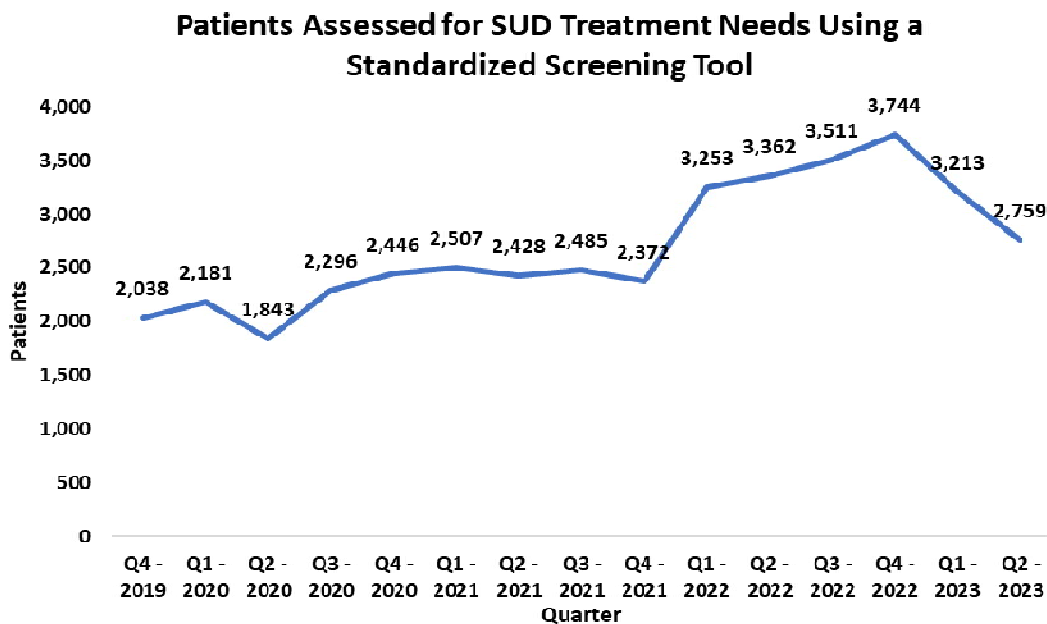

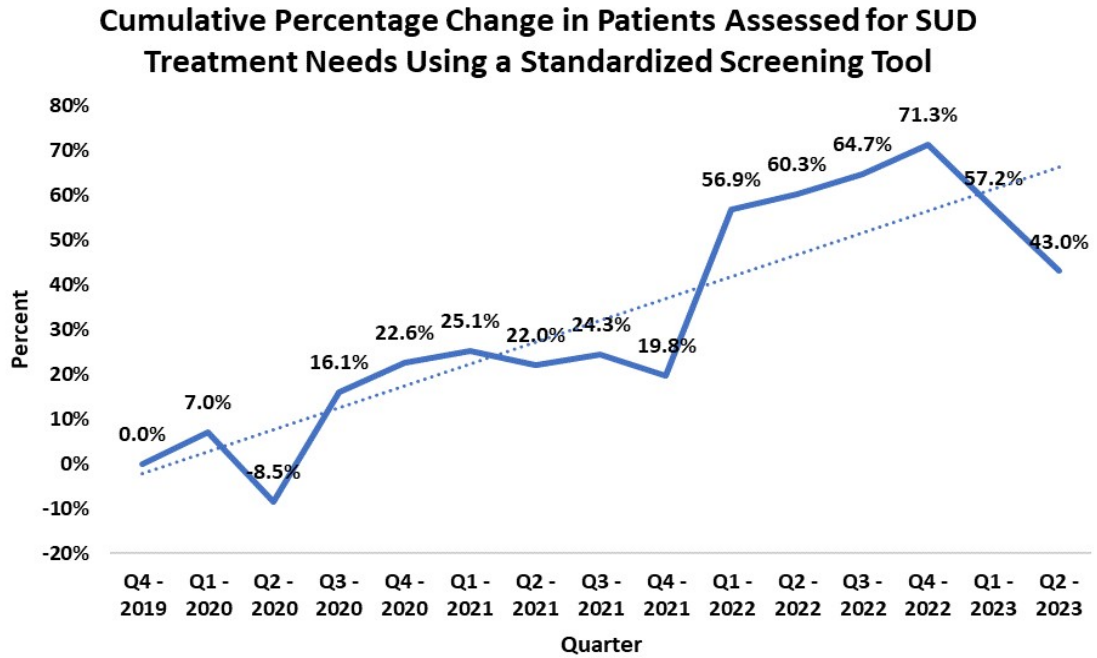

A2 - Early Intervention for Medicaid Beneficiaries with Substance Use Disorder (SUD)

Early intervention identifies the underlying issues and triggers, which allow addiction to flourish and takes measures to prevent its growth. Intervening early assists with establishing healthy coping skills, a sense of confidence and self-worth, which minimizes the need or want to use drugs or alcohol. Drug and alcohol intervention is successful in treating individuals who are dependent on one or more substances.

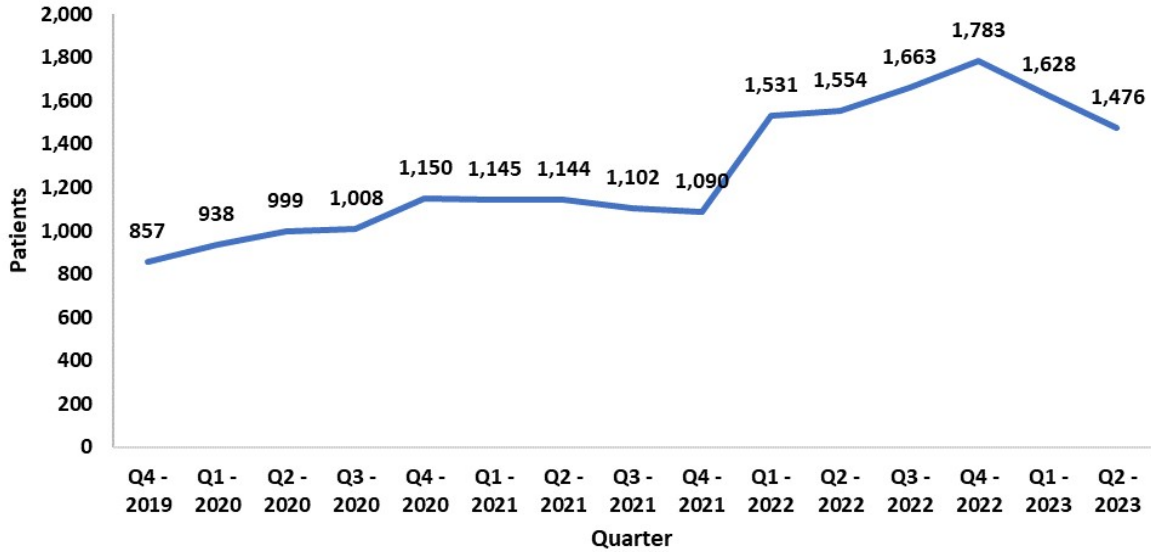

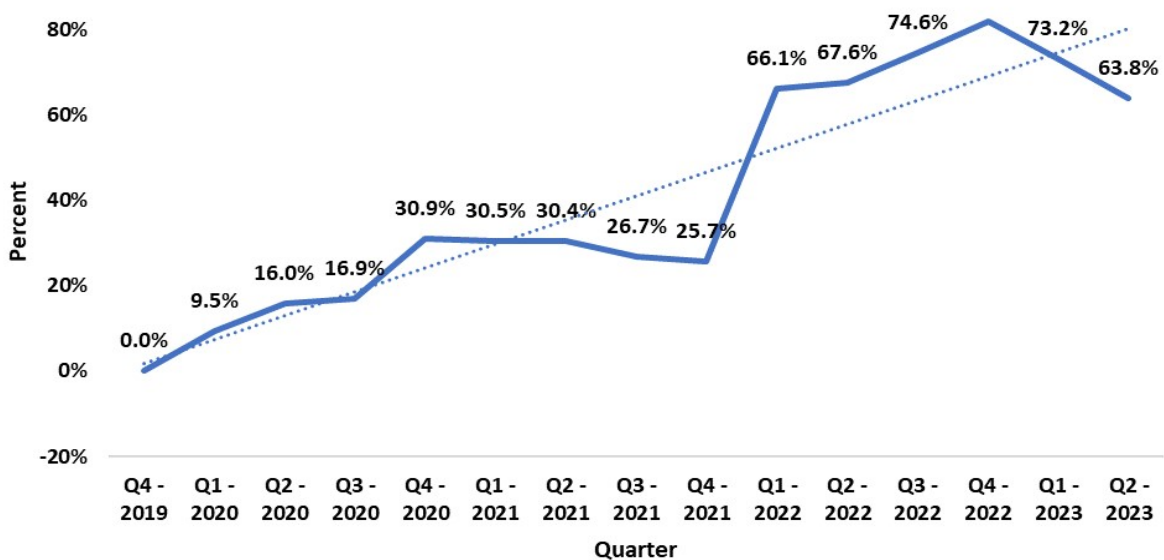

Treatment Services**

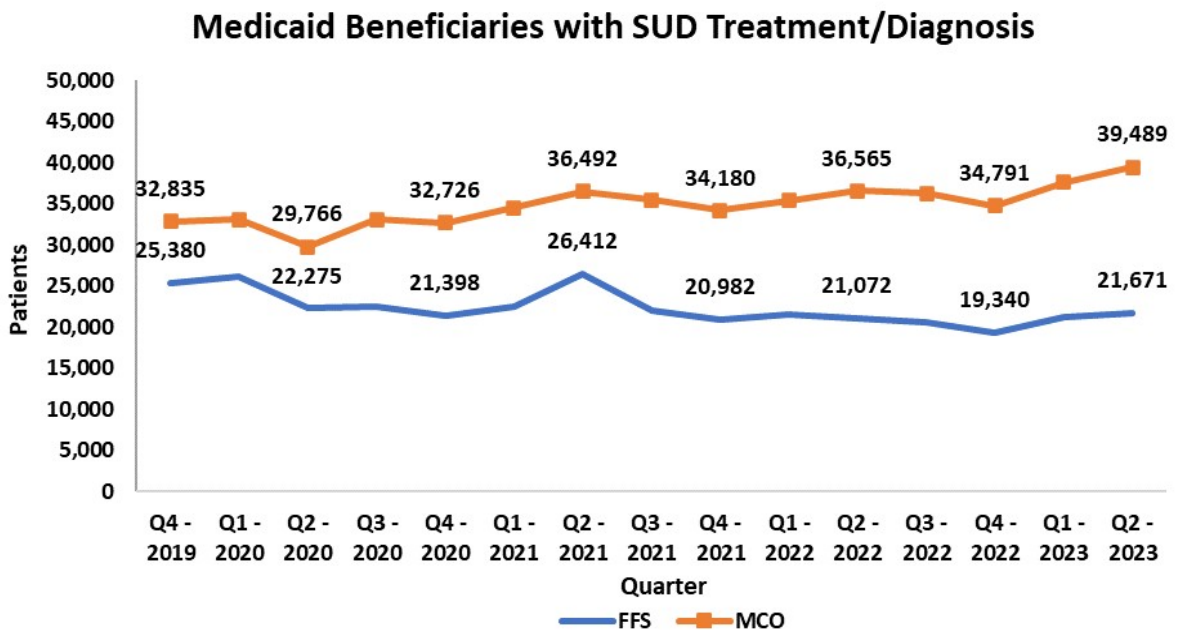

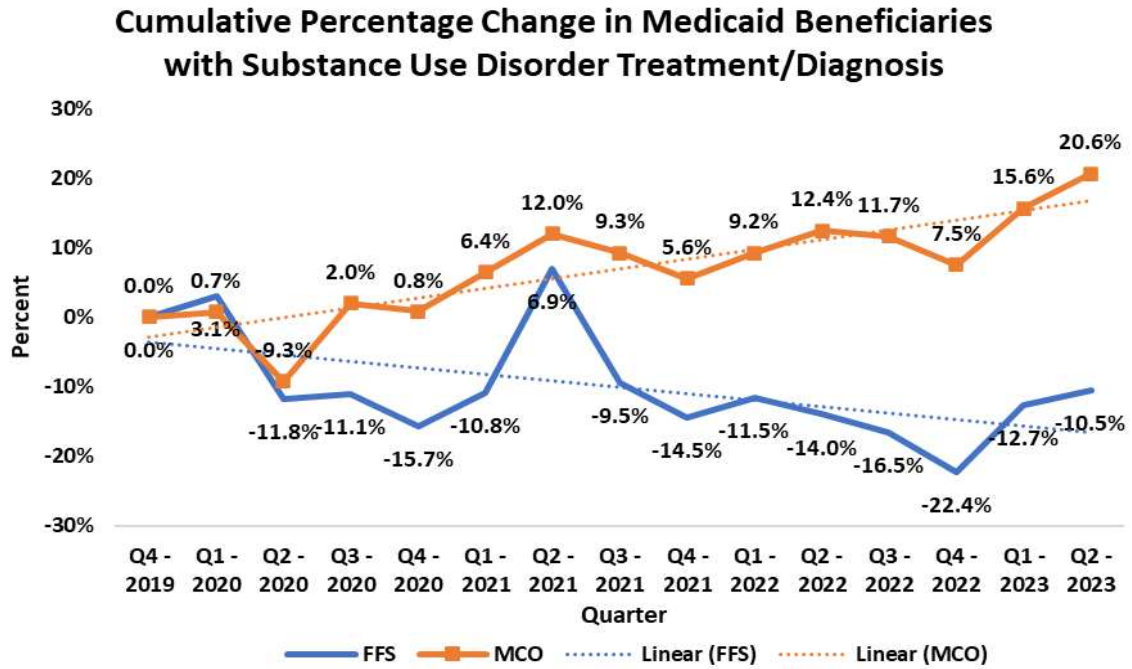

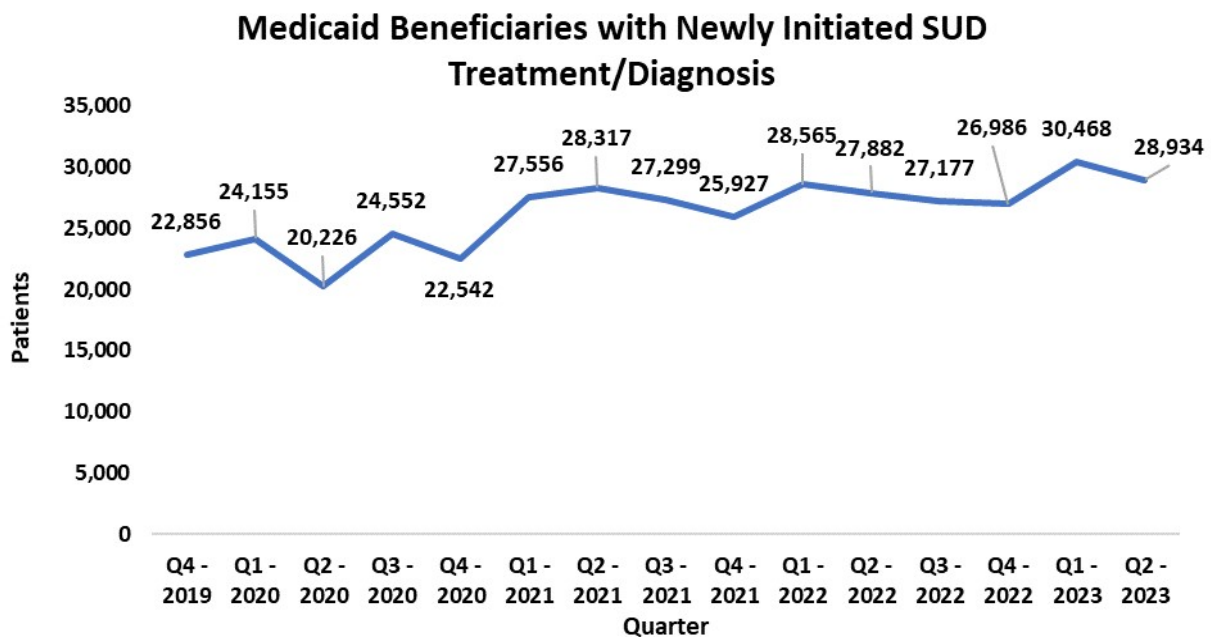

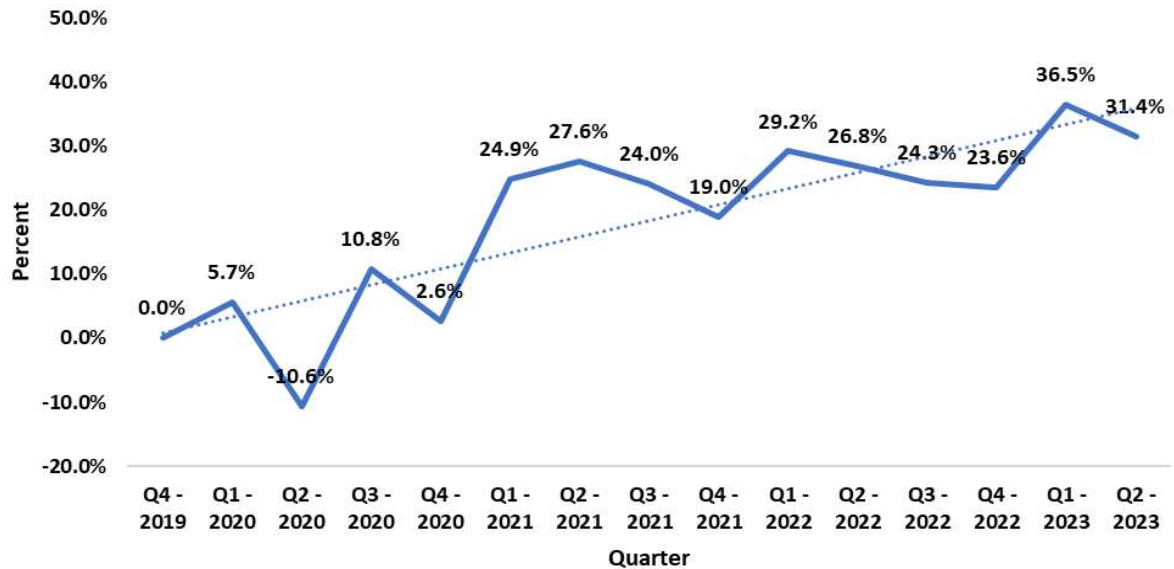

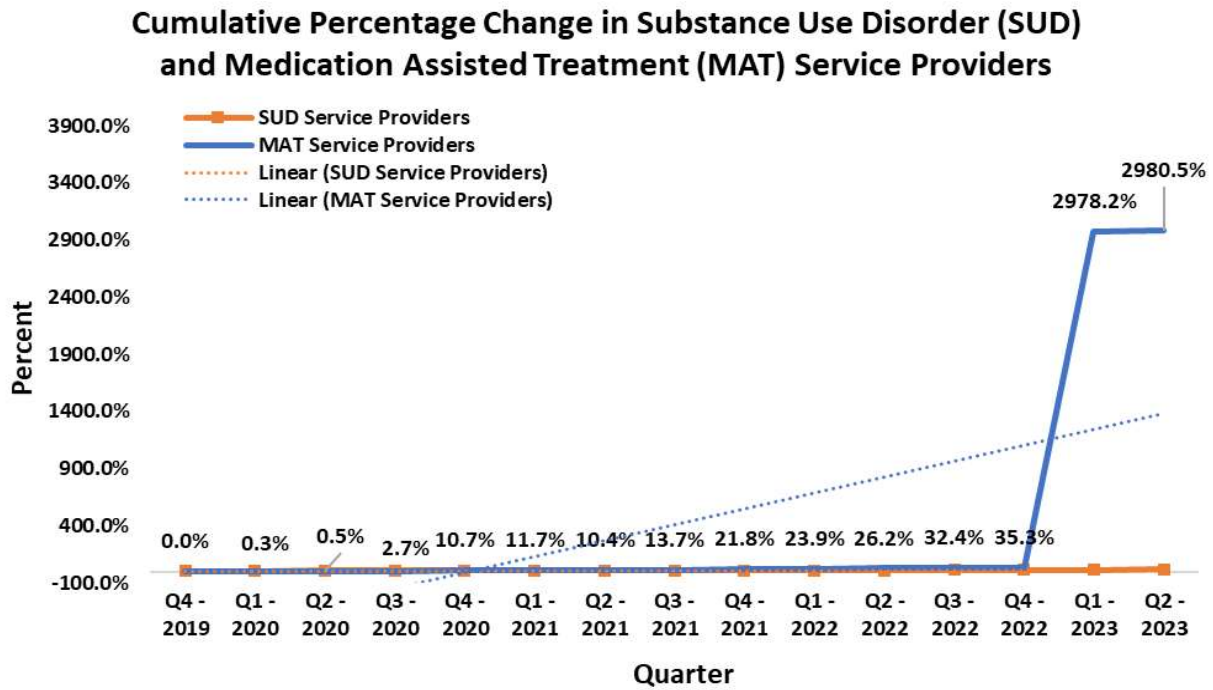
B1 - Substance Use Disorder (SUD) and Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) Service Providers

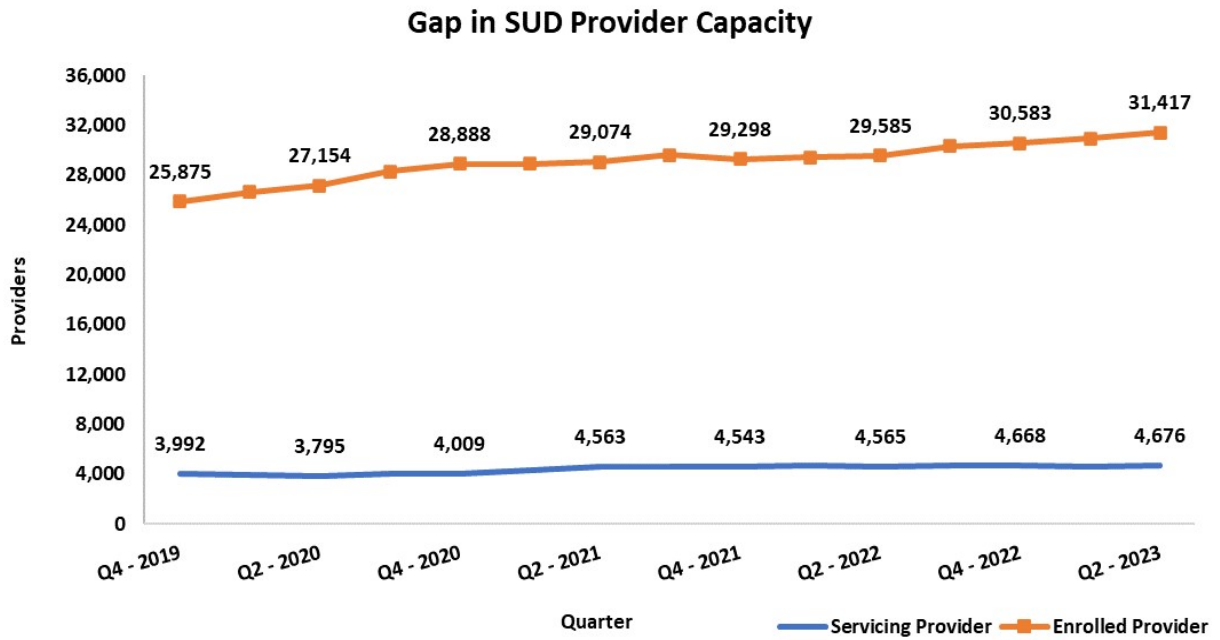

Cumulative Percentage Change in Patients Receiving Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services Provided by Physicians



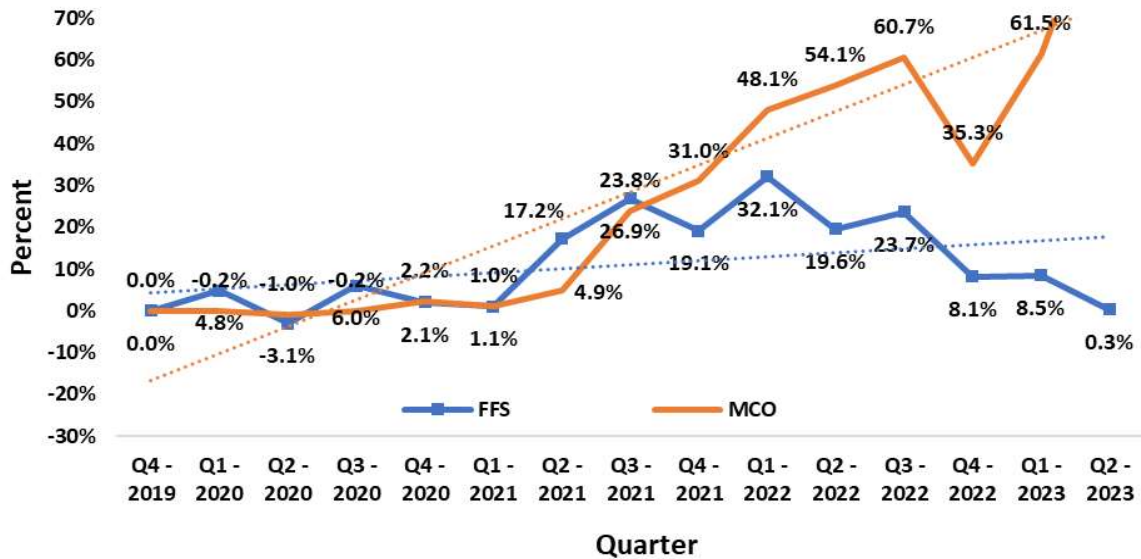

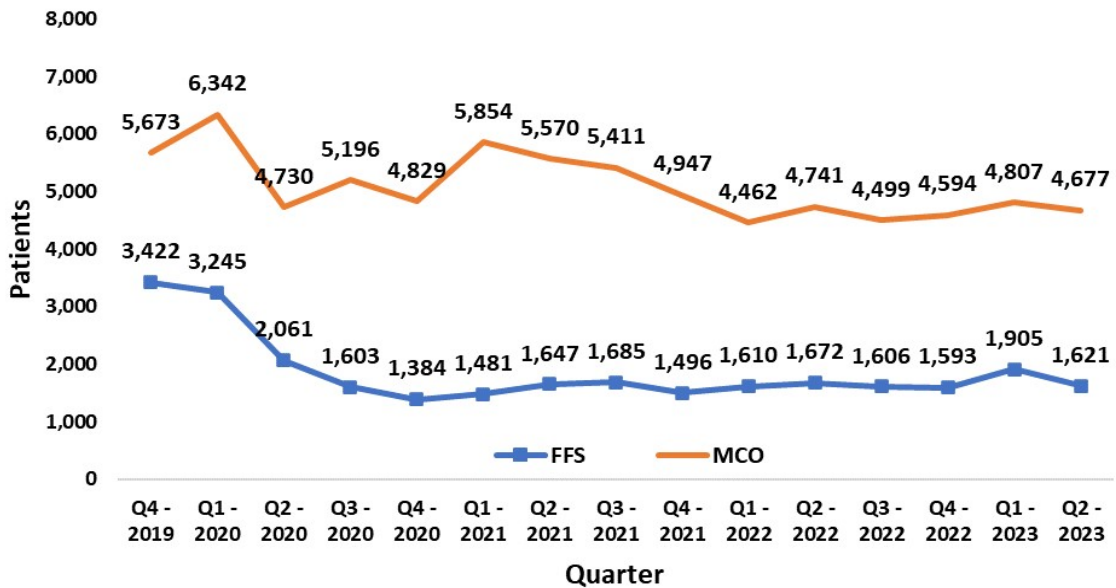

Cumulative Percentage Change in Patients Receiving Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services Provided by Other Licensed Practitioners



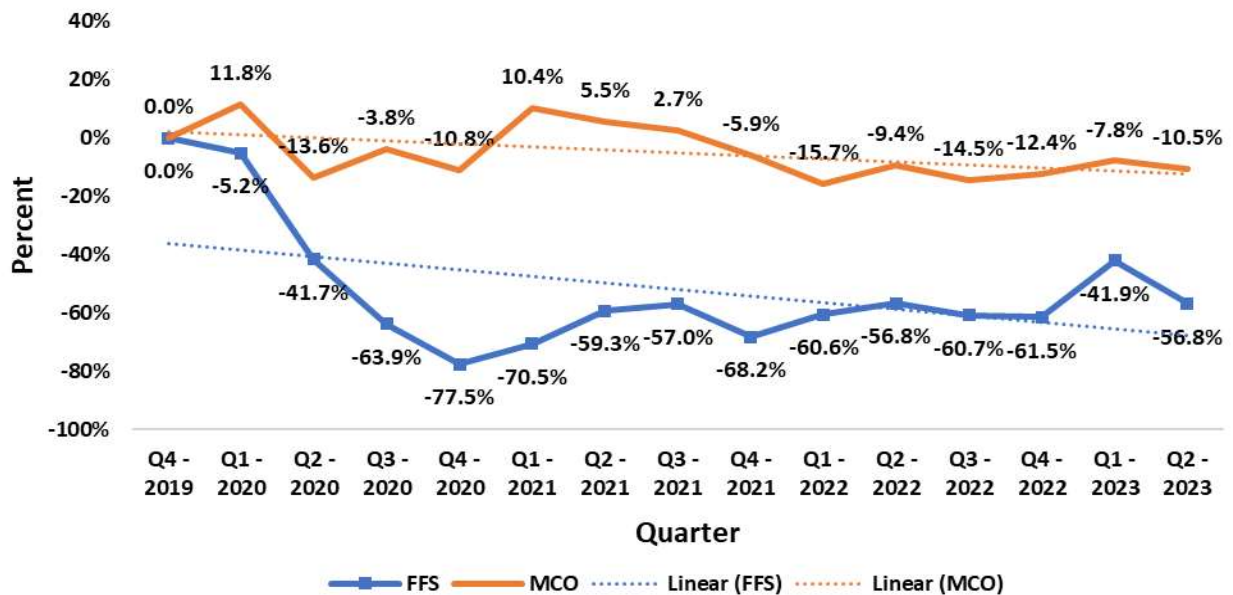
Patients Receiving Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services Provided by Diagnostic and Rehabilitative Services



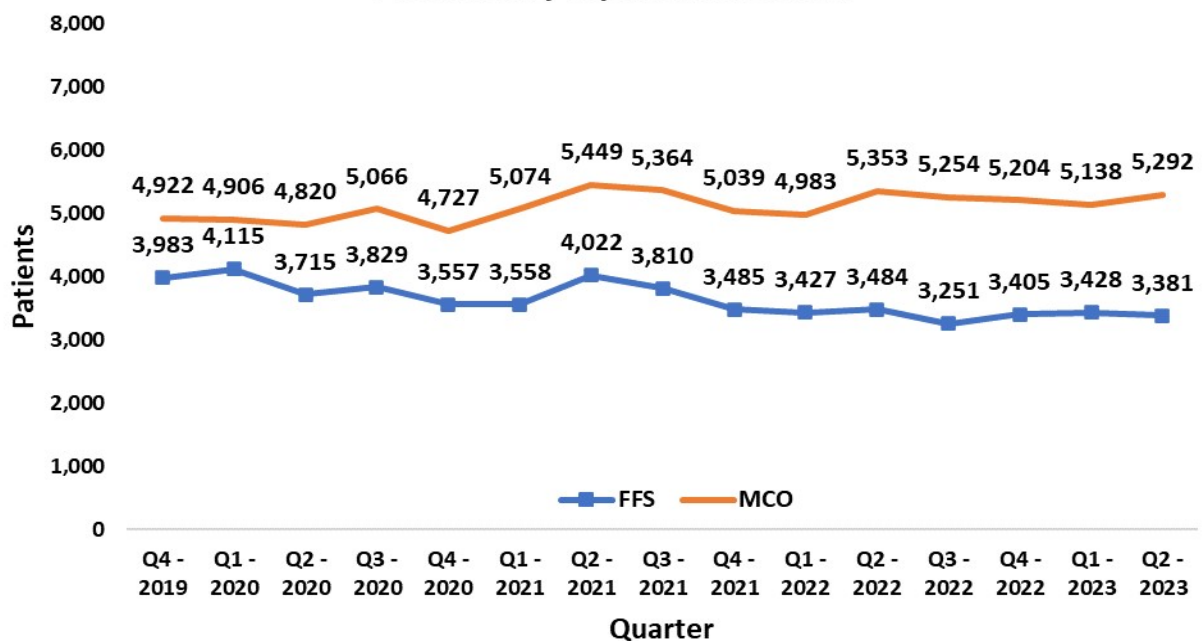

Cumulative Percentage Change in Patients Receiving Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services Provided by Diagnostic and Rehabilitative Services

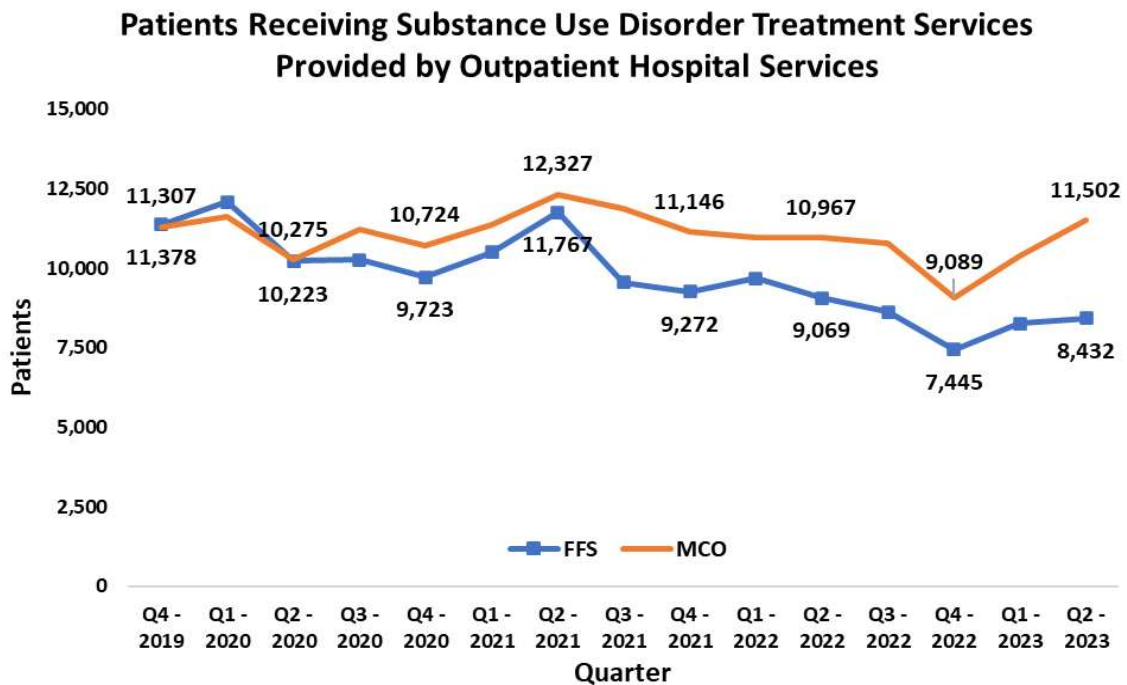
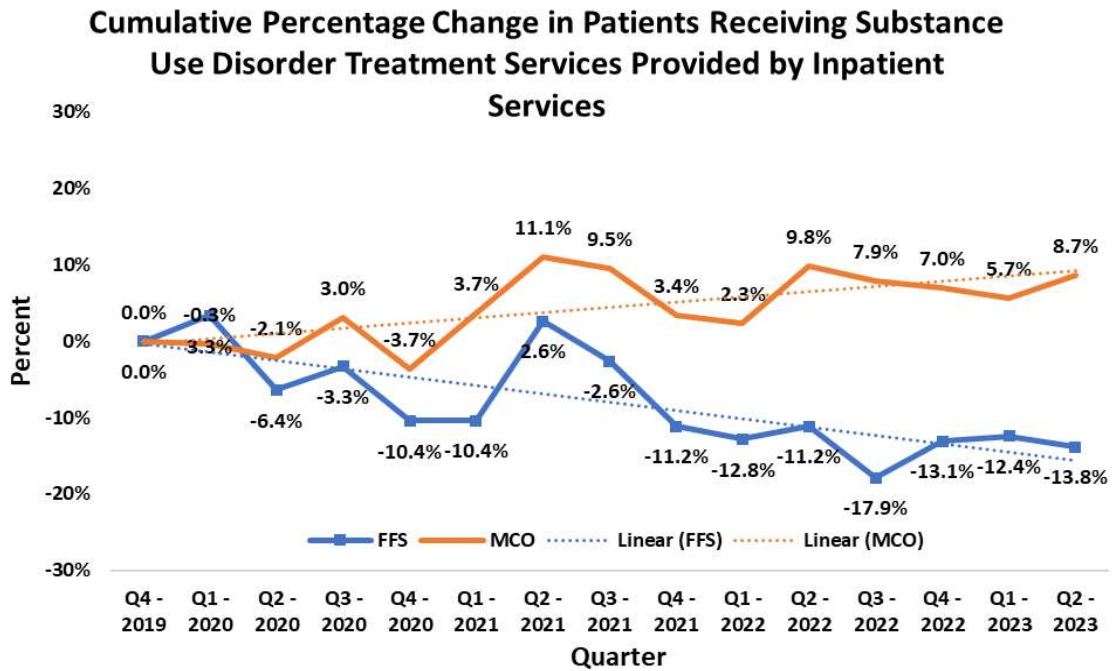


Patients Receiving Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services Provided by Inpatient Services



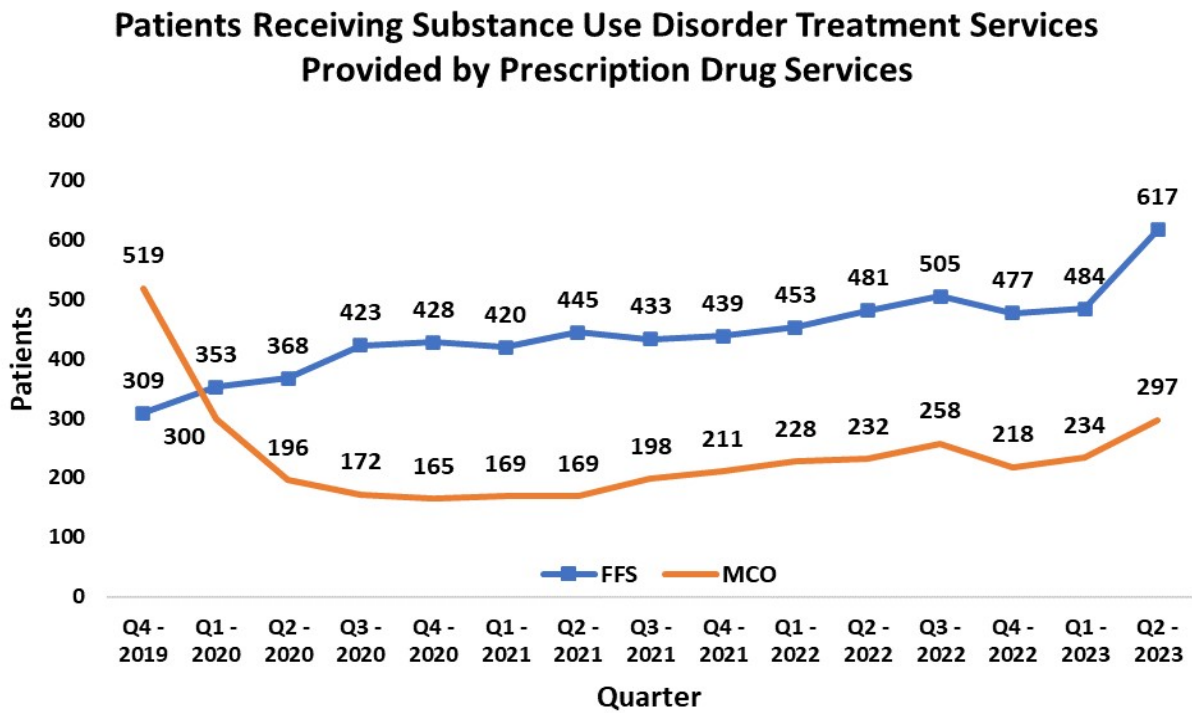
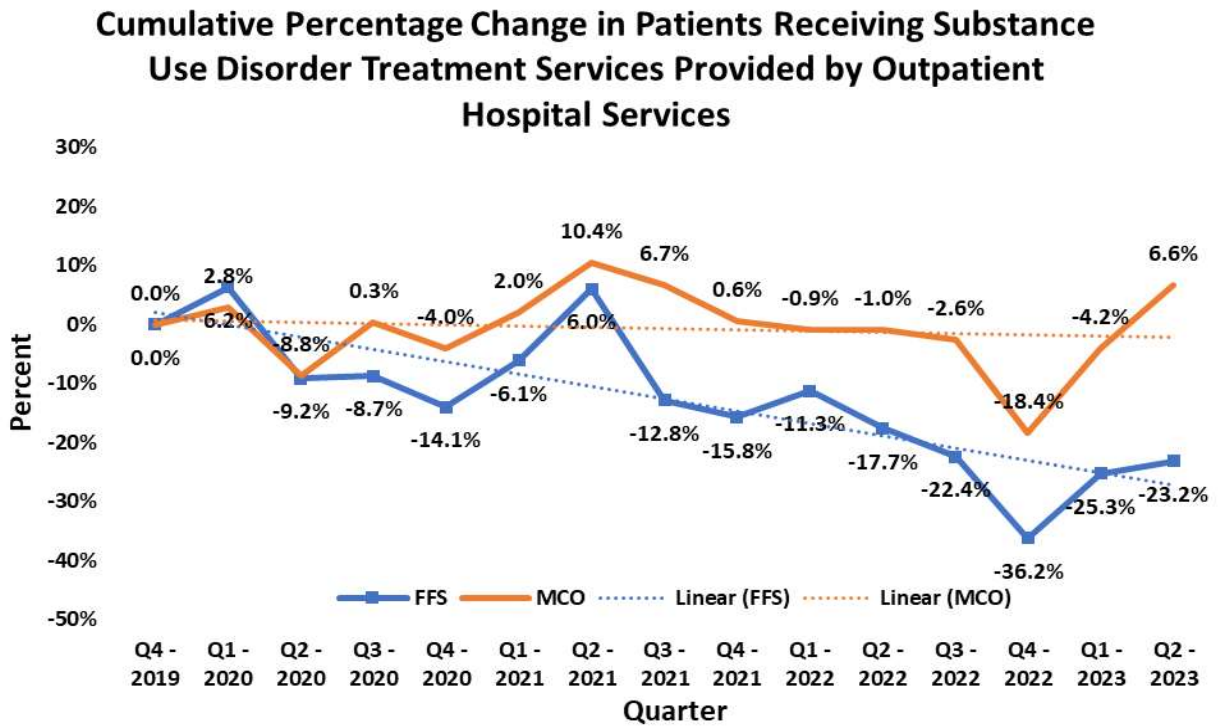

Cumulative Percentage Change in Patients Receiving Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services Provided by Prescription Drug Services



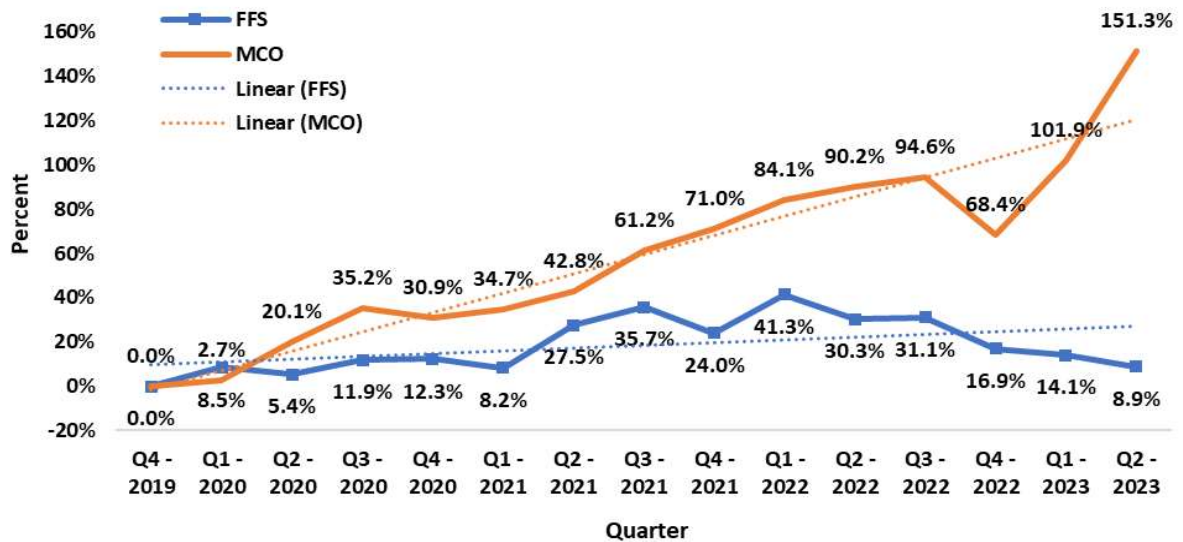

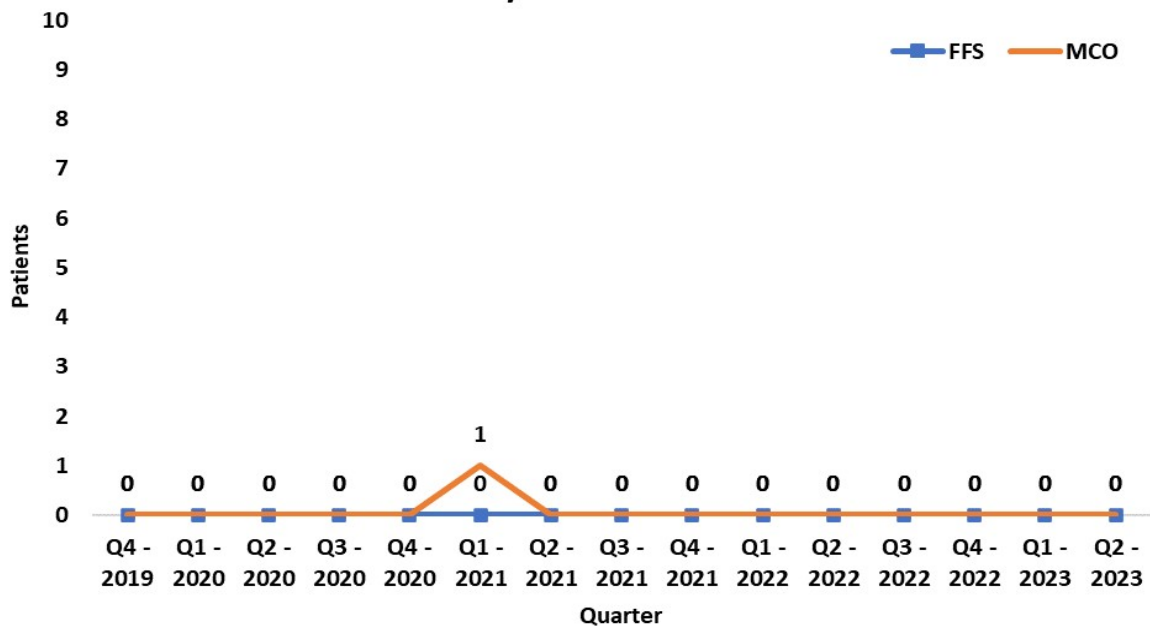

Cumulative Percentage Change in Patients Receiving Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services Provided by Nurse Practitioner Services

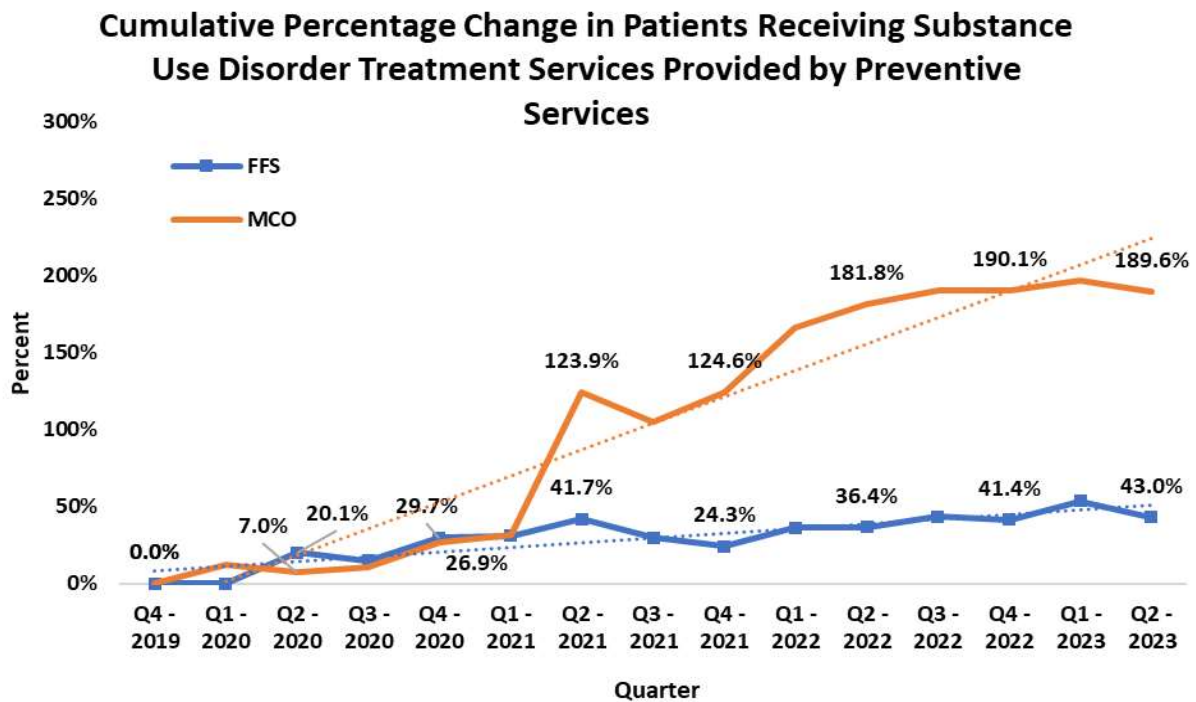
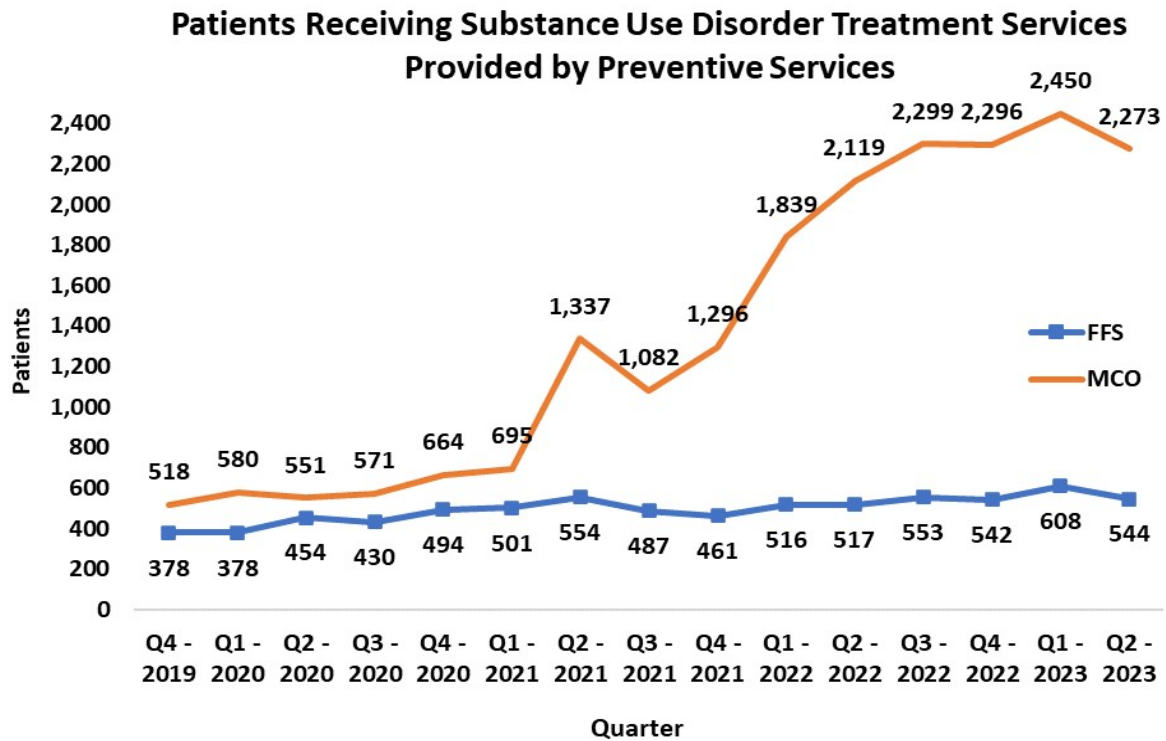


Patients Receiving Substance Use Disorder Treatment Services Provided by Nurse Midwife Services



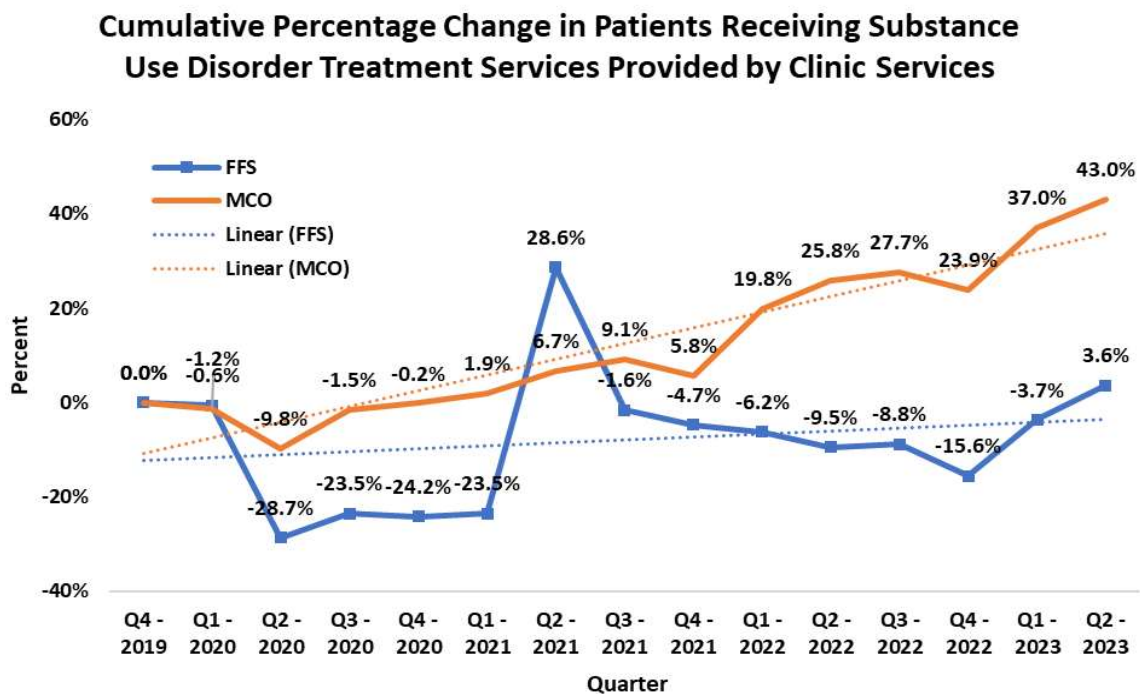
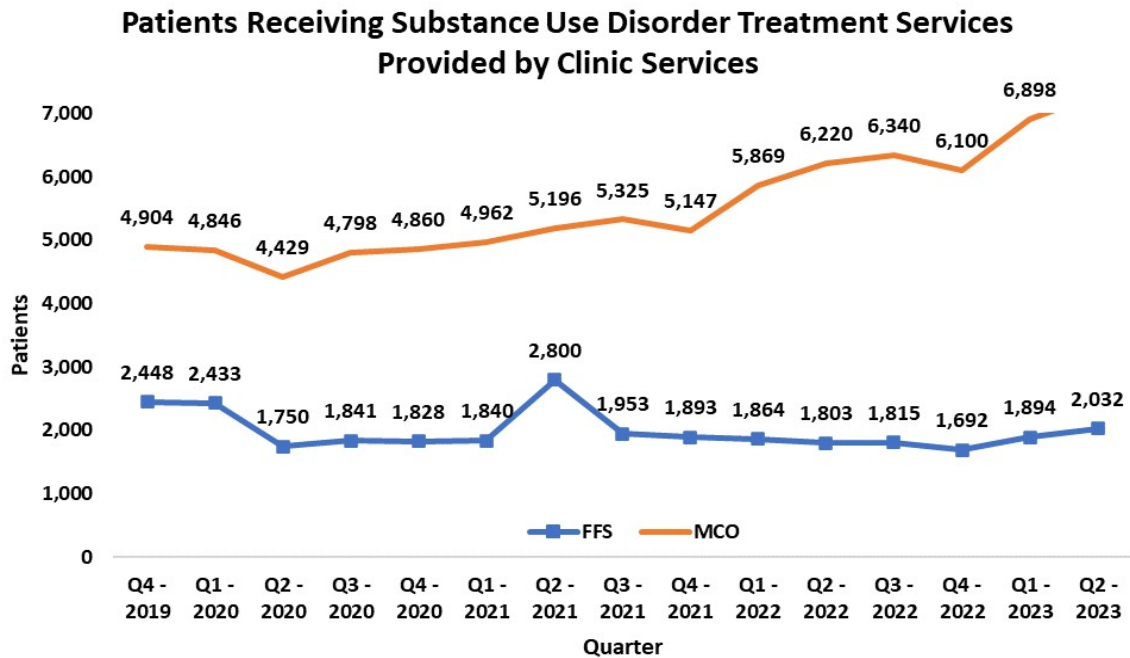

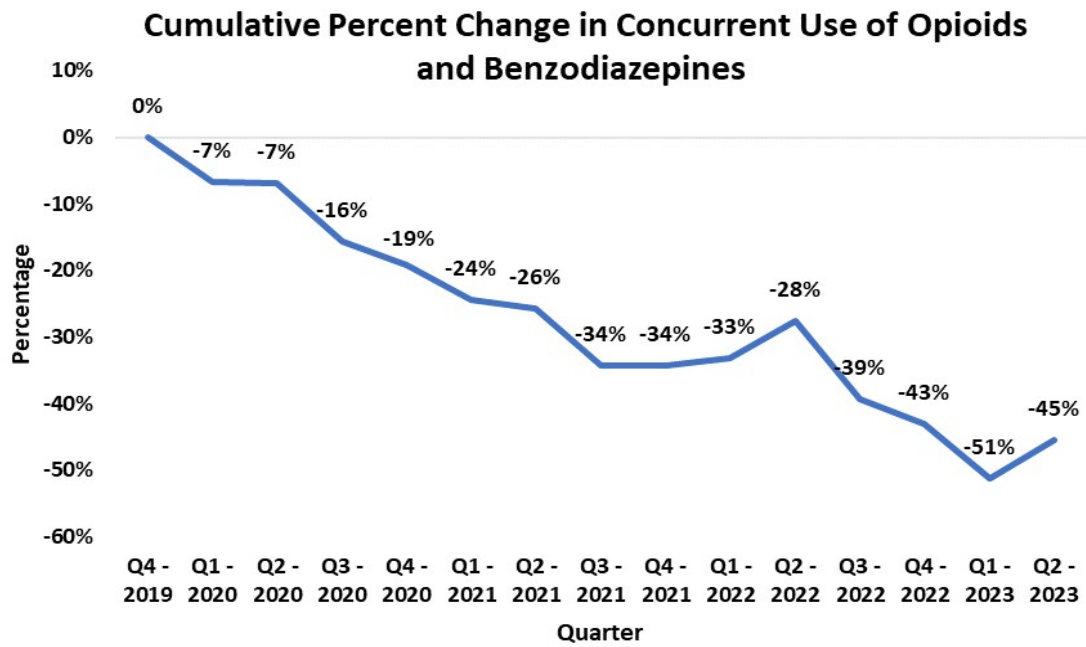

Intensive outpatient programs (IOPs) are treatment programs used to address addictions, depression, eating disorders, or other dependencies that do not require detoxification or round-the-clock supervision. Partial Hospitalization is a structured mental health treatment program that runs for several hours each day, three to five days per week. Clients participate in the scheduled treatment sessions during the day and return home at night. CPT HCPCS Procedure Codes were used in conjunction with a SUD diagnosis to identify intensive outpatient and partial hospitalization services.

The management of the symptoms and complications of substance withdrawal is referred to as “withdrawal management” (WM), also called “detoxification”. Withdrawal management (WM) encompasses all of the professional medical and psychological care a person receives after reducing or ending their substance use. Office visit codes and/or detox revenue codes were used in conjunction with a SUD diagnosis to identify withdrawal services.

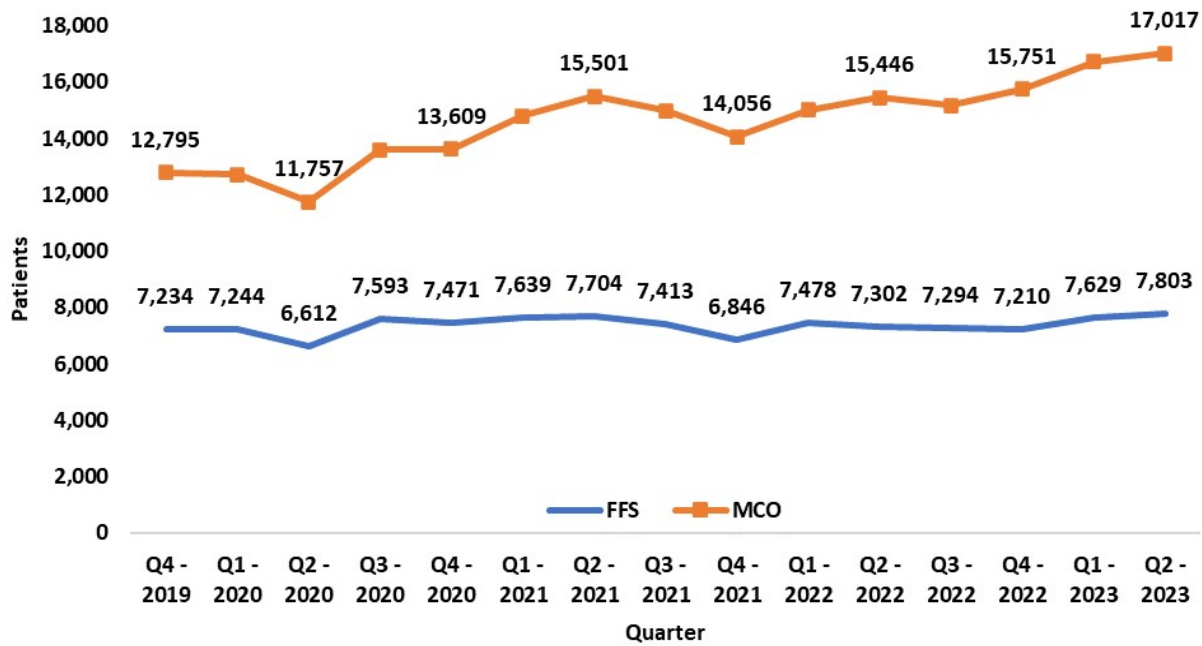

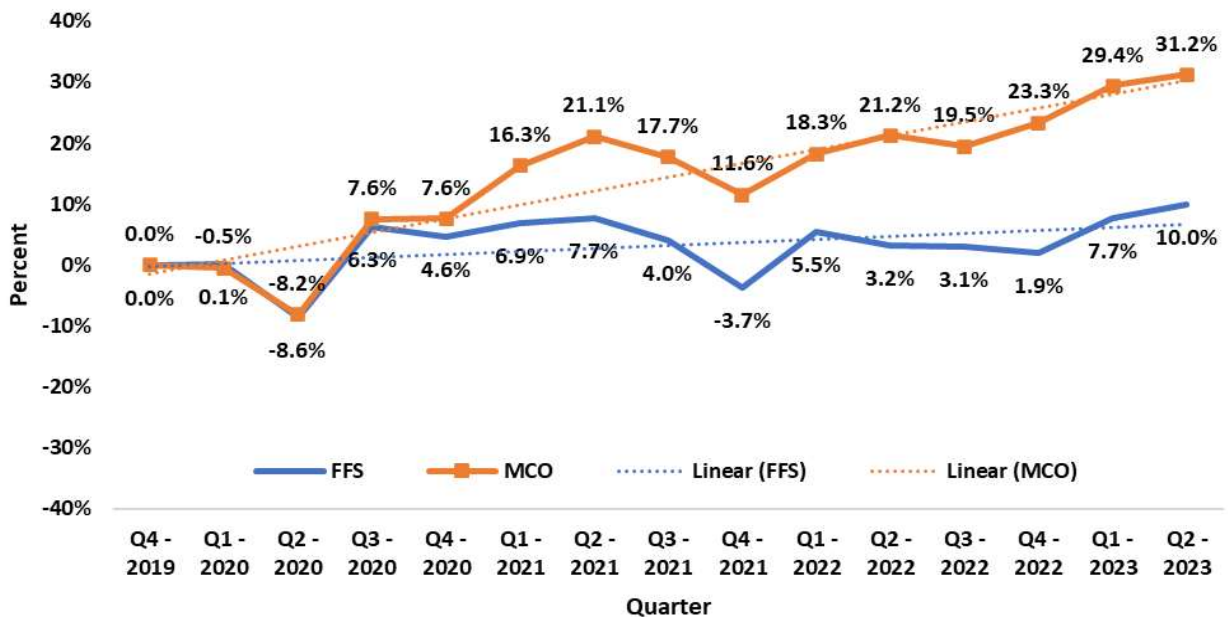

Cumulative Percentage Change in Patients Receiving Withdrawal Management Services



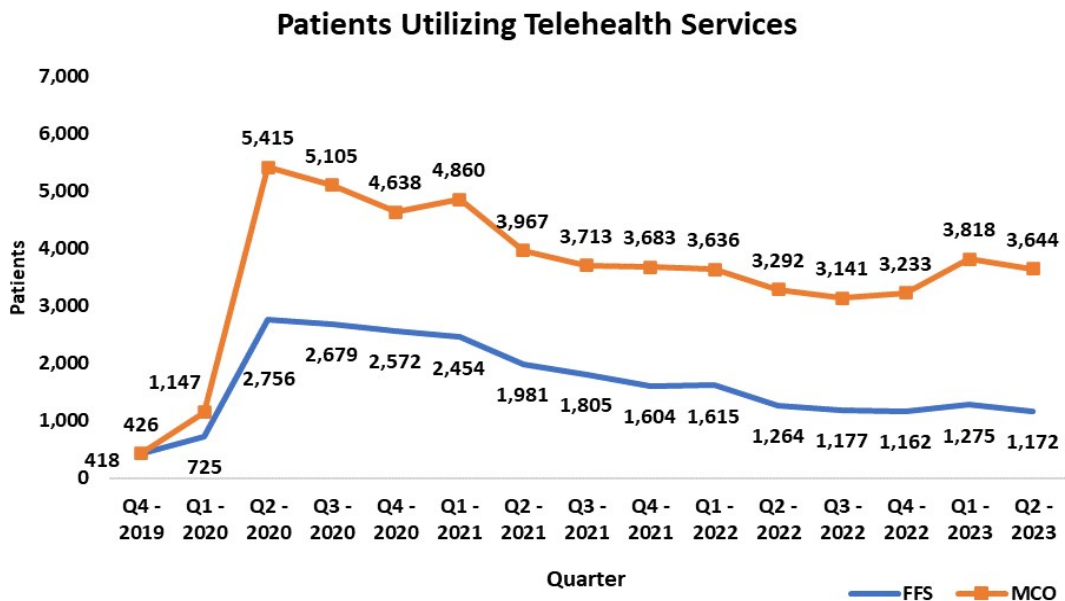

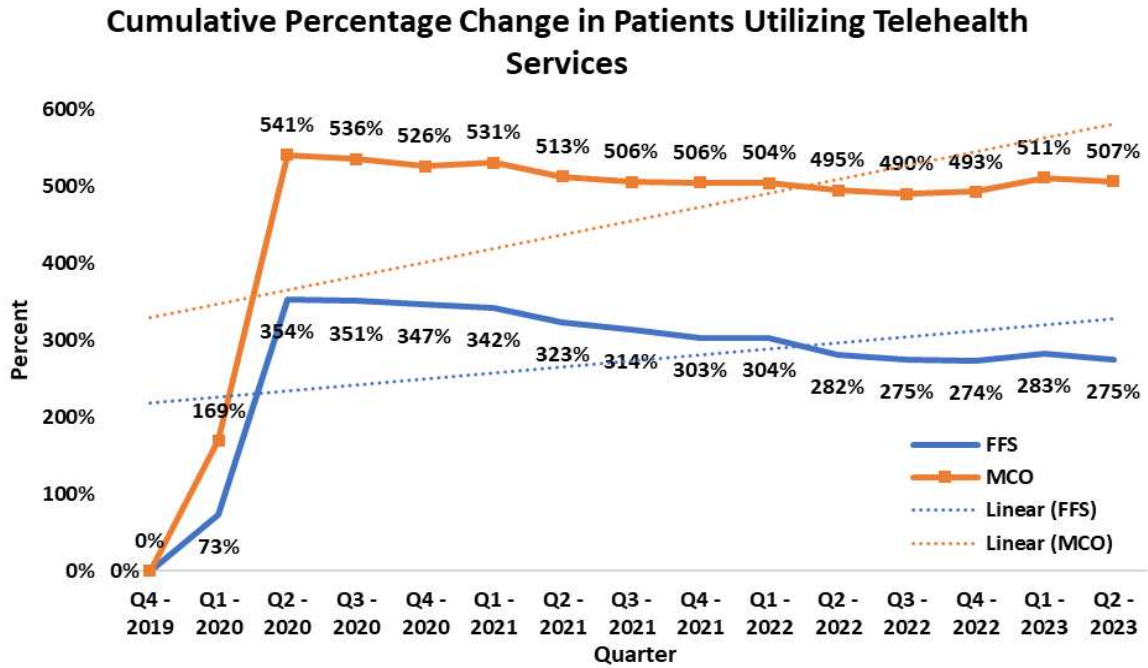

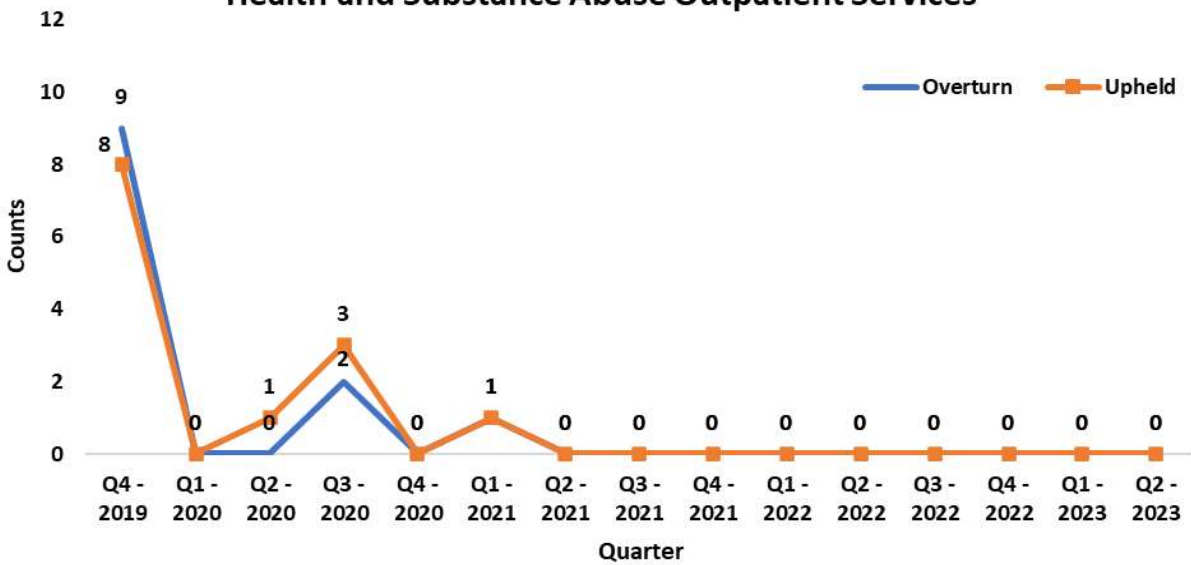

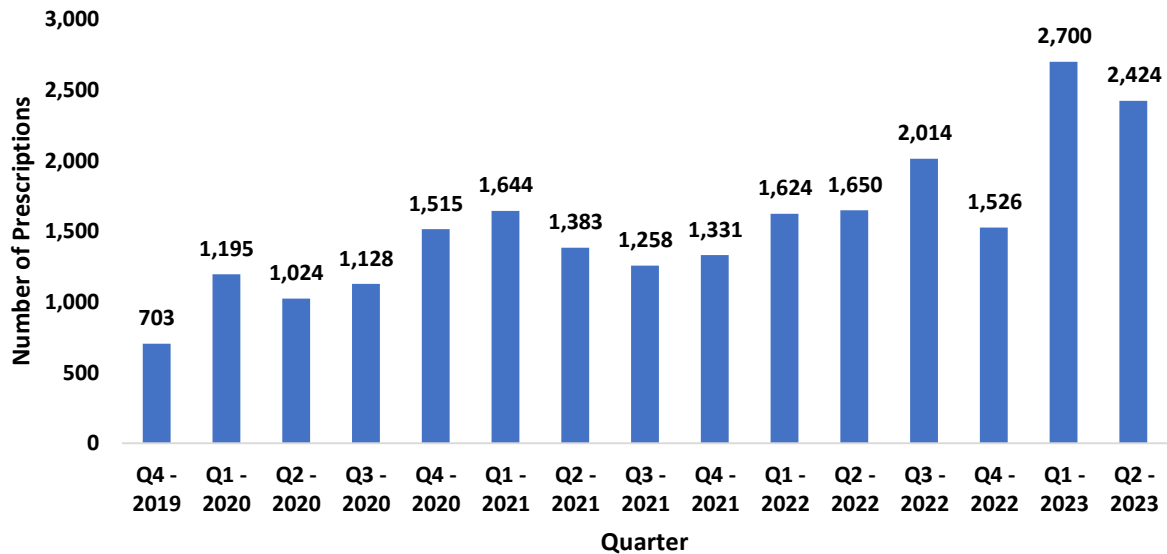

Volume of Naloxone Prescriptions

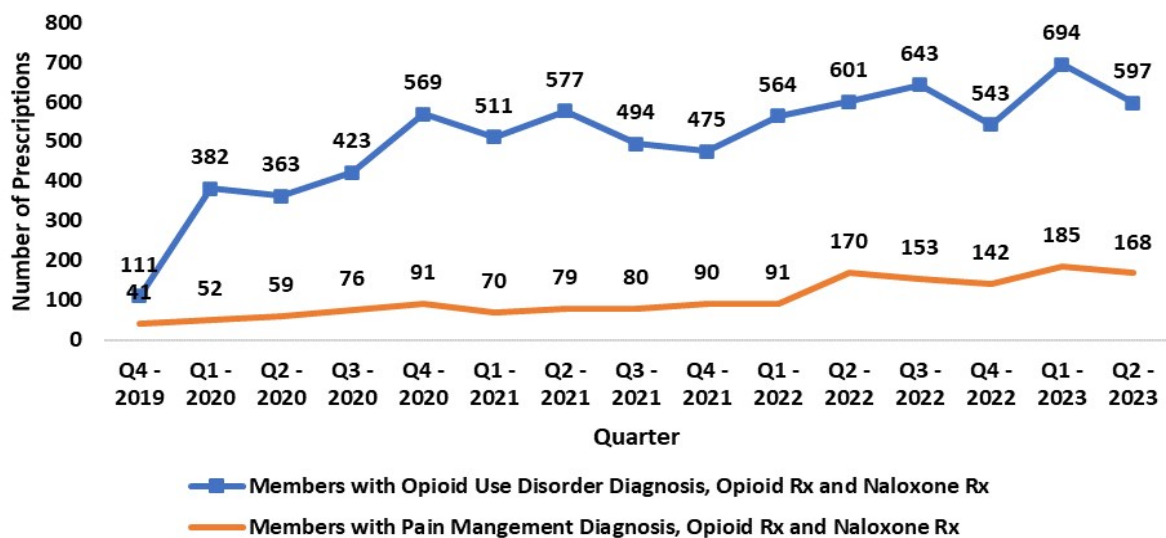

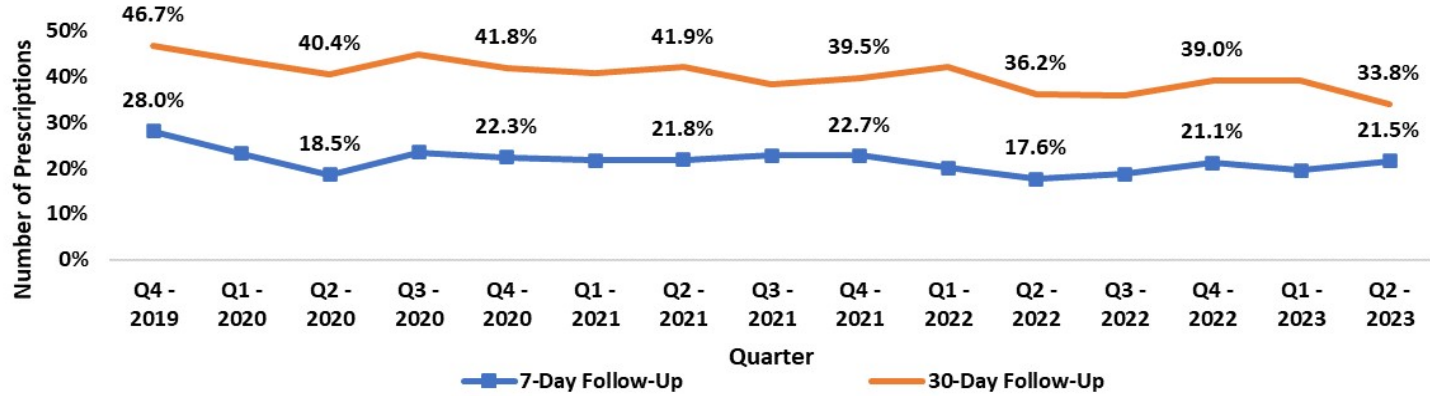

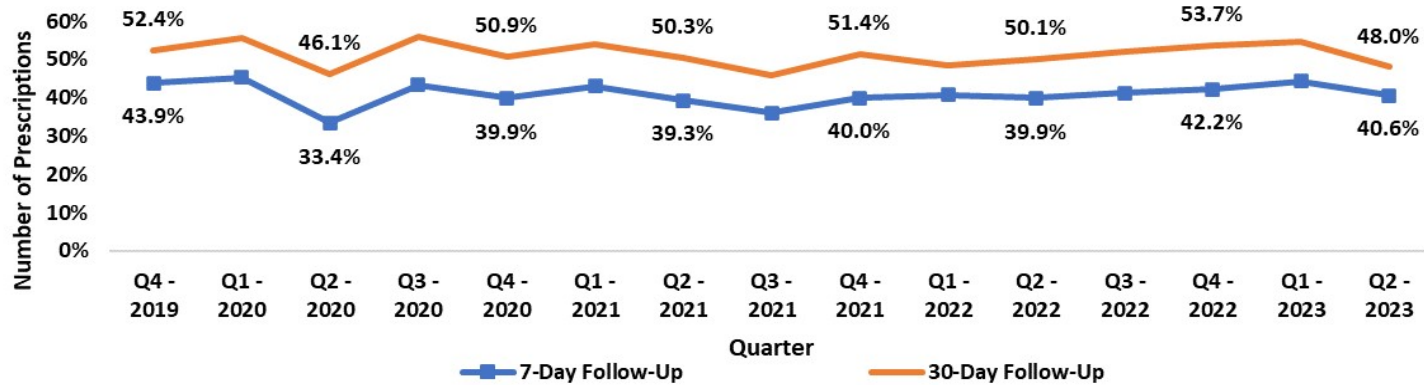

Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Mental Illness (FFS)



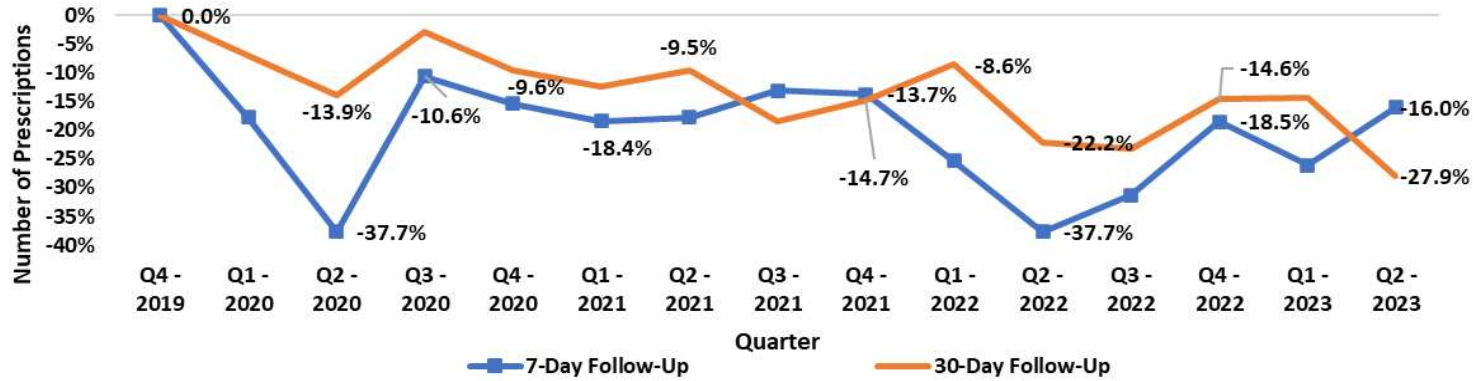
Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Mental Illness (MCO)



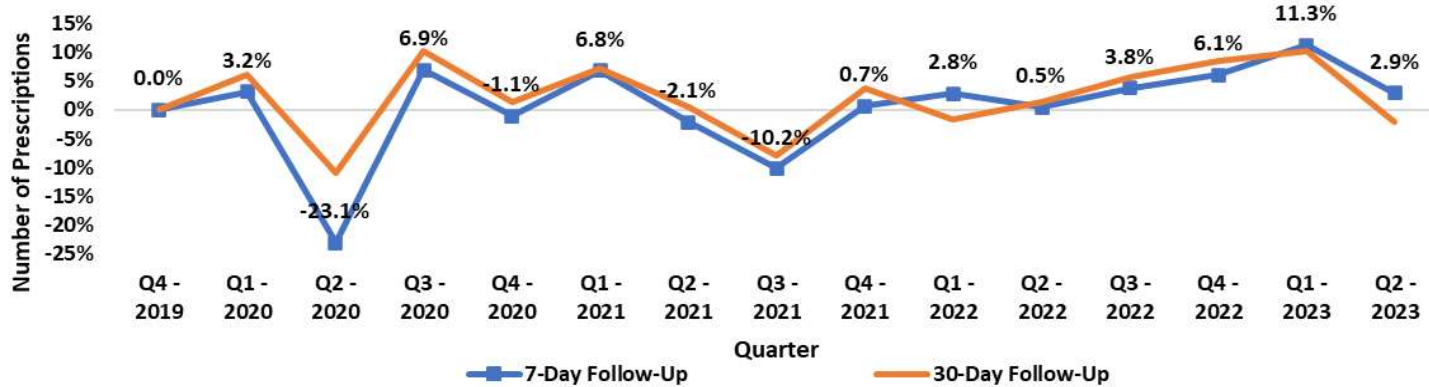

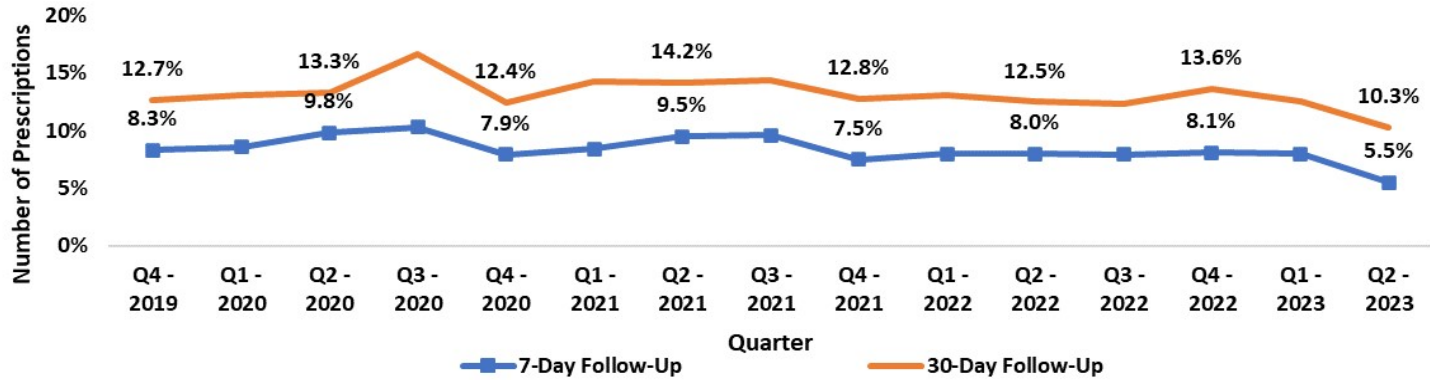

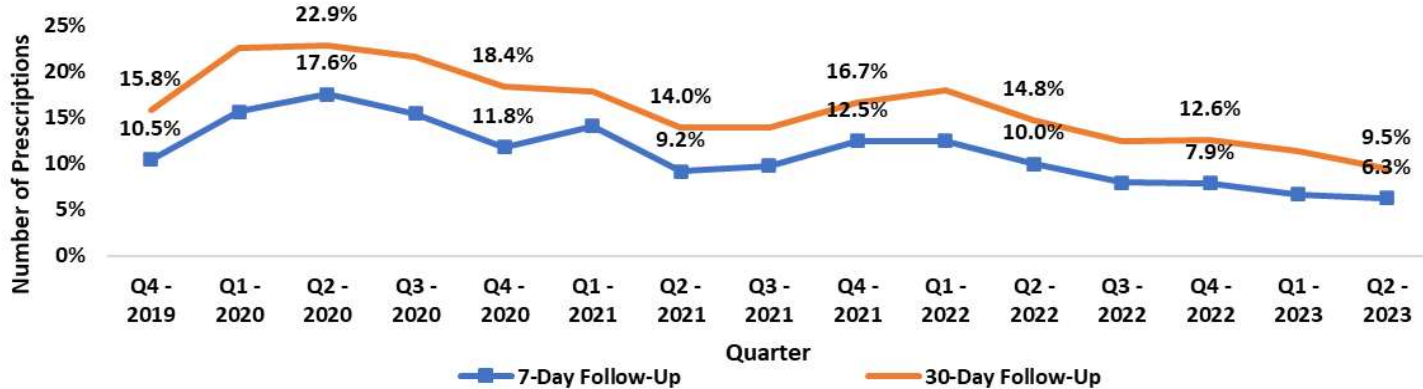

Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Alcohol or Other Drug Abuse or Dependence (FFS)



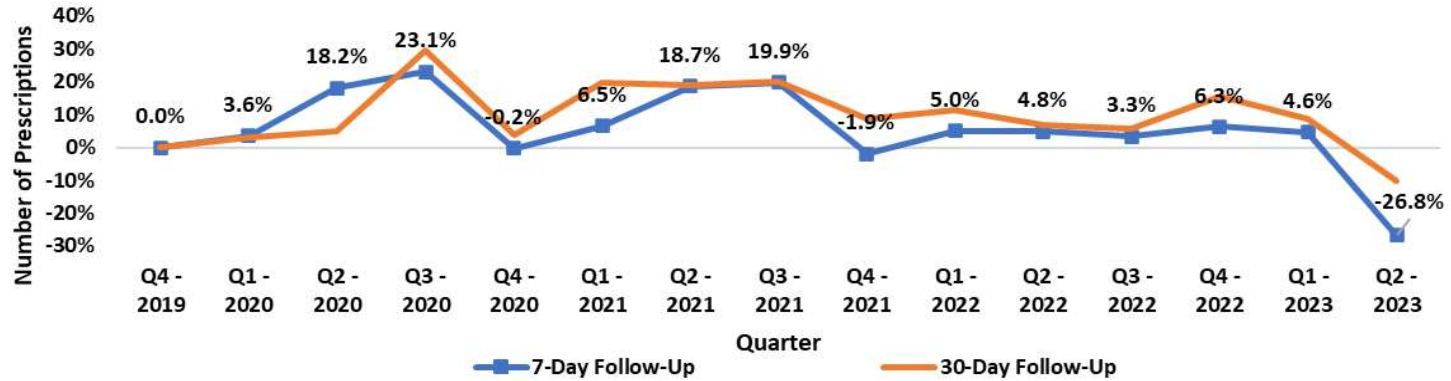
Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Alcohol or Other Drug Abuse or Dependence (MCO)



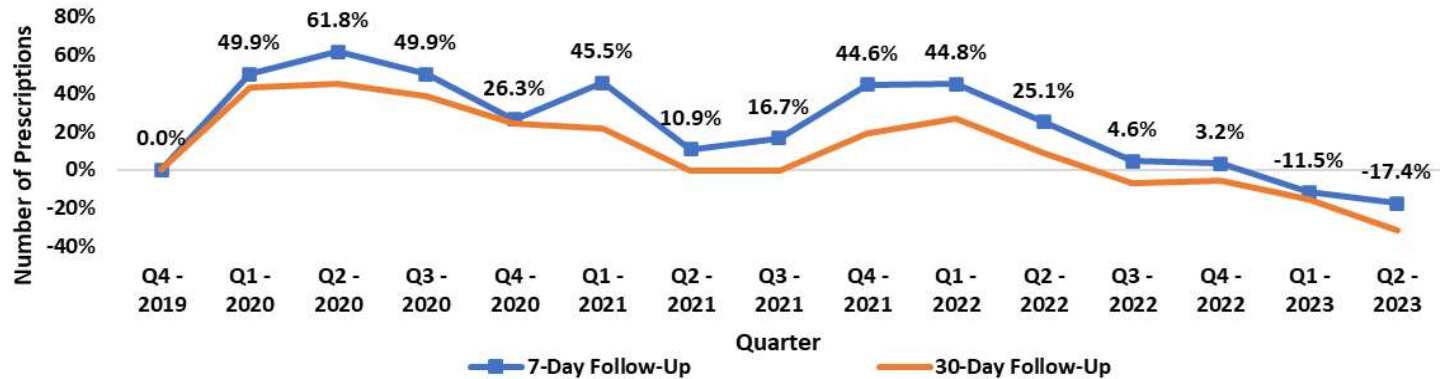

Cumulative Percent Change in Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Alcohol or Other Drug Abuse or Dependence (MCO)

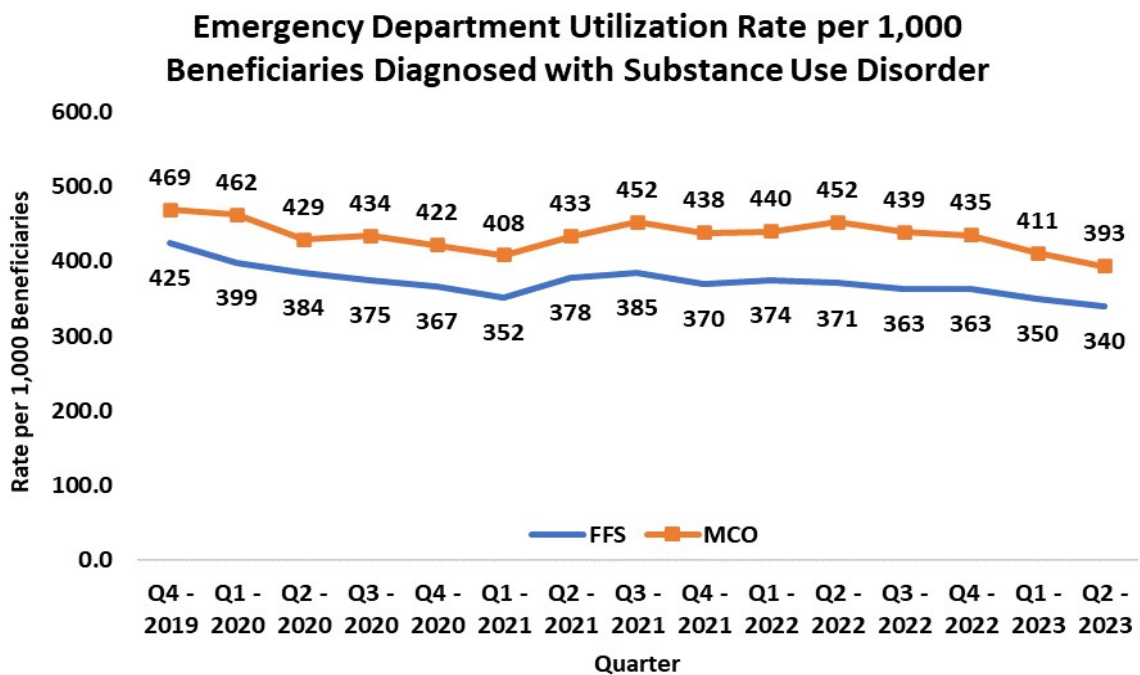

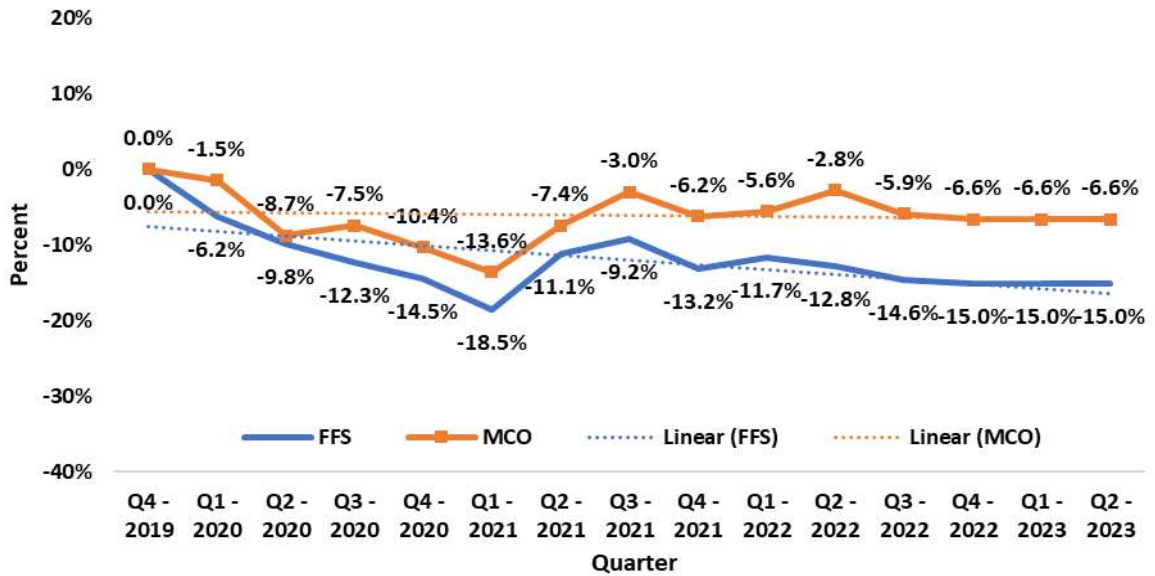

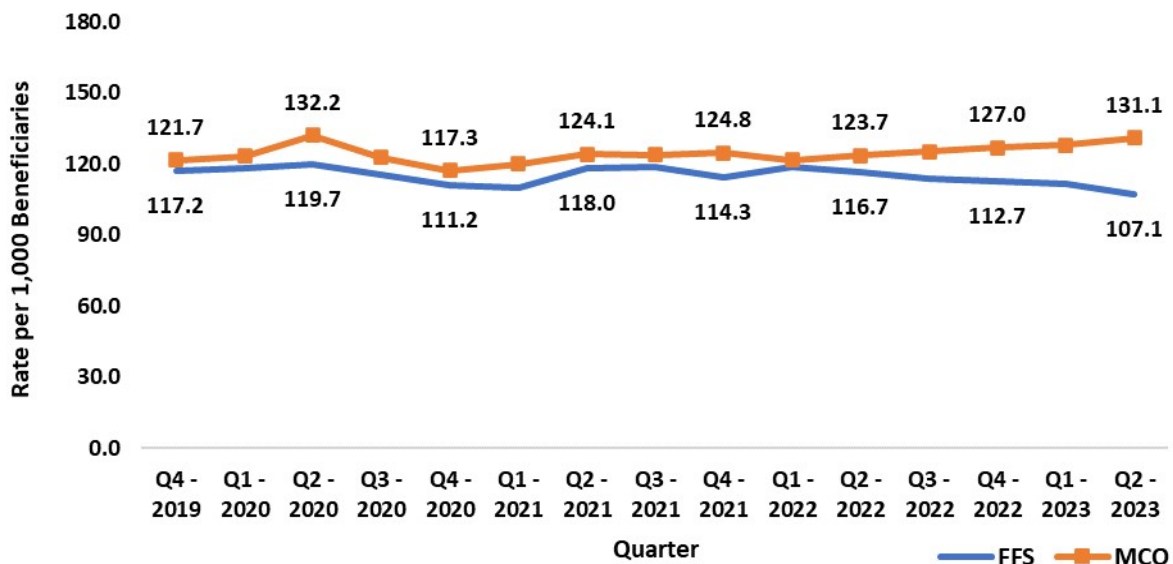

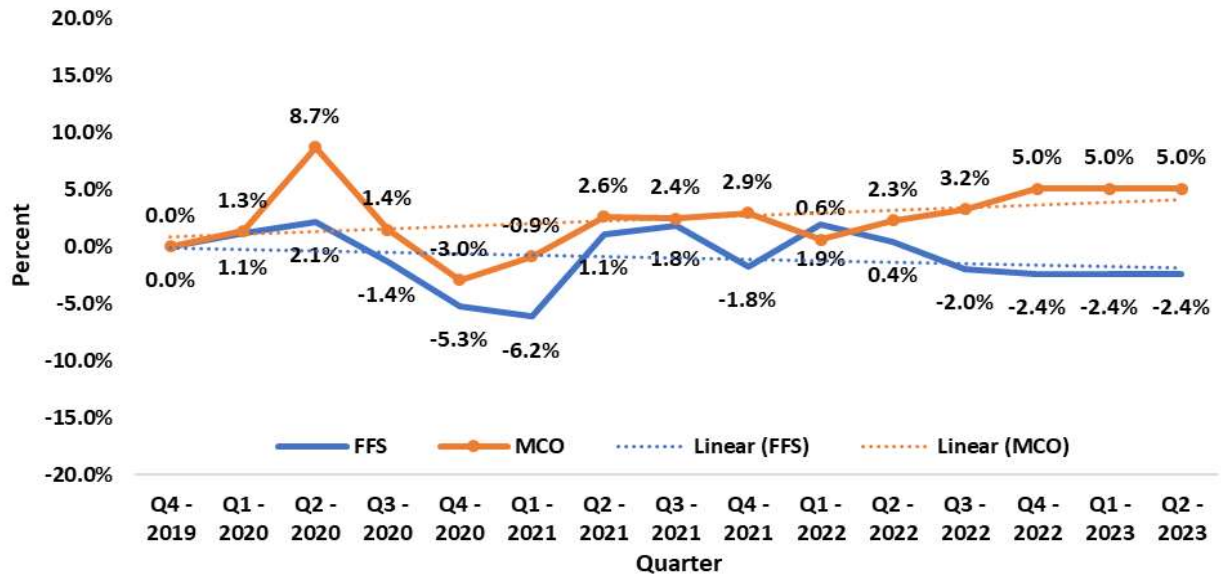
Inpatient Stay Rate per 1,000 Beneficiaries Diagnosed with Substance Use Disorder

Cumulative Percentage Change in Inpatient Stay Rate per 1,000 Beneficiaries Diagnosed with Substance Use Disorder



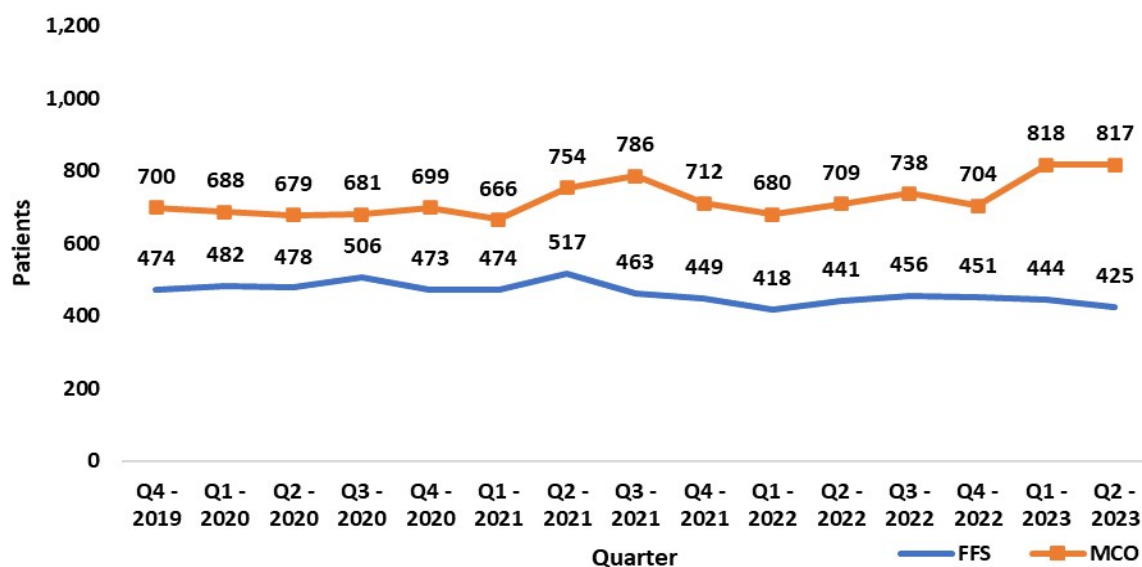

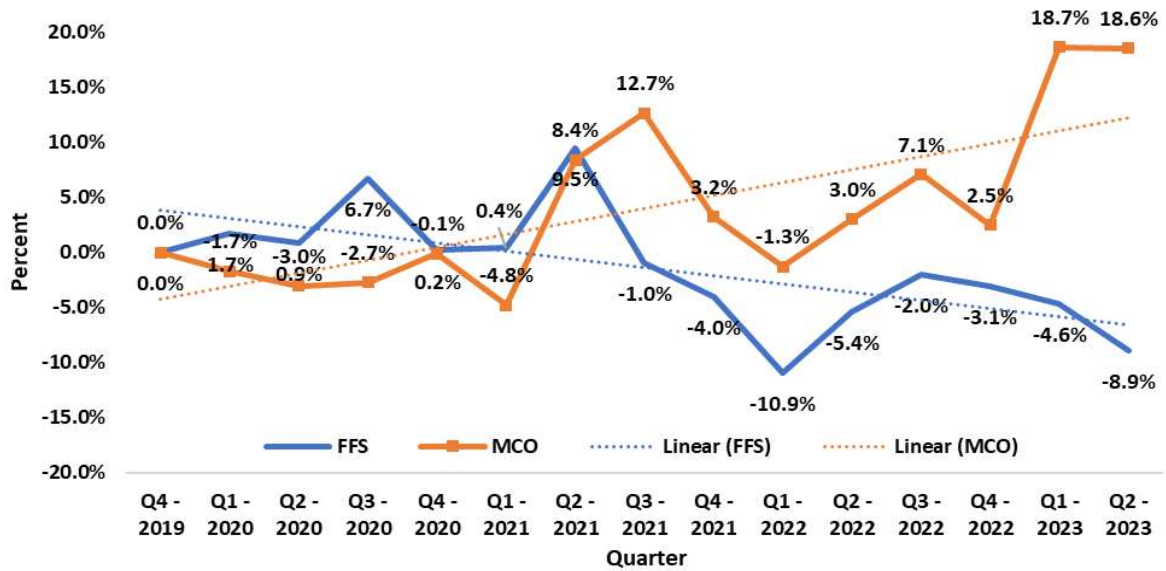
Acute Inpatient SUD Patients Who Were Readmitted for SUD Diagnosis Within 30 Days

Cumulative Percentage Change in Acute Inpatient SUD Patients Who Were Readmitted for SUD Diagnosis Within 30 Days

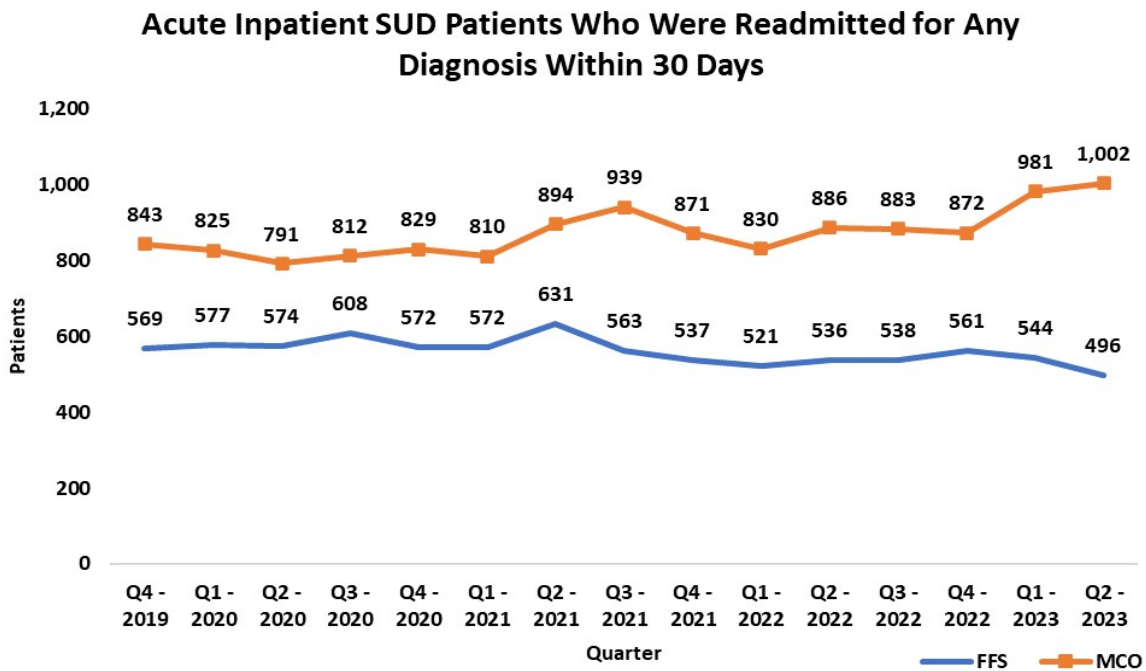

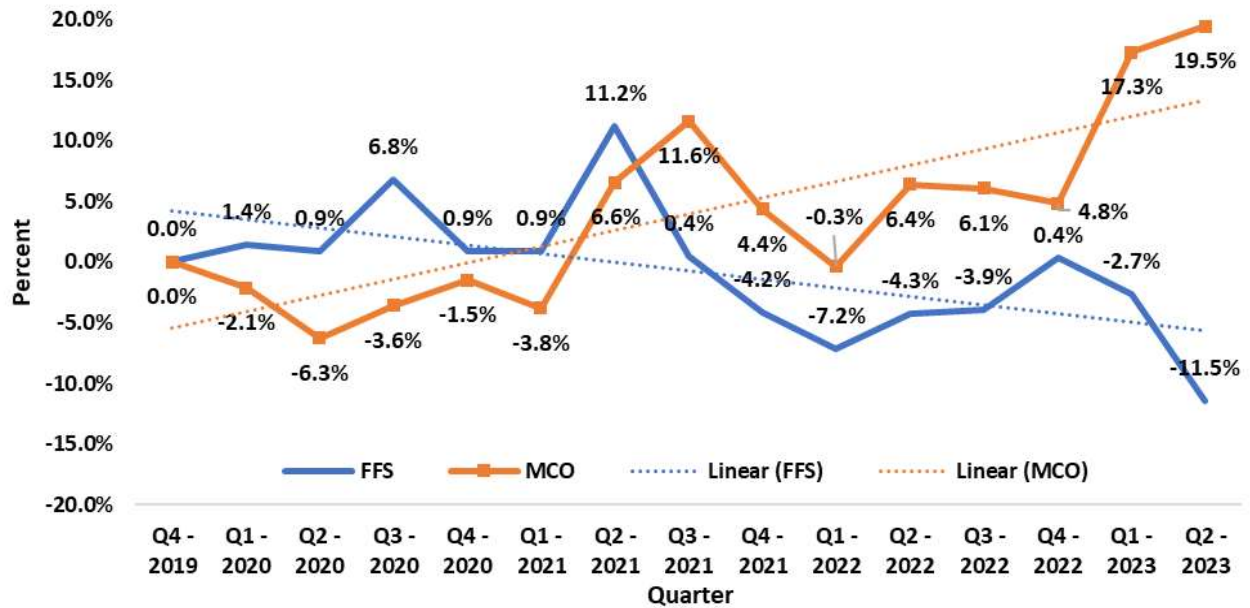

Cumulative Percentage Change in Acute Inpatient SUD Patients Who Were Readmitted for Any Diagnosis Within 30 Days

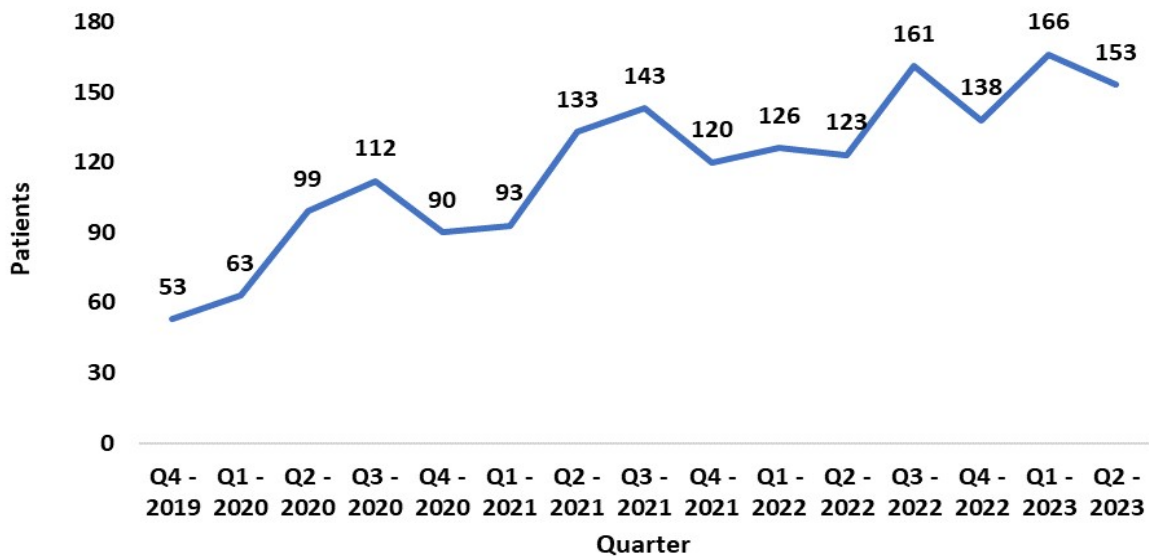

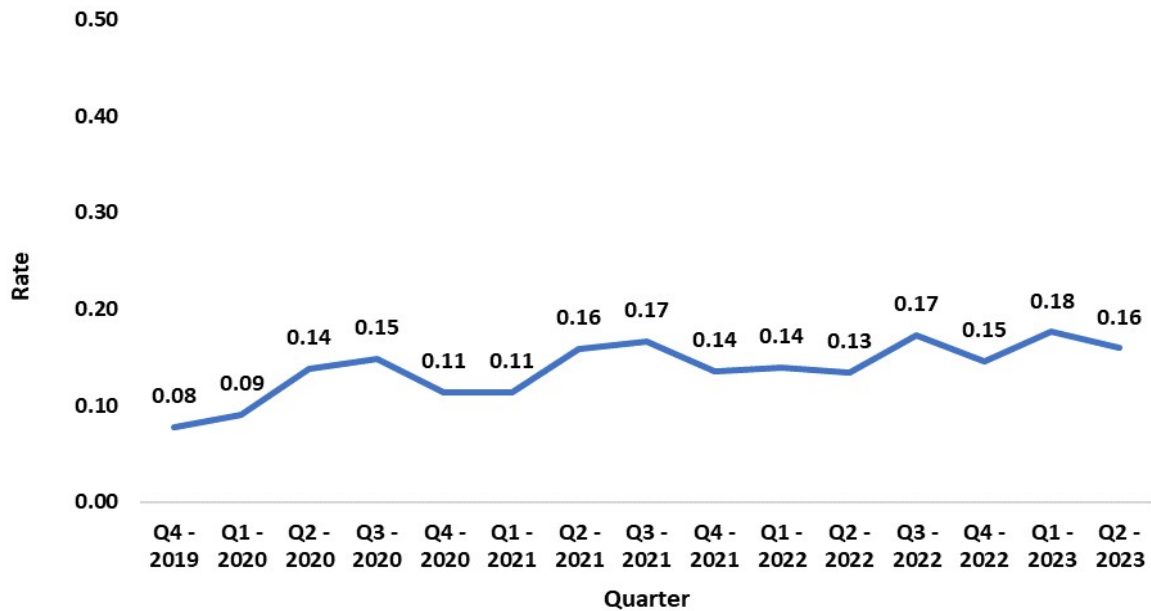

Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Overdose Death Rate

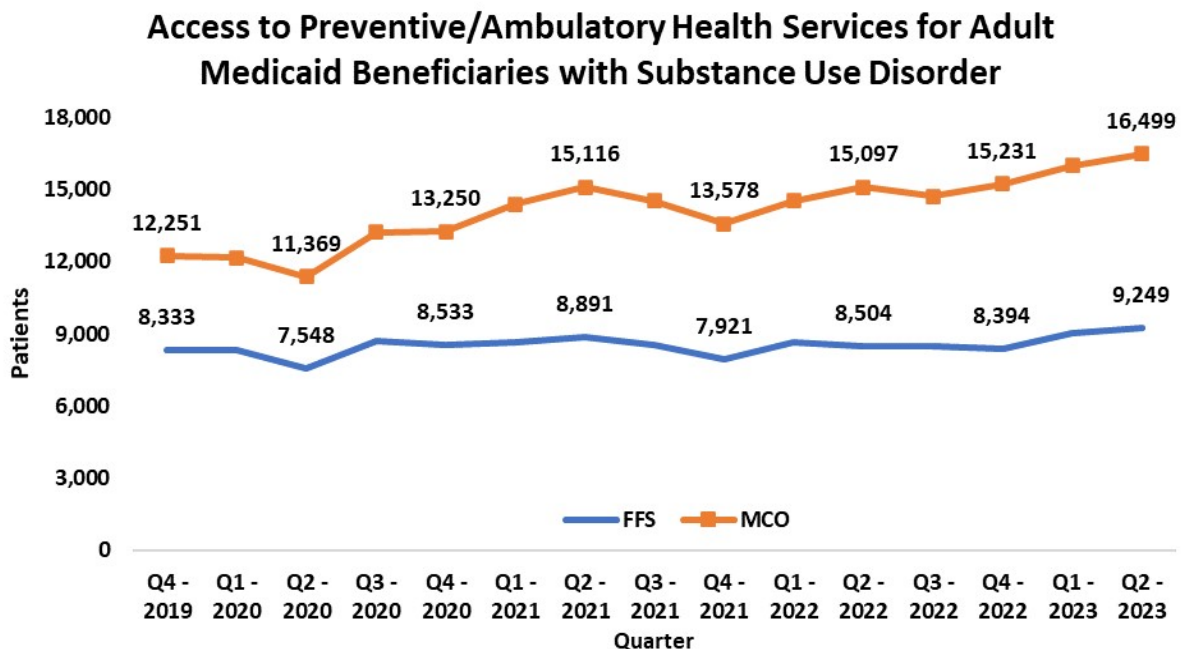

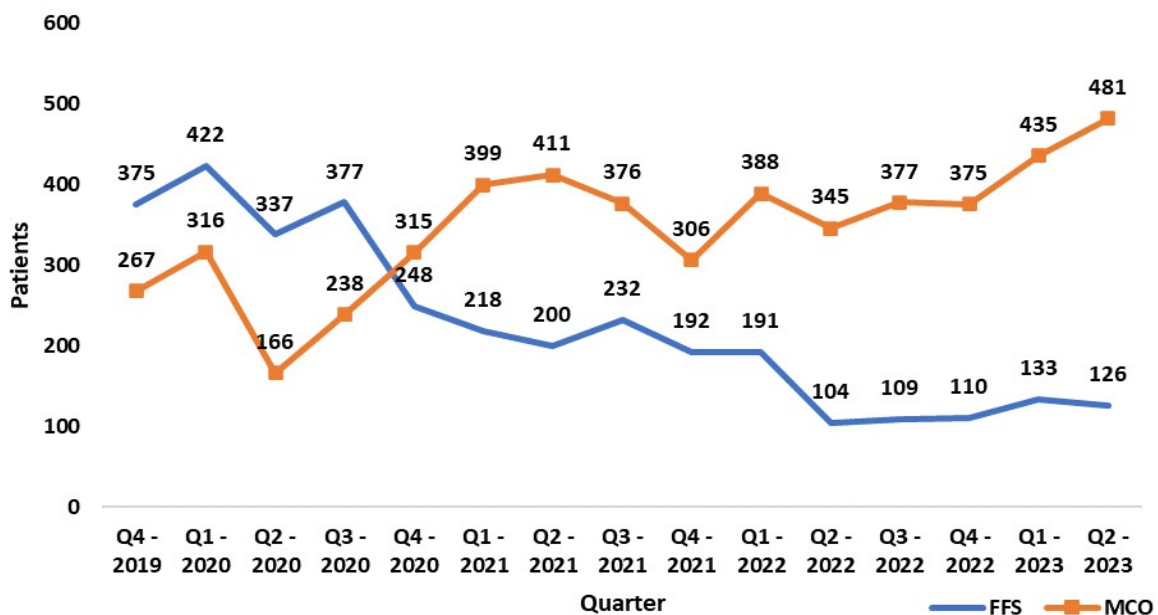

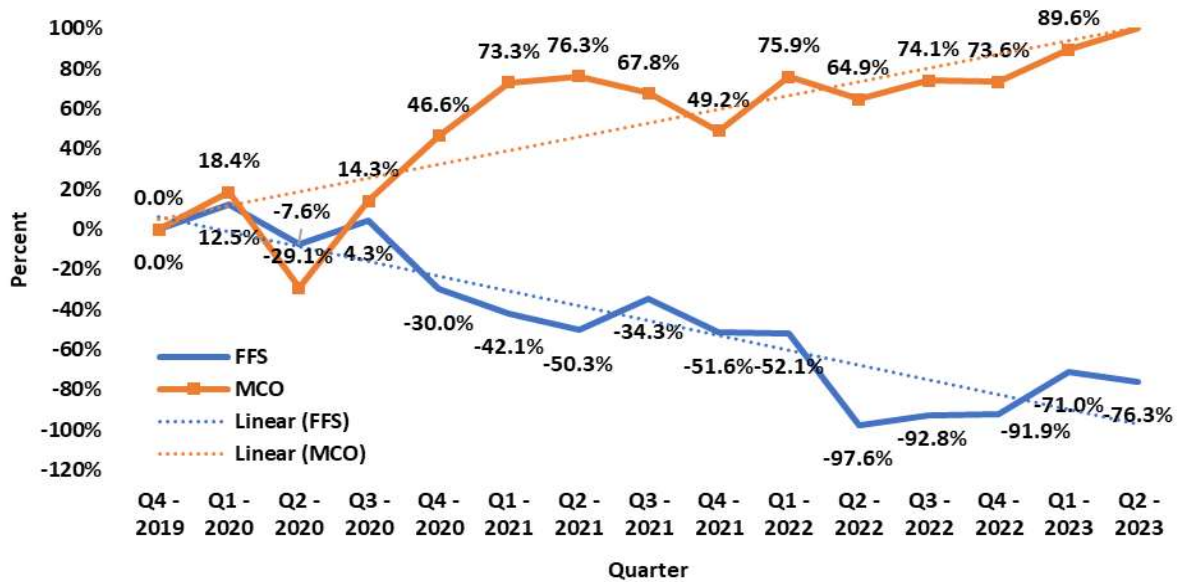
Patients Receiving Crisis Intervention Services

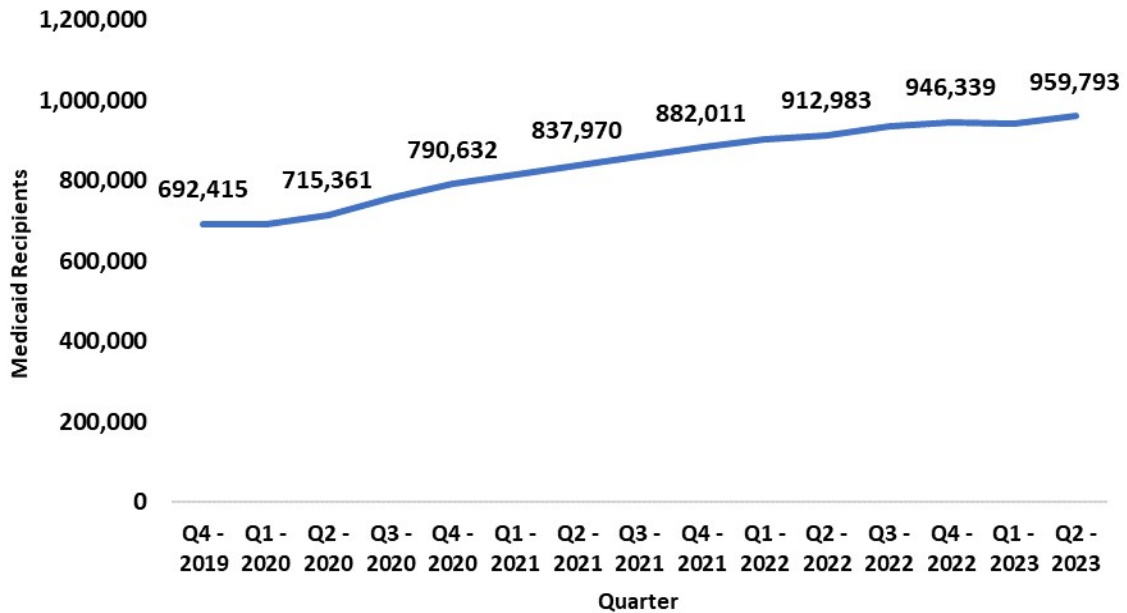

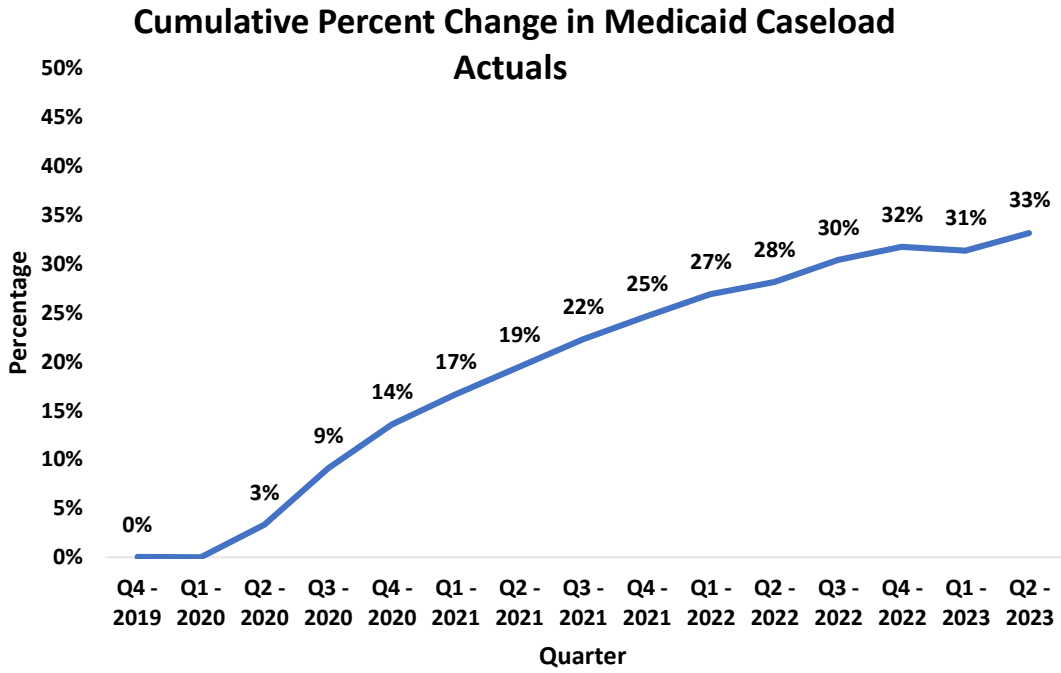

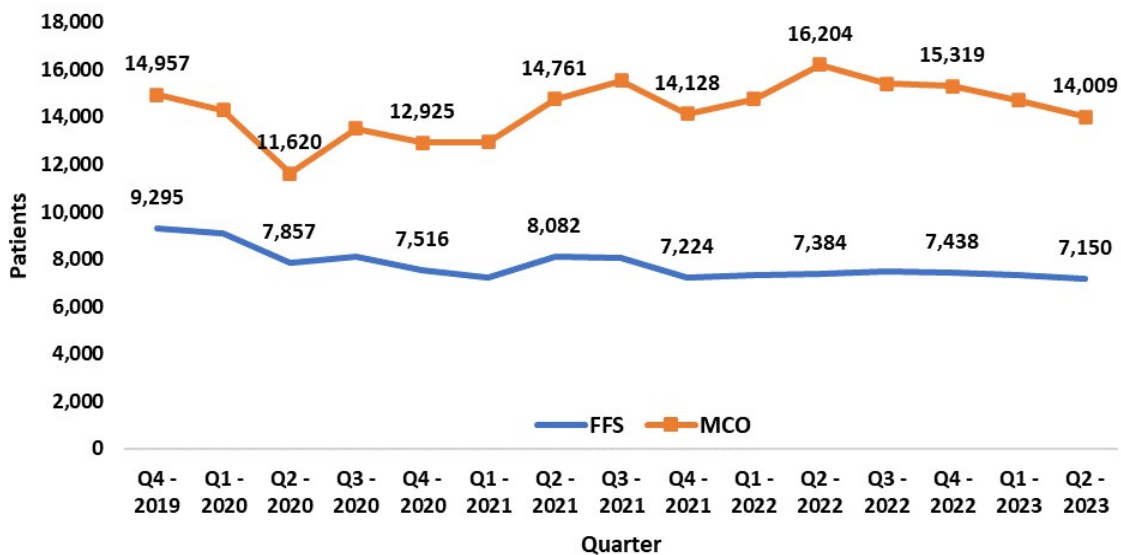

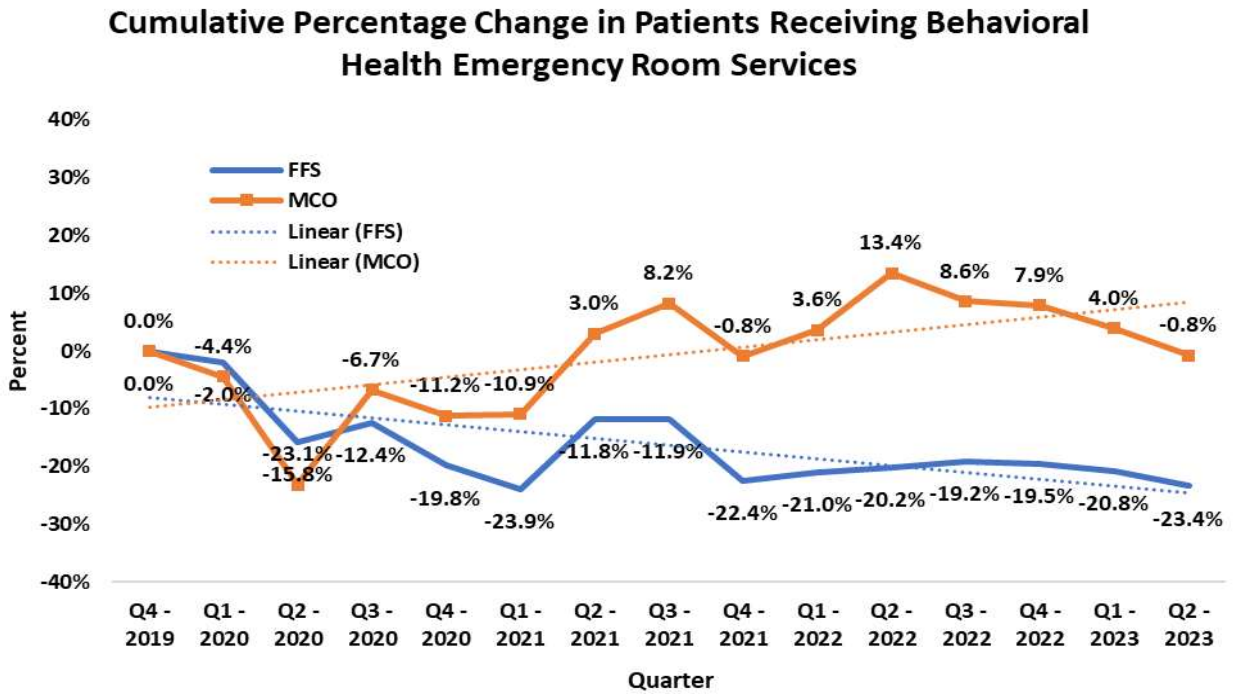

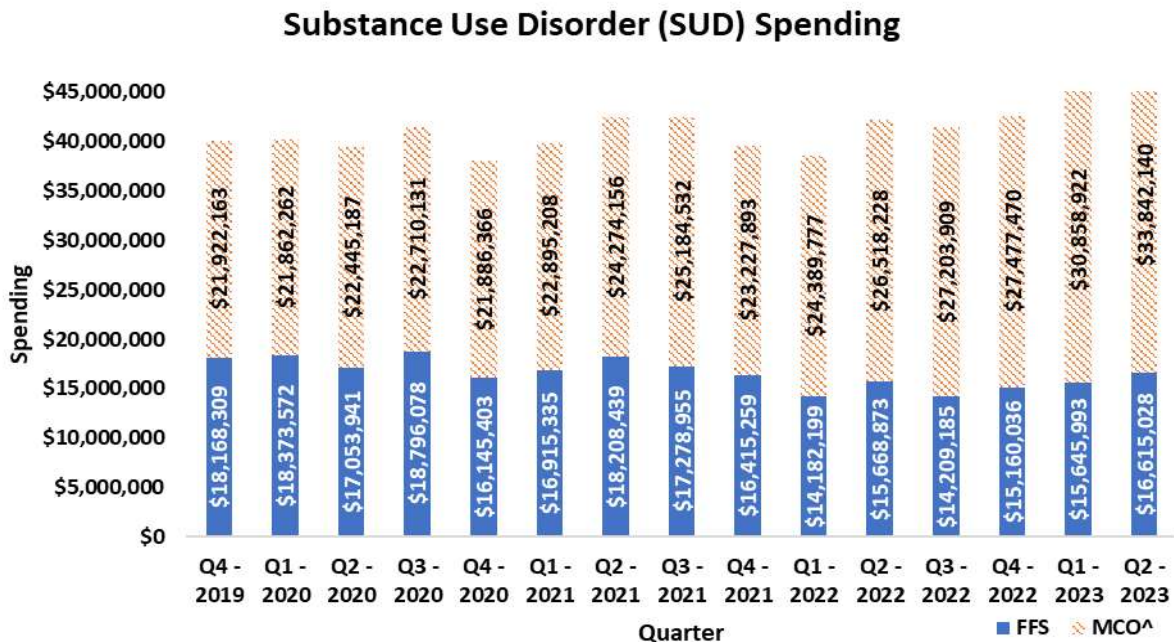

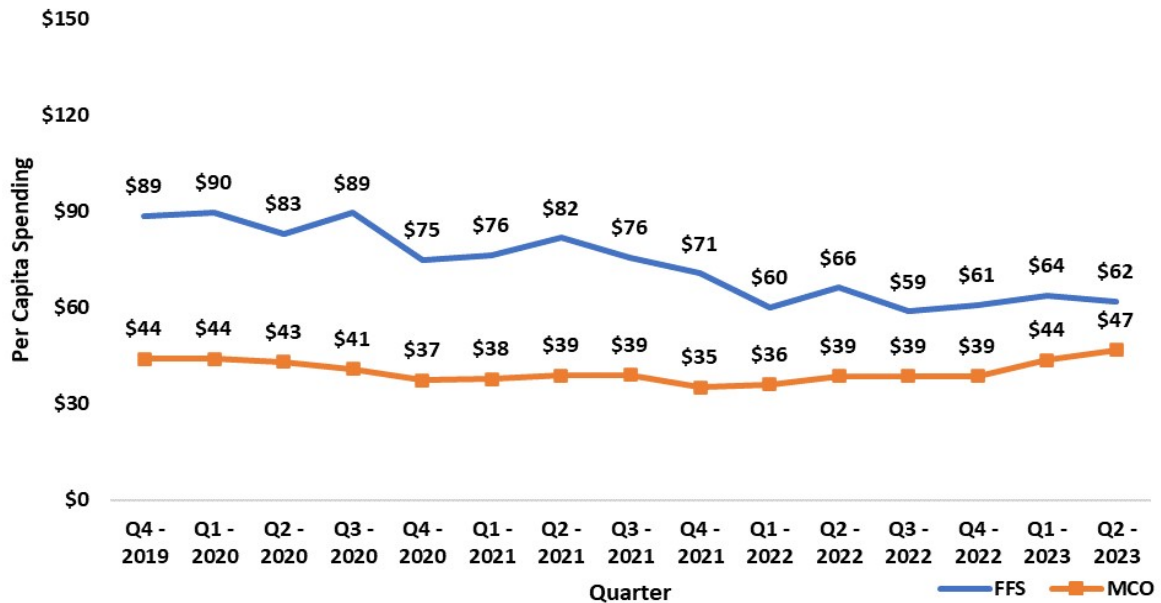

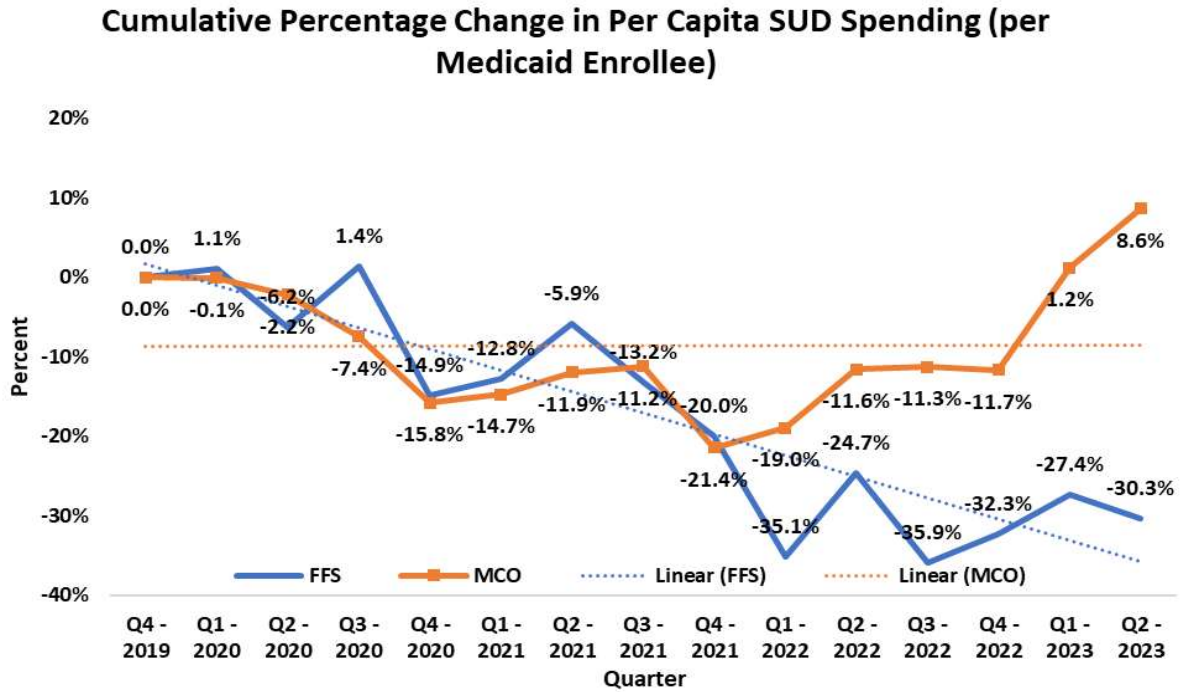

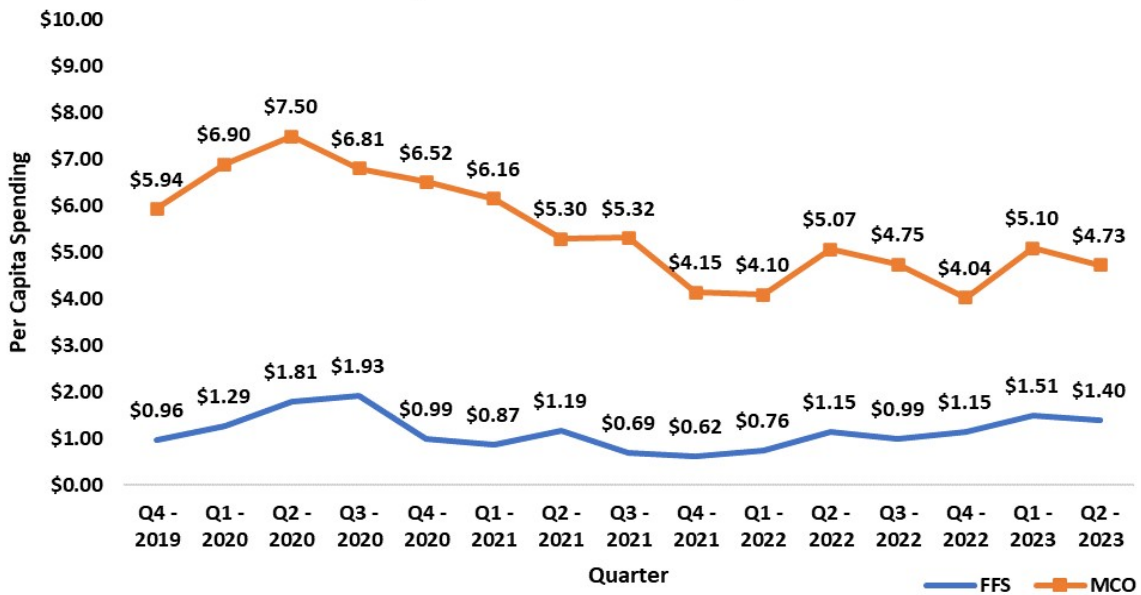

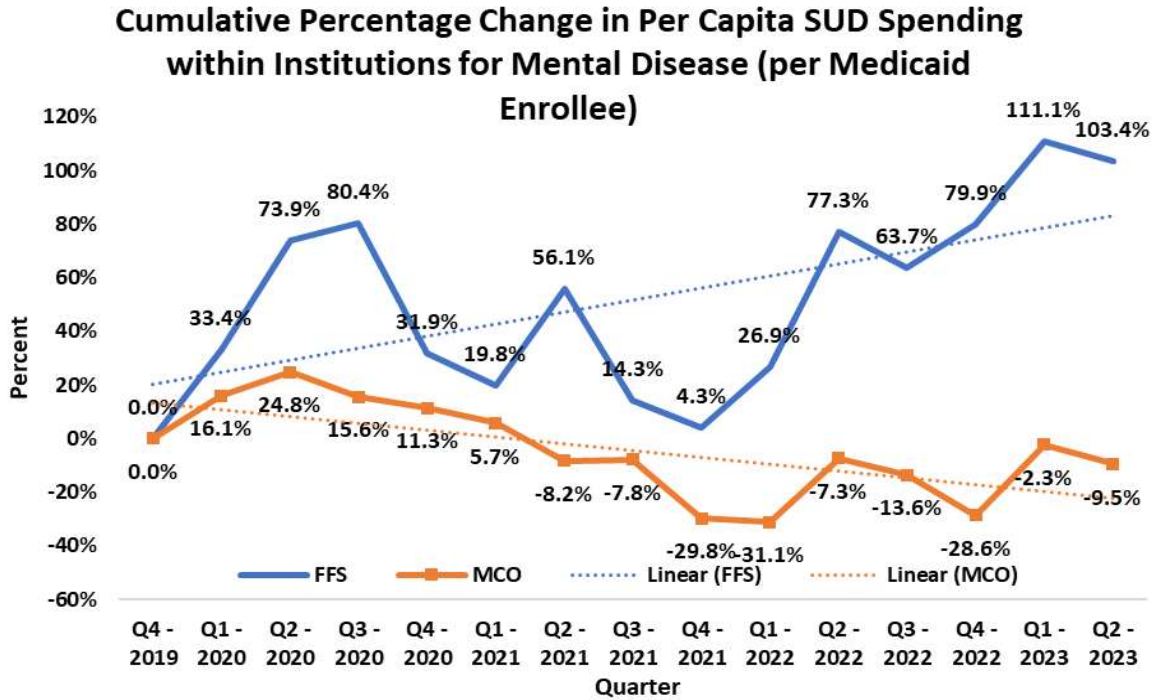
