## Background

- U.S. Department of Justice & Americans with Disabilities Act
- Children with behavioral health needs (disabilities)
- Lack of community options for care except for hospital inpatient care
- Many sent to residential treatment; often out of state
- Settlement Agreement (still confidential negotiations)

Nevada children have access to the behavioral health services they need to live and thrive with their families and in their communities.

- Coordinated Response



The Dehavieral Health Care Continuum







#### Engage our community members, providers, and sister agencies


- Monthly Working Group meetings to review all new policies and RFP processes

- Ongoing public workshops & hearings for new policies

#### **Develop new & enhanced benefits**


- **Therapies** for children & families provide at home and in the community *Rate increase (Q1 2025)*
- **Peer supports,** connecting children and families with support from their peers *New benefit (Q1 2025)*
- **Respite care** to give caregivers planned or emergency short-term relief - *New benefit (Q3 2025)*
- Mobile crisis services Enhanced benefit (Q3 2025)
- and more!

#### Modernize the care delivery system

- Specialty Managed Care plan launches
  January 1st, 2027. A single health plan will
  cover all medical and behavioral health
  benefits for eligible youth.
- Wraparound providers will ensure enhanced care coordination of all services and benefits for children and families to keep them at home and in their communities whenever possible.



State team will use feedback and recommendations from working group to inform the project and program design. State team will engage with multiple stakeholder tables and public comment forums and share information gathered with working group.



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## Topics for Consideration at Future Working Groups

- "Youth peer support and family support as a whole. We look at the whole unit that needs care, not just the child. The environment needs to be conducive to their functionality and well being into adult hood."
- "The need of continuity of care amongst the different levels of mental health care."
- "Services for transracial adoptions and cultural humility training for foster placements."
- "How to make community resources more accessible and known to the public. This continues to be a significant challenge, as many families are unaware of the services available to them. Additionally, I believe the group should focus on ways to better inform families about providers who offer high-quality care. Ensuring that families can easily identify and connect with reputable providers in the community would greatly improve the support they receive."
- "Increasing the workforce and addressing the education of the workforce."
