ratios in Clark County than in Washoe County, possibly as a result of Clark County's larger member populations. For members statewide and in Clark and Washoe counties, SilverSummit had the lowest ratios (i.e., fewer members for each provider) for PCPs, PCP extenders, and physician specialists, although HPN reported the highest number of PCPs and physician specialists. All of the MCOs contracted with few, if any, pediatric specialists, particularly physical medicine specialists, dermatologists, allergists and immunologists, ENTs, rheumatologists, and pediatric vision specialists.

The geographic network distribution analysis ensured that each MCO and the DBA provided members with access to necessary providers within a minimum time or distance from their residence. Although ensuring that 100 percent of members have access within the access standard was not always possible, the plans generally maintained a geographically accessible network, with at least 99.0 percent of members residing within the time and distance access standards for most provider categories.

PCPs: For access to primary care, MCOs can meet the standard by providing access to a number of different provider types including family practitioners, internists, NPs, PAs, and pediatricians. When all of these provider categories were rolled up, at least 99.4 percent of adult members residing in Clark or Washoe counties had access to a PCP within minimum standards. All MCOs were also able to provide at least 99.9 percent of child members with access to a pediatrician within the standard, although the results were slightly lower in Washoe County, with **Molina** providing access to 97.2 percent of children and **SilverSummit** to 97.7 percent of children within standards.

OB/GYN care is subject to the same time and distance requirement as PCPs. At least 99 percent of adult females in Clark County insured by any of the MCOs had access to an OB/GYN within 10 miles or 15 minutes of their residence. The percentages were slightly lower for all MCOs in Washoe County, ranging from a low of 95.2 percent for HPN members to a high of 97.6 percent for Molina members.



Physician Specialists: For access to physician specialists, DHCFP has set standards for nine specialists, as described in Table 1-4. Among those MCOs with specific standards, all were able to provide 99.9 percent to 100 percent of members with access within the standards in both Clark and Washoe counties, and statewide, as presented in Table C-23. All MCOs were also able to provide 99.9 percent of children in Clark County with access to a pediatric rheumatologist within standards. However, none were able to contract with a provider of that type in Washoe County, reducing statewide percentages to between a low of 86.4 percent of **Molina** child members to a high of 88.9 percent of **HPN** members.

Behavioral Health Providers: Access to care for behavioral health providers was generally high across all MCOs, with at least 99.9 percent of members having access to care within the access standard for nearly all behavioral health provider categories. However, **Molina** identified no pediatric psychologists in Washoe County, resulting in no members in that county and only 86.4 percent of its members statewide having access within the standard.

Facility-Level Providers: Access to care for facility-level providers was generally high across all MCOs, with at least 99.9 percent of members having access to care within the access standard for nearly all facility-level provider categories. Importantly, no pediatric hospitals were identified by **HPN** or **Molina** in Washoe County or by **SilverSummit** in Clark County, resulting in no access to their respective pediatric members in those counties. These plans' statewide rates were impacted by lack of county access, with **SilverSummit** providing access to only 11.2 percent of child members to a pediatric hospital within access standards. **HPN**'s and **Molina**'s results were substantially higher for children with access within standards, at 88.9 percent and 86.4 percent, respectively.

The DBA: LIBERTY met the provider ratio standard for general and pediatric dentists in both Clark and Washoe counties, and met the access standard of 100 percent of members in Washoe County able to access an endodontist or oral surgeon within 40 miles or 60 minutes of their residence. At least 99.9 percent of members in Clark County had access to all dental provider types within the access standard. In Washoe County, at least 99.9 percent of members had access within the access standard for general dentists and pediatric dentists. No LIBERTY members living in Washoe county had access within standards to a public health endorsed dental hygienist, a periodontist, or a prosthodontist, drawing statewide results for these specialists to from 88.3-88.4 percent of members having the required access.

FFS: Statewide, the number of members in the FFS network per provider was low, with one PCP for every 42 members and one PCP extender for every 35members. Although this suggests the robustness of the FFS network, these results should be interpreted with care since they do not indicate a provider's capacity and because a geographic network distribution analysis was outside of the scope of work for this activity.

Average travel distances and times to nearest three providers: Results of the average travel time and travel distance from a member's residence to the nearest three providers by MCO and provider category are provided in Appendix C. These results underscore the severity of the challenge members face in accessing care from several provider categories, especially for some physician specialties. These numbers indicate travel distances in the hundreds of miles for some residents seeking care from the following pediatric specialties: allergists and immunologists, cardiologists, dermatologists, ENTs,



gastroenterologists, infectious disease specialists, nephrologists, orthopedic surgeons, rheumatologists, urologists, vision care providers, psychologists, and pediatric hospitals.

Telehealth Providers: The MCOs varied widely in responding to the request for data regarding which of their providers offer telehealth services. This variation may be attributable to many external factors and the results may not present a true or complete picture of access to telehealth services in the MCO networks. As mentioned, HPN unintentionally omitted telehealth data for PCPs and physician specialists; Molina did not identify any behavioral health providers offering telehealth services. Among MCOs' providing data, there may be greater telehealth engagement among individual behavioral health providers followed by PCPs. These data suggest the potential for measuring whether telehealth is a feasible option for improving access to care, as well as a need for improvements in data collection and reporting.

Promising Practices and Opportunities for Improvements

Based on the results and conclusions presented in this report, HSAG recommends the following for DHCFP and the MCOs and DBA to strengthen the Medicaid managed care provider networks and FFS network to ensure members' access to healthcare services:

- As provider ratios and geographic distribution represent the potential capacity and distribution of
 contracted providers and may not directly reflect the availability of providers at any point in time,
 DHCFP should consider using appointment availability and utilization analyses to evaluate
 providers' availability. Future studies may incorporate encounter data or secret shopper telephone
 survey results to assess members' utilization of services, as well as potential gaps in access to care
 resulting from inadequate provider availability.
- In addition to assessing the number, distribution, and availability of providers, DHCFP should review patient satisfaction survey results and grievance and appeals data to evaluate the degree to which members are satisfied with the care they have received.
- DHCFP should conduct an in-depth review of provider categories in which each plan did not meet either provider ratio or time and distance access standards, with the goal of determining whether or not the failure of the plan to meet the contract standard(s) was the result of a lack of providers or an inability to contract with providers in the geographic area. Future analyses should evaluate the extent to which the plans have requested exemptions from DHCFP for provider categories in which providers may not be available or willing to contract with the MCO(s) or DBA.
- Provider ratios were calculated using all providers who were enrolled with the plans and the FFS network as of December 1, 2022; however, these calculations do not consider a provider's panel capacity or if they are accepting new patients. DHCFP could consider calculating provider ratios that adjust for the number of plans the provider is contracted with or calculating provider ratios to those providers who are actively seeing Medicaid enrolled members by using encounter data.
- Provider categories that do not have an access standard were included in this NAV analysis and some results were shown for informational purposes only. DHCFP could consider developing access



standards for these provider categories, which will allow DHCFP to better assess the breadth of each plan's provider network.

- DHCFP should work with the MCOs to expand contracting efforts for pediatric rheumatologists and pediatric psychologists in Washoe County.
- DHCFP can assess the dental specialists available for contracting and determine whether the access standards are appropriate.
- DHCFP should consider conducting further analyses for the FFS provider network by performing network capacity analyses on additional provider types or conducting a geographic distribution analysis. Although there are no standards to assess the FFS network against, DHCFP could determine the average time and distance it takes for members to access care to the nearest three providers by county or examine the average time actually traveled to active providers.
- DHCFP could consider conducting further analyses of the extent to which the plans are using telehealth services to address access issues.

Molina Healthcare of Nevada, Inc. ("Molina") appreciates the opportunity to provide feedback in response to the state fiscal year (SFY) 2023 Network Adequacy Validation annual draft report received on June 7, 2023, prepared by the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Care Financing and Policy (DHCFP) external quality review organization (EQRO), Health Services Advisory Group, Inc. (HSAG).

Overall Comments and Observations

Molina is working diligently and conducting and internal review of the current taxonomies in our system and mirror what is provided by the DHCFP monthly Provider Active report. Once this project has been completed, we should see a more accurate listing that mirrors the Provider Active report.

We recognize our Telehealth provider numbers as being low, however within the next week, we will be making a concerted outreach effort to gain the necessary knowledge on telehealth services currently being offered by our contracted providers.

Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)

The DHCFP provided guidance on January 26, 2023, that DHCFP does not rely on taxonomy for enrollment purposes therefore, we are not able to list all service location National Provider Identifiers (NPIs). For example, Nevada Health Centers has twenty (20) service locations NPIs, and all bill under one (1) group NPI.

Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)

The number in this category may potentially be understated due to taxonomy code challenges identified and currently being worked as stated in our overall comments related to the NPPES data versus the DHCFP Provider Active Report.

Allergist and Immunologist, Pediatric

Per the taxonomy codes provided on NAV Crosswalk, 2080P0201X and 2080I0007X, there are no providers enrolled with Nevada.

Geographic Network Distribution Analysis (Page 3-3)

Table 3-3 lists the percentages of members within the contract standards for each provider category and county. Similar to the network capacity analysis, results include out-of-state providers who are within the Nevada Medicaid catchment areas as members may travel outside the state for medical services. Provider types assessed to the provider ratio access standard are **bolded**. Assessed results shown in green indicate that percentage of members within the access standard was in compliance, and percentages shown in red indicate a result of less than 99.0 percent.

Additional detailed information on travel times and travel distances to the nearest three providers for all providers included in the provider crosswalk is available in Appendix D.

As shown in Table 3-3 **LIBERTY** met the 100 percent access standard for members residing in Washoe County with respect to endodontists and oral surgeons, and at least 99.9 percent of members across both Clark and Washoe counties had access to dental providers in most categories. The exceptions were for members residing in Washoe County, where **LIBERTY** identified no public health endorsed dental hygienists, periodontists, or prosthodontists.

For consideration, Mid-Level Dental Providers including Dental Hygienists (whether public health endorsed or not) should be considered the same as PCP Extenders like NPs and PAs. Access should not be counted separately for these providers and should not be required for compliance.

Conclusion (Page 5-2)

The DBA: LIBERTY met the provider ratio standard for general and pediatric dentists in both Clark and Washoe counties, and met the access standard of 100 percent of members in Washoe County able to access an endodontist or **oral** surgeon within 40 miles or 60 minutes of their residence. At least 99.9 percent of members in Clark County had access to all dental provider types within the access standard. In Washoe County, at least 99.9 percent of members had access within the access standard for general



dentists and pediatric dentists. No **LIBERTY** members living in Washoe County had access within standards to a public health endorsed dental hygienist, a periodontist, or a prosthodontist, drawing statewide results for these specialists to from 88.3-88.4 percent of members having the required access.

For consideration, Dental Hygienists and Prosthodontists should be reported as informational only, but not count as part of the compliance measurements."
