Sickle Cell Disease (SCD)

Overview

Sickle cell disease (SCD) is a group of inherited red blood cell disorders. The red blood cells become hard and sticky and look like a C-shaped farm tool called a "sickle." People with SCD can live full lives and enjoy most of the activities that other people do. Nevada Medicaid covers medically necessary services for SCD and its variants.

Coverage

Laboratory testing for newborns to adults

- Includes newborn screening and individual laboratory tests such as Hemoglobin S Solubility Test and sodium metabisulfite test; Hemoglobinopathy (Hb) evaluation which is a comprehensive list of tests; hemoglobin stability screen, complete blood count, blood smear, iron tests, and many more.
- Genetic DNA testing is only covered for children under the age of 21 years old with an EPSDT override for medical necessity.

Medically necessary treatment

 Covered in an office visit with a physician, physician assistant (PA), or advanced practice registered nurse (APRN). This includes evaluation, counseling, and education. There are no limitations to these services.

Prescription drugs

- Prescription drugs are a covered benefit along with unlimited refills when prescribed by an appropriate provider (physician, PA, APRN). Prescription drugs for SCD and its variants are included on the list of preferred prescription drugs.
- Supplements for SCD and its variants are also covered. Nevada Medicaid created a list of unlimited non-prescription supplements which is reviewed biennially.

Case Management

 Medicaid District Offices provide case management to Fee-for-Service recipients. Managed Care Organization also provide case management to recipients. Both can assist with services to transition a recipient from pediatric care to adult care when the recipient reaches 18 years old.
