## TRANSPORTATION

The State of Nevada Division of Health Care Financing and Policy (DHCFP) provides transportation services as an "optional medical service" which includes emergency medical transportation, non-emergency secure behavioral health transport (NESBHT) and non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) of eligible recipients to and from Nevada Medicaid covered services in accordance with 42 CFR440.170, 42 CFR431.53, 45 CFR92.36. Further detail on these services is outlined in Attachment 3.1-A: Amount, Duration, and Scope of Medical and Remedial Care and Services Provided to the Categorically Needy.

DHCFP assures that any provider (including a transportation network company) or individual driver who receives reimbursement for providing non-emergency secure behavioral health transport and non-emergency medical transportation for Medicaid recipients to medically necessary services meet the specified minimum requirements. This provision excludes those providers that are public transit authorities.

These minimum requirements for NESBHT and NEMT providers include the following:

- 1. Each provider and individual driver are not excluded from participation in any federal health care program and is not listed on the exclusion list of the Inspector General of the Department of Health and Human Services.
- 2. Each such individual driver has a valid driver's license.
- 3. Each such provider has in place a process to address any violation of a state drug law.
- **1.**4.Each such provider has in place a process to disclose to Nevada Medicaid the driving history, including any traffic violations, of each such individual driver employed by such provider.
